Three days after Prime Minister Ariel Sharon of Israel declared him “irrelevant,” Yasir Arafat hastened to try to recapture leadership of a coalition dominated by terrorists. After a spate of phony “crackdowns” on killers he then quickly released to murder again, Arafat insisted that next time would be different.

ing triggered open warfare, are losing that war. The Israeli military is now making the arrests and executing the killers, acts that an authoritative Palestinian Authority should have been doing.

"We are fed up with false promises and lies," Prime Minister Sharon said. "What is important is not declarations but deeds. Your General Zinni — a serious professional we hope to see again — provided to Arafat a list of terrorists we knew were plotting attacks. No steps were taken. Soon after, two of the names on that list bombed a bus killing 10 of our people. Therefore, because our government cannot trust Arafat, we will have no more contact with him. That is how he made himself irrelevant."

...When he double-crossed the would-be peacemakers Bill Clinton and Ehud Barak — and then joined with overtly terrorist groups to break Israel's spirit — Arafat lost his ability to deliver either the Israeli left or the American superpower. Result: personal irrelevance born of profound mistrust.

Internecine strife is inevitable someday between the amalgam of terror groups (Hamas, Iran's Hezbollah, Arafat's presidential guard, his Tanzim, etc.) and the future Palestinian Authority headed by Arafat or his successor.

What about a time after Arafat — will the next Palestinian leader defeat the terrorists? "We do not interfere in others' decisions," says Sharon carefully. "Some Palestinian leaders understand that Arafat has brought them to disaster, and they know we do not respect him as a partner. Maybe one day somebody will rise up, and there is already heavy criticism of him from Palestinians. But before they can take responsible steps, it has to be widely understood that Arafat — by being responsible for creating this coalition of terror — has made himself irrelevant."



It is time for a novel approach to the war between Israel and Arafat's Palestinian Authority.

The idea of the Mitchell plan is that neither side is to blame — neither Israel, which wants to exist, nor the Palestinians who do not want it to; neither the Palestinians, who want to plant nail bombs on buses, nor Israel, which would prefer the Palestinians not do that. Rather, a mutual lack of "confidence" is to blame. There is this much truth in that idea: the Palestinian Authority lacks confidence in Israel's willingness to commit suicide, and Israel lacks confidence that the PA will stop insisting on suicide as part of a "peace" agreement.

You must remember this. On Aug. 31, Arafat, world's senior terrorist, did a star turn — at one point strolling with America's senior friend of terrorists, Jesse Jackson — in Durban, South Africa, at a U.N. orgy of hate directed against Israel and the United States and bearing an Orwellian title: World Conference Against Racism, Racial Discrimination, Xenophobia and Related Intolerance. It was the kind of sewer of ideas that prepares the climate for the sort of things that happened in America 11 days after the conference opened, and what happened [recently] in Israel.

Now Israel should be as bold in its self-defense as America is being in its. In 1982, Israel drove Arafat and his thugs from Lebanon to Tunisia. He and his thugocracy have earned another expulsion from the eastern end of the Mediterranean. If he cannot control his territory, it is in anar-

chy and Israel must subdue it. If he can control it but won't, he has earned expulsion under the principle America cites in expelling the Taliban from power.

If expulsion strikes the U.S. State Department as, well, immoderate, here is a moderate version of the idea. When next the peripatetic Arafat flies off to visit world capitals, Israel should not let him come back: He cannot land in PA territory if Israel does not let him.

That is more than an idea. It is a plan.

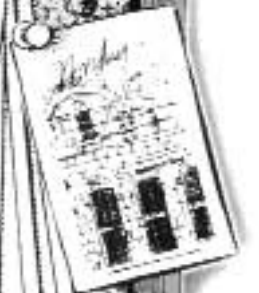

A Note From Zola

Dear Friends:

I have an important anniversary this year in addition to my birthday (December 3) and my Christian birthday (March 14). January 12, 2002, was the 50th anniversary of the day I became a man. I was a nervous 13-year-old on the morning of January 12, 1952, as I took up my responsibility as a Bar Mitzvah (Son of the Commandments). Since I came along so late in my mother's life, my maternal grandmother declared when I was born that God must have had something special for me to do in this world. I guess the handwriting was on the wall even way back then.

The old saying "The writing's on the wall" dates back to the story of Belshazzar in the book of Daniel. You remember, the king had blasphemed the God of Israel by desecrating the sacred goblets taken from the temple in Jerusalem. While the king and his cohorts and concubines drank from them and worshiped their idols, a mysterious human-like hand began writing on the wall in the palace, "MENE, MENE, TEKEL, UPARSIN." Frightened, the king summoned the prophet Daniel to interpret the message. The meaning?

"O Belshazzar, you have not humbled yourself...you have set yourself up against the Lord of heaven...you did not honor the God who holds in his hand your life and all your ways" (Daniel 5:22-23). That very night, the king was slain and the Medes and the Persians took his kingdom.

Yasser Arafat is no king, not a ruler of any kind, though the nations of

the world have dealt with him as though he were some sort of statesman. But now the writing is on the wall for him, too. The "authority" he presumes over the "Palestinian" people is weak and corrupt at best. He has cursed the Chosen People and now those curses are falling back upon him. He will no doubt be deposed not by Israel, but by his own cohorts in terror.

While most agree that Arafat is on his way out, it amazes me that so many "statesmen" treated him as a peer. For 22 years I've been telling you in these *Levitt Letters* that Yasser Arafat is nothing but a fraud. And it grieves me to think of the years and lives wasted because of this one man's lust for power.



How can the world not call him a terrorist? He began his career as a murderer, he has prided himself in killing Israelis and Americans, and now, two days after calling for "peace," he announces that he "is willing to sacrifice 70 Palestinians to ensure the death of one Israeli." (I guess that's as long as he is not one of them.)

Our friend in Jerusalem, Dr. Gerald Schroeder, who has appeared on *Zola Levitt Presents*, recently sent me his eyewitness account of Israel's war on the terrorists in the Palestinian areas, as well as an interesting discovery of media cover-up:

Thank God we are still well. When

evaluating Israel's raids on the PA and CNN coverage of these events, keep in mind that before [Israel] fired any missiles, our F16s flew low over the areas to warn of the impending attack so that the people could flee. Hence, the relatively low number of deaths.

And note even more, isn't it surprising that military targets would be in the vicinity of schools? No, it is not surprising, for these people [the Palestinians] this has been their tactic for 20 years and more — locate ammunition dumps, etc. right next to schools and hospitals, as the BBC once reported; that reporter was then banned by the PLO.

Because of some work I have done here, I reviewed...the filming by Reuters on Sept. 11 of approximately 100,000 Palestinians in Gaza celebrating [the attacks on America]. 100,000! That number was the Reuters estimate and as you may know, friends of Israel they are not. But it was never shown on TV because Arafat informed Reuters that if they aired it, their [news bureau] would be barred from the territories. You only saw a few dozen celebrating. The big film has been put in storage.

Only now does the United States wake up from its fuzzy neutral stance on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and demand that Arafat put up or shut up. I'm afraid, though, that we're speaking too little, too late, not learning from history or our own misguided foreign policy. Our nation is now

embroiled in our own war against terrorism, after having placated and coddled terrorist "statesmen" for decades, letting the enemy immigrate and flourish right in our own backyard. Pretending we need a "coalition" of Arab support, we've overlooked the sins of the terror-sponsoring nations like Iran, Syria, and

Left-wing intolerance and censorship never end, do they? Here's yet the latest example of P.C. idiocy:

A Virginia man is trying to censor recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance in schools because, he claims, the words exclude foreigners and "offend" some people.

Edward Myers, a software engineer from Sterling, has filed a "civil rights" petition with the U.S. Justice Department to dump the pledge in favor of patriotic songs and sayings that are neutral to religion and citizenship and thus more "inclusive," the *Washington Times* reported today.

"While I am not thrilled about the national anthem as an option, it would be better than the pledge because there is a difference between respecting another country and bowing in allegiance to it."

He is urging students to boycott the pledge every Friday. ■

Exposing a Fraud

FLORENCE, Ky. - There is no mention of Noah's Ark in most science museums. No mention of the Tower of Babel or the Garden of Eden, either.

Instead, you get dinosaur replicas, fossils, models of spiraling DNA, and informational text promoting what millions of Americans regard as drivel: the idea that all life on Earth evolved over 4 billion years from genetic scraps.

It's tantamount to brainwashing. Or so Ken Ham believes. Ham directs the global ministry Answers in Genesis. And he is building a \$14-million answer to evolution here in far northern Kentucky, just across the Ohio River from Cincinnati.

The Creation Museum & Family Discovery Center will offer all the classic science museum exhibits, but with a twist. Each one will be interpreted as proof of the Biblical account that God created the Earth and all that's in it over six days, just 6,000 years ago.

Critics worry the Creation Museum will legitimize an account of Earth's history that they see as a fable. But Ham, brusque and passionate, insists it's evolution that's the fraud. And he's determined to expose it.

He sees the museum as a long-overdue offensive against the scientific establishment — and against the many Christians who maintain that they can be true to their religion without taking every word of the Bible as fact.

The Answers in Genesis facility...will boast 50,000 square feet of exhibit space plus 47 acres of outdoor trails and displays (including, perhaps, a full-size replica ark) just five minutes from the Cincinnati airport. If donations keep coming in on pace, the museum should open by summer 2003. ■

Requiem for a terrorist

After decades in power, it would appear that the rule of Mohammed Yasser Arafat may well be coming to an end. The regime of the old terrorist is being consumed by the new terrorists created by Arafat himself in the school classrooms of the new Palestinian Authority.

Arafat has worked against Israel since the days before it was born. As an 18-year-old fighter, Arafat organized a gun-smuggling ring that was tasked with smuggling weapons into Israel for use by the Arabs who fought against the establishment of the Jewish state. When Israel was attacked by the combined might of the Arab world in an effort to annihilate the Jewish state at birth, Arafat was there, fighting the Jews from within their new borders.

When the Arabs were defeated, Arafat fled to Egypt where he enrolled in Cairo University. In 1956, he formed al Fatah as an underground terror organization. Fatah competed with the Palestine Liberation Organization that was backed by Syria, Egypt and Jordan. In 1967, the Arabs attacked Israel again in the third effort to annihilate the Jewish state in 19 years. When Egypt lost the Gaza Strip, Syria the Golan Heights and Jordan the West Bank, the Arabs living there ceased to be Jordanians, or Syrians, or Egyptians, and they all became "Palestinians." Arafat combined al-Fatah with the PLO in 1968 and declared himself chairman.

Arafat has been called the "father of modern terrorism." It was Arafat who discovered the value in hijacking American and Israeli airplanes. Between 1968 and 1973, Yasser Arafat oversaw at least nine international aircraft hijackings. Arafat outlined the goal of his organization and his view of a "peace process" with Israel in an interview with the *El Mundo* newspaper in Caracas, Venezuela, on Feb. 18, 1980. "Peace for us means the destruction of Israel. We are preparing for an all out war which will last for generations. We shall not rest until the day we return to our home and until we destroy Israel." Note that Arafat's vow is in two parts. He vows not to rest until, first, he returns to his "home" — presumably fulfilled when he returned to Israel following the signing of the Oslo Agreement. And from that moment forward, he has devoted his attention to the second part of his vow — the destruction of Israel...

He created an atmosphere in which 4 out of 5 Palestinians support continued violence. Less than 20 percent support a ceasefire. His own lieutenants are breaking up into factions. If he meets the demands of the Europeans, Americans and U.N. officials, he will be deposed or assassinated by his own people. If he doesn't, he will be deposed or assassinated by the Israelis. Arafat created a Frankenstein monster. And like the creator of the monster in Mary Shelley's classic, he may well die by its hand. ■

2. It's amazing our country can respond with ultimate force when terrorists attack us. Yet, when terrorists attack Israel, this administration and its predecessors chide the Israeli government for responding forcefully.

Along the lines of deceived believers in America, the recent publication of the *Voice of the Martyrs* by Tom White reports of a Muslim being invited to Willow Creek Church and the pastor telling the congregation, "...we all are serving the same God."

The offspring of Progressive Dispensationalism has made its voice heard. The church in America needs to be on high alert. — RH

Dear RH:

Your last remarks are very compelling. We should remember that some pastors graduating since the mid-eighties from Moody Bible Institute and Dallas Theological Seminary are ill-prepared to discuss Israel or prophecy, having been taught such doctrines as Progressive Dispensationalism. They are simply unaware of the importance of Israel in today's world, although you wonder how they can be Bible readers at all and be that ignorant of God's workings. The Church will pay a terrible price for the denigration of our finest seminaries and, in some cases, like the one you mention, churches can be next to worthless. — Zola

"Shame on you, Zola!"

Dear Zola:

For a number of years now, I have been a strong supporter.... I will forever be thankful for your ministry, which our Lord used to bring me back to my Jewish roots. I have, in the past, been able to overlook many of your political statements, at least until now.

When I began to read your November 2001 newsletter, I became so upset that I was not able to finish reading it. Zola, I was not aware of your background as a military specialist. I was also not aware that you were part of the discussions with President Bush and this Joint Chiefs of Staff. How could you have made statements such as "the fact is we're not [fighting terrorism]"?

Shame on you, Zola! Couldn't you find a more compassionate way to get your point across? Why do you constantly compare us to Israel when those comparisons negate our differences? We cannot be compared in terms of size nor are our populations similar.

Parade Magazine had a quote by Elie Wiesel: "Even when faced with the murderous madness of criminals, and in

the presence of the silent agony of their victims, it is incumbent upon us to choose between escape and solidarity, shame and honor. The terrorists have chosen shame. We choose honor."

I pray the Lord will give you discernment. It would grieve me, after all these years, to be forced to turn away from Zola Levitt Ministries. — BF

Dear BF:

I know that you have been a long-time supporter of our ministry, but please know that it does not take a military specialist to criticize the way we're "not fighting terrorism." Frankly, I speak up not because I have a newsletter, but simply because I'm an American and it's my right and yours to comment on how those who work for us (the president and his joint chiefs) are conducting this war. I also speak up as a prophecy teacher.

And as far as comparing the U.S. and Israel, we are very much the same. Almost alone in the world, both countries are melting pots comprised of, as you say, "people of different backgrounds and especially of different religions." I don't think you appreciate that Israel contains probably more religions than America but is, like our country, "basically comprised of people joined by a common heritage and religion." America is a Christian country, Israel is a Jewish country, and, with some exceptions, that's the basic truth. And the fact that both are "melting pot" democracies makes us very similar indeed. As to Elie Wiesel and his inspiring words, I can only say that there were times the Lord spoke this way and a time when He took up a whip.

I must tell you that if it depends on my agreeing with everything the government does or the Muslims do for you to be loyal to this ministry, I would reluctantly tell you to go somewhere else. But I'll miss you! — Zola

Ministry Outreach

To the Jew First

For those of you who supported the “To the Jew First” evangelistic outreach through your prayers and financial contributions, Todd Baker and I extend our sincere appreciation for the great opportunity to proclaim the gospel to His brethren in the land of Israel (Romans 10:14-15). Even though we are fools for God we are assured our labor is not in vain (I Corinthians 1:25; 15:58).

I’m writing this 3rd installment of the fall 2001 mission trip after the latest installment of terror in our beloved Israel, the land of milk and honey (Exodus 3:8; 33:3; Numbers 14:8).

Todd and I walked the streets of Zion Square many times during our stay in Jerusalem. From our experience, Saturday night after the observance of Shabbat, Zion Square is packed full of young people who are eager to hear the gospel.

You will encounter many young people in Zion Square on a Saturday night post Shabbat. They are vibrant and intelligent youth, full of curiosity and wonder. They respond with tear-filled eyes to the assurance that God has not forgotten Israel and they are a people of Divine choice (I Kings 10:9; 2 Chronicles 9:8; Psalm 98:3; Psalm 33:12; Exodus 9:5; etc.). Many eagerly receive the gospel with anticipation of a new life of hope in the good news of Y’shua.

Sometimes, though, you may encounter one whose teary eyes are of a different order. Those are the eyes that have encountered the results of terrorism firsthand and up-close. They are the tough cases that have difficulty believing that God exists, let alone comprehending the prophesied Jewish Messiah. When your best friend was blown up on a bus and another killed while serving in the IDF (Israeli Defense Force), the stark reality of the situation is one of hopelessness. But even this reality of senseless deaths can be shaken to its core by the gospel according to Y’shua. If the situation permitted, Todd and I would be on a plane tomorrow to spread the healing balm of Christ to the children of Israel, and the first place we would go is Zion Square. That is not because we are innately courageous; it is the love of God in us for His children in Israel. As Todd would say, “We walk by faith and not by fear” (Ephesians 6:16; Hebrews 11:1-39).

Early in our stay in Jerusalem we determined we would visit Sbarro’s Pizzeria in order to show Christian solidarity with our Jewish brethren. Approximately one month earlier a suicide bomber had destroyed this popular eatery in Zion Square, resulting in the loss of fifteen Israeli lives. Against the odds and with much courage, Sbarro’s was back in business.

To the manager’s amazement Todd and I recognized the courageous act of rebuilding the pizzeria in the face of constant terrorist threat. We explained how Zola Levitt Ministries and Shalom Shalom Messianic Congregation had sent us to Israel to comfort and encourage God’s people during the trying times of the PLO Intifada, and we were at Sbarro’s in particular to show American Bible-believing Christian support to the people of the Book. We concluded our conversation with posting a Christian encouragement note to the staff and giving a Hebrew gospel tract to the manager.

Our sovereign God (Daniel 4:25-26; Isaiah 61:11) had much more in mind for our trip to Sbarro’s. Our conversation was overheard by a Christian news anchor from Oslo, Norway, and his Messianic-Jewish cameraman. This prompted an extemporaneous interview for a documentary to be aired later in the month. During the interview the anchor informed us that we were actually sitting where the terrorist had detonated the bomb! From the exact location the enemy (Satan) had used against the Jews, we were proclaiming the gospel according to Y’shua [the Jewish Messiah] to the world. Our God is truly awesome and amazing in all His ways (Daniel 4:2-3; Isaiah 55:8-11). After the interview the Messianic-Jew embraced us with excitement and joy.

In next month’s *Levitt Letter* I will conclude with our visit to the Galilee region where we encountered a group from the generation of the Shoah (Holocaust). ■

A Bible for All of Us

Every day our ministry office receives literally hundreds of letters from readers and viewers around the world. Many who write submit theological questions. Although we're not set up to be a clearinghouse for answering Bible questions, we like to provide guidance to those seeking help in understanding the Scriptures. Remember, the Bible, authored by God Himself, is the foundation of our efforts.

Zola provides our "front-line" teaching through television, videos, books, and teaching cassettes. Take advantage of these resources often or visit www.levitt.com to access many articles that answer tough Bible questions. Finally, acquire the basics in good personal Bible study methods.

I remain convinced that our Lord did not give the Bible only for professors and pastors to understand. One great evidence of this is the language of the New Testament, the Koine Greek. Koine was the language of the marketplace which children, fruit vendors, and innkeepers used everyday. Given a choice, God could have insisted on the pristine language of Classical Greek for His Word, but He didn't. He wants every person to be able to understand Him.

Occasionally, we'll receive a letter from someone insisting to know the exact Hebrew or Greek rendering of a verse or word. Learning Biblical Greek and Hebrew is a good discipline for those who have the desire, but doing

so is not essential for reading and interpreting Scripture adequately. As one of my language profs used to say, "It's the difference between a black and white TV and a color TV. Same picture, same sound. One just simply brings out more color." That's what knowledge of Greek and Hebrew does; it brings out the color or nuance of words and phrases in the original language. But if becoming a Greek and Hebrew language expert was required for understanding God's Word, then we'd all be back in the same situation in which the reformers found themselves.

The hierarchy of the Catholic Church at the time prevented the Bible from being translated into the language of the common person. Thus, many of the reformers suffered great persecution for translating it into English and other languages. But in doing so they made it available for anyone to read and understand, thus sparking the spread of the gospel across Europe and eventually around the world.

In our next issue, we'll look at practical ways in which you can read the Bible effectively and interpret it accurately...without going to seminary! ■

Hebraic Insight

Jewish tradition requires that we personally bless the LORD no less than 100 times a day. Many Hebrew blessings found in the prayer book (or *Siddur*) include the opening invocation, "Baruch atah, Adonai eloheinu..." which may be translated "Blessed are You, Lord our God..." In the verse on the left, we can see that this phrase derives from the Scriptures themselves: Blessing God for his marvelous deeds is always right, always the appropriate response to Who he is: for He alone does truly wonderful things. It is interesting to note that the word translated "blessed" (*baruch*) is related to the Hebrew word for "knee" (*berech*), as is the word for "blessing" (*bracha*), thus implying an association between humbling ourselves (i.e., kneeling before Him in recognition of His blessedness) and receiving personal blessing from Him. Yes, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who hath blessed us with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Messiah Jesus" (Eph.1:3).

Dr. McCall and I are in a peculiar position as regards the big seminaries. Anonymous spokesmen, authors and letter writers from their very faculties constantly inform us of the failings of the administrators, even while those administrators malign us. In short, we receive inside information on a constant basis about the presidents and other controllers of the large seminaries. In the article below, Dr. McCall details Biola president Clyde Cook upholding Presidents Swindoll and Stowell of Dallas and Moody, respectively. But all three are criticized liberally from within their own ranks.

At this crucial moment in regard to Israel and prophecy, these distracted leaders are promoting theological ignorance in their student bodies and apparently preparing a generation that will enter the Kingdom in ignorance. As with the founding of Moody's bank, they are side-tracked into worldly concerns at precisely the time they should be reviewing the doctrines they have thrown out of their schools.

Our senior theologian, Dr. Thomas McCall, is thoroughly acquainted with the problem and addresses it incisively below. — Zola

The Big Three Deviations: Dallas, Moody and Biola/Talbot -PART 1

It gives me no pleasure to criticize my alma maters and those with whom I have had close business and ministry relationship. I am an alumnus of Talbot Theological Seminary (graduate school of Biola) and Dallas Theological Seminary. I am a past president of the student body of Talbot, and a past president of the alumni association of Dallas. Most of what I have learned theologically I have learned through these two institutions. I hold in great reverence my professors at these schools: Dr. Charles L. Feinberg, Dr. Robert Thomas, Dr. John Walvoord, Dr. Merrill Unger, Dr. Charles Ryrie, Dr. Dwight Pentecost, and many others.

Furthermore, Zola and I have had a thirty-year relationship with Moody Bible Institute and Moody Press. Moody published some of our best-selling books about Biblical and prophetic subjects over the years, and we came to know and appreciate principled ministers and business leaders like Les Stobbe and other editors.

Dallas, Moody and Biola/Talbot: the Big Three

Nothing would please us more than to give continuing loyalty and support to these venerable schools and institutions. In dispensational circles these schools, Dallas, Moody and Talbot, are known as the big three. There are other dispensational schools in the country, but these are the major ones that have carried the banner of the teaching of premillennialism, the pre-Tribulation Rapture, pro-Israel orientation and dispensationalism. These schools were founded in the early part of the 20th century to combat growing liberalism, and to perpetuate the great dispensational Biblical truths that had been restored to the evangelical church during the previous century. The board and administration are charged with the responsibility of continuing the purposes and doctrines of the founders.

Difficulties in Correcting Deviant Teaching in Schools

What happens when the schools change their teaching, have a "paradigm shift" in classroom instruction, but then maintain before the donating Christian public that there has been no significant change? Today in these very schools the Rapture of the Church is rarely mentioned, the new Dispensationalism bears little resemblance to the Dispensationalism taught from the beginning, and a pronounced pro-Israel attitude has turned into something remarkably more like pro-Palestinianism. Conscientious professors express their concerns privately, but they are severely intimidated from expressing them publicly. Sincere deans express concerns over the divergent teaching of some of their professors, but they are prohibited from removing them because of academic freedom and complex accrediting procedures. When school administrators speak to alumni groups and the alumni ask questions about the changes, they are told nothing has changed, and any dissent will be considered disloyalty to the school.

Because the schools are unwilling or unable to correct the situation, concerned scholars write learned books and articles against the divergent teaching. This helps, but usually only other scholars read these works, and the supporting public knows very little about it. Furthermore, the older, more experienced professors of the school are pressed into service to respond to the articles. They are conflicted. They don't agree with the new teachings, but they don't want any harm to come to the schools into which they have invested their lives. Thus they wind up saying they don't believe the divergent teachings, but that they are harmless. It is all very gentlemanly and scholarly. Meanwhile, the deviant professors keep turning out classrooms full of students with strange doctrines, and the public knows very little about the doctrinal controversies swirling over the institutions, good professors are fired or leave in disgust, and churches cannot under-

Saudi Arabia and now call them “allies” in our war against the very murderers they continue to harbor.


Our government’s first duty is the defense of its citizens. But how can we be protected when our leaders continue to build a coalition with those who sponsor and promote evil against America? It is nothing less than a dereliction of duty to the American people. The smiles, handshakes, and agreements for peace have resulted in hijackings, car bombs, suicide missions, and more deaths, but no peace. Are we making progress in our war against terrorism? To an extent, yes. We’ve defeated the Taliban of Afghanistan. We’ve bombed the daylights out of the Al-Qaida soldiers there. (When are the American Arabs going to turn over the Al-Qaida soldiers here?) But who are we going after? Osama bin Laden? Yes, he’s evil, as President Bush said. His strategy of terror is responsible for thousands of innocent lives. But he and his comrades are nothing more than hired hit men.

I believe “the writing is on the wall” for the entire world and the events of today in the U.S. and in Israel are merely precursors to the false peace which the antichrist will promote at the beginning of the Tribulation. The “signs of the end,” as I discuss in our newest series (see page 15 to order), are very likely related to the global rise of Islam, our current war on terrorism, and the struggle Israel faces for its own political survival. The Lord’s return for His bride, the Church, is near — nearer now than ever before — and it’s time for the Bride to awaken from her slumber and prepare herself for her Lord.

One of the ministries God has given us is to sound a wake-up call to Christians, to churches, and even to training centers for Christian leaders (i.e., Bible colleges and seminaries). Lately, though, I’ve been appalled by the lack of interest in End Times prophecy and in the Chosen People. Many congregations in Florida responded with overwhelming enthusiasm to these messages during my eight weeks of conference ministry there, but not all.

A Messianic congregation in Florida told me last month that the huge Baptist church in their city, which also hosts BSF (Bible Study Fellowship) that Sandra attends, refuses to work with Messianic believers and are simply not interested in listening to Jewish Christians talk about Bible prophecy and Israel. This is another sign of the continuing lack of End Times teaching at our major theological institutions, those who train pastors to lead such churches. (See Dr. Tom McCall’s article regarding Biola on page 12).

This anti-Israel bias reminds me of a very similar experience when I last spoke at my own alma mater, Indiana University. A Palestinian reporter in the audience misquoted me in the student newspaper, even imputing a four-letter-word to my talk, and distorted almost everything I said in the same manner Palestinian spokesmen



traditionally do. I wrote to the editor and was promised equal space. I sent an editorial immediately and was told it ran. I asked for the clipping, and they finally admitted that it never did run. I complained to the journalism faculty and was rebuffed, and then to the president of the university and was rebuffed again. Finally, we began contacting the donors of Indiana University in alphabetical order and told them what had happened to their school.

I subsequently received a phone call from the chancellor of the school, since Indiana University, like Christian seminaries these days, keeps cash closest to its heart. When donations were lost, they wrote immediately. I still demanded my equal space, which was promised again. But this time, my article was refused since it was too long to run as “a letter to the editor.” I never received my equal space at all.

I washed my hands of Indiana University and want nothing more to do with it. I think its attitude is probably average among American higher institutions these days, even in Christian higher education.

Let me urge you to not stand idly by on the sidelines as our diplomats often do and as our seminary presidents seem to be comfortable with. Get involved in learning and then teaching End Times prophecy to your family and in your church. Encourage your pastor and Christian education leaders to incorporate this vital segment of Biblical truth in the regular diet of spiritual food served each week at your church. Confront the bias in the media, even in the Christian media, when Israel, the Chosen of God, is put down (Gen. 12:3 calls it a “curse”). Send missionaries to the beloved of God in Israel, as in our “To the Jew First” outreach. And go to the Promised Land to bless Israel with your presence and in return to receive manifold blessings from God. Here are some opportunities for you to consider:

stand why graduates are so different from their predecessors. Eventually, the new doctrines become dominant, and criticism is muted.

Why the *Levitt Letter* is the Point Man in the Effort to Correct Bad Teaching

This leaves the criticism to be carried forward by those who are addressing the general Christian public, such as this newsletter and the articles that Zola and I have written. This troubles the school administrations more than the scholarly journals, because our readers are frequently longtime supporters of these schools. When one of them tells the school that they are upset about the changes and are considering withdrawing support, it tends to get the attention of the leaders. These letters to the schools are usually referred to a professor who responds to our reader in the time-tested manner of the senior professor explanations mentioned above. The reader then refers the response to us, and we expose the whole sad affair to our people. Normally, the administrations attempt to marginalize us, saying that we are a mistaken, disgruntled, fringe group, perhaps with ulterior motives, who just don't understand complex theological issues. However, when we get together with our theological colleagues, they let us know that they are not in a position to speak out, but encourage us to persevere in leading the charge against deviant doctrine. We understand our recent book on the subject, *Battles with Seminaries*, is being widely circulated among conservative theologians.

Meanwhile, the theological circles are embroiled in controversy, graduates of the main schools are turned out with strange views about the Rapture, Israel and Dispensationalism, and the public remains confused about the whole process. The administrations rejoice over the continuing approval of the accrediting associations, the increase in school enrollments with the broadening doctrinal requirements, the flow of federal and/or private grant money into the coffers, budget increases, the construction of new buildings, and the apparent blessing of the Lord. Anyone who disagrees is put into the category of the Grinch who stole progress. ○ (CONTINUED IN NEXT ISSUE

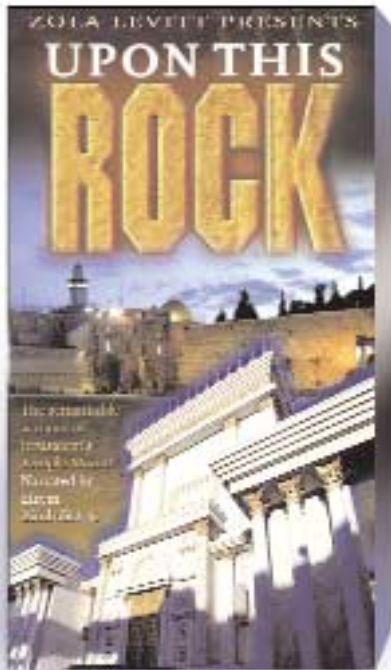

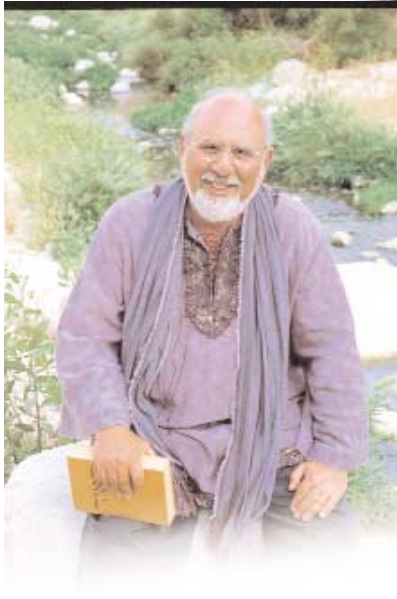
