ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

We, the undersigned natural persons ^{Attorney at Law} ~~at the age of eight-~~ teen (18) years or more, at least two of whom are citizens of the State of Texas, acting as Incorporators of a corporation under the Texas Non-Profit Corporation Act, adopt the following Articles of Incorporation for such corporation.

I.

The name of the corporation is ZOLA LEVITT MINISTRIES, INC.

II.

The place in this state where the principal office of the corporation is to be is the City of Dallas, County of Dallas. The corporation may have such other offices, as may from time to time be designated by its board of directors.

III.

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable, religious and educational purposes, including, for such purposes, the conducting of religious worship and the making of distributions to organizations that qualify as exempt organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

IV.

The number of directors constituting the initial board of directors of the corporation is three (3) and the names and addresses of the persons who are to serve as the initial directors are:

V.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, its members, trustees, officers or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article Third hereof. No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office. Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from Federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue

Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law) or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law).

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, this corporation shall not, except to an insubstantial degree, engage in any activities or exercise any powers that are not in furtherance of the purposes of this corporation.

VI.

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, the Board of Directors shall, after paying or making provision for the payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation, dispose of all of the assets of the corporation exclusively for the purposes of the corporation in such manner, or to such organization or organizations organized and operated exclusively for charitable, educational or religious purposes as shall at the time qualify as an exempt organization or organizations under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 (or the corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue Law), as the Board of Directors shall determine. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by the Court of Common Pleas of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

VII.

The post office address of the initial registered office of the corporation is 6822 Lakehurst Ave., Dallas, Texas 75230, and the name of the initial registered agent at such address is Zola Levitt.

VIII.

The corporation is a nonprofit corporation.

IX.

The period of its duration is perpetual.

X.


To further the above purpose, the corporation shall have full power to purchase, lease or otherwise acquire property, to publish a newspaper or magazine, to own and/or operate radio or television stations, support missionaries, raise funds, and to do those things necessary to promulgate the Gospel in an effective and an efficient manner.


