

Look UP!

Watching television these days is similar to reading end times prophecy in that the content is much the same. We are certainly all well aware of the Los Angeles earthquake, the ferociously cold weather in the Midwest and the East and the odd feeling that 75% of the news is about weird courtroom proceedings. The Biblical pictures of the end times ("... famine, pestilence, earthquakes in diverse places ... betrayals, hatred ...") are well re-

flected in the news. The Lord's sad observation, "ye shall be hated of all nations," in regard to Israel is more than borne out by circumstances today where governments are cooperating to dismember the Promised Land, and the general picture of things is indeed "as it was in the days of Noah . . ." If we look back through the '90s, we see Los Angeles fires, the Midwest flood, the Florida hurricane, riots, crime and a true degeneration of this society - arguably the world's most successful society. Is Genesis 12:3 coming true for America: "I will curse him that curseth thee"? The previous administration turned its back on Israel and the present one is supporting the disastrous peace covenant with the PLO. Are we getting what we deserve?

Though I received more criticism for my views on the Iran-Contra affair than for any other political situation I ever wrote about, the Walsh Report has come in and has justified everything in those articles. Oliver North was handsome indeed, tall and straight, but he didn't tell the truth and he ran a private illegal business for his own gain and that of a few compadres in Washington. Presidents Reagan and Bush were handsome, well-spoken, conservative gentlemen appointed to be Christians by a majority of our heroworshippers, but they subverted the Constitution itself and broke the law. Special Prosecutor Walsh's conclusions were that Reagan was convinced he was doing best by the country, but Bush did not have even that excuse. I have heard the complaints and personal attacks concerning Walsh, but I will stick by his story, and my own.

Russia seems to be leading the way into the Tribulation Period, choosing something like a "Little Hitler" for prime minister and generally failing to come to a consensus on its future. That huge country full of resources and brains seems hopelessly fragmented. The emerging heavily Moslem southern Republics may well fulfill Ezekiel's prophecy commonly called the Russian invasion of Israel (Ezek. 38, 39), and there are even some reactionary Communists who decorated Lenin's tomb on his recent anniversary.

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Europe too seems to be descending into tribalism, with the former Yugoslavia as the pristine example of how bad things can get. Germany seems unable to cope with its neo-Nazi problems as detailed on our recent

television programs, nor does it seem to care. Nationalism seems to be driving the countries apart rather than together (other than for their economic alliance, which seems to fit the tennation confederacy prophecies).

President Clinton met recently with "President" Assad of Syria, the bloody dictator who has decreed life and death over every person in that country since his 1970 military coup. There is absolutely nothing to be gained with legitimizing the reign of a tyrant like Assad who, body-for-body, has destroyed more of his own civilians than Saddam Hussein at his worst. Syria has shown no inclination toward

making peace with Israel other than the obvious ploy of trying to get back the Golan Heights from which they could then annihilate the Jewish people in the valleys below. There is no reason in heaven and earth for the president of a democracy to have even a single conversation with such a killer, and I can only say that the world has become a very strange place as the end times approach. The new round of peace talks in Washington will probably lead nowhere and that is my personal prayer. I cannot begin to get convinced that Israel's enemies want anything but her complete destruction, however they go about it. The whole idea of "peace and safety" reminds me of the scripture that warns against just such a delusion at the end of the age.





A NOTE FROM ZOLA

Dear Friends,

I had a most interesting meeting at my home recently. A number of people interested in founding a new Messianic Synagogue in Dallas were my guests, and we talked over how that might be done and what its major thrust would be.



I have always wanted to found some kind of "Messianic Community Center" to teach Jews and Christians the Bible and the magnificent 4,000-year story of Judaism. The synagogues do not teach these two subjects adequately so most Jewish people are not fully aware of simple facts about Judaism. They do not realize they are the world's oldest people, speaking its oldest language, worshipping in its oldest faith, etc. And of course they have no realization of prophecy, which is almost completely concerned with Israel, and of the Messiah, the King of Israel.

As to Christian people, they too lack this splendid kind of knowledge since the seminaries do not typically take it up and the churches major in practical Christian living more than the larger Biblical picture. Our Institute of Jewish-Christian Studies was originally founded to impart knowledge of Jewish roots to Christian people (and Jewish people) in order to enhance their faith, and we are now thinking that this might be done on a more personal scale.

If we had a congregation in Dallas, those of you visiting this crossroads city might like to attend the classes and use the library and other facilities we hope to someday install. As to those in the metroplex area, we would be glad to serve in this more intimate ministry capacity. The problem of television is that it reaches far but not deep. We are talking to millions but only for a few minutes a week and only about what we can squeeze into that very expensive time.

Metroplex viewers will have received an invitation by the time you read this article about actually coming together so we can see who turns up and what sort of nucleus we have for this idea. In any case, I'll keep you posted as the project develops (or *doesn't* develop, according to the Lord's will), and you will all eventually be invited.

As to other excitement around the ministry these days, we are planning to tape some programs on our March 6 and May 29 tours of Israel (if you want to be seen on national television, come on the tour and that may happen)! We are going to do some programs on King David since he ruled in quite a similar period for Israel, sitting through lots of peace negotiations with hostile nations on every border (and wars too). David's efforts did result in a time of peace under King Solomon, and perhaps we can draw some interesting connections with that Biblical period. At the same time we will continue to chronicle the peace talks with interviews of key Israeli and possibly Palestinian officials. We will probably run the

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programs concurrently, as with *Tell It On The Mountains* and the *Signs Of The End* programs this fall and winter. It just seems as if there is so much to cover these days that we are constantly busy – which answers my prayer when this ministry began.

I would very much appreciate your help with the upcoming efforts. I had remarked in recent communications that we were reasonably well fixed for the moment, but the Lord has led us to undertake these two new



A Look at the Book

MY CUP RUNNETH OVER

As we head quickly toward the new century, New Year's resolutions formulated in our minds, let's take a moment to focus on our relationship with the Lord of the holidays and our lives. Our Scripture passage this month is Psalm 23. This is



perhaps the most "famous" of all the psalms, and I'm certain that most, if not all, of you are quite familiar with its lyrical poetry. I know of no better Biblical passage to provide a much needed refreshing pause following the busy holidays.

When I think of Psalm 23, I immediately think of it being read from the King James Bible in the velvet tones of Alexander Scourby or Laurence Olivier or some other British actor with a richly gifted voice. I also think of funerals. I don't think I've ever attended a funeral or memorial ser-

vice without hearing this moving passage. The familiarity we all share concerning this psalm is

a testimony to its poetic brilliance and spiritual insight. For three thousand years this psalm has managed to communicate in a mere six verses the cry of the hearts of millions of God's people. However, this familiarity with the psalm carries with it the danger that we will take its message for granted, that we will have heard it so often that we stop listening to the words. It is my desire that this month we examine Psalm 23 intimately. As we go through the psalm, using my own verse-byverse translation of King David's original Hebrew, let us allow David's words to impact us anew.

The Lord is my shepherd; I never lack anything (v. 1). The first picture David paints is that of a shepherd in relationship with one of His sheep. In this classic metaphor, David himself is the individual sheep, and He iden-

tifies the Lord as His personal shepherd. It is interesting that David does not say, "God is my shepherd," or, "the Most High is my shepherd"; no, David specifically uses the most sacred and holy name for God, "YHWH." For the nation of ancient Israel and the Jewish people even today, this was the cherished and awesome covenant name of God, the name by which he revealed Himself to Moses. To David's readers, this name symbolized the Lord's protection and provision for His covenant people, Israel. The portrait of God as a shepherd was one of the most common illustrations of God's relationship to His people in Scripture (2 Sam. 5:2; 7:7; 1 Kings 22:17; etc.). It was also the role that Jesus described Himself as portraying. Millions of believers through the centuries have known Jesus as "the Good Shepherd."

Since the Lord is the author's shepherd, he will never lack anything. The more familiar translation, "I shall not want," although more poetic in English, does not really do jus-

> tice to the original Hebrew nuance. There will never be a time when this sheep will not have enough to eat or

drink, shelter from the elements, time to rest, etc. Whatever his needs are, the Lord will provide for them as his personal shepherd.

He makes me lie down in green pastures; He leads me beside refreshing waters (v. 2). Continuing the sheep/ shepherd metaphor, David is saying here that the Lord always arranges a safe haven for him to get some rest. He is dependent upon his protector/provider to direct him to green, lush pasture land and calm waters where he can rest and nourish himself in peace and quiet. David's experience is that of many of us; needing a respite from the stress and anxiety of our late twentieth-century lives, we can turn to the Lord, the good shepherd, to find the peace that passes understanding.

He restores my vitality. He guides me in straight paths for His name's sake (v. 3). David's imagery is much earthier than the familiar King James version would lead us to believe. Since sheep do not have "souls," what the shepherd is restoring here is the sheep's vitality; in other words, "God refreshes me." Neither can a sheep be led on a morally "righteous" path. Although the poetry of "righteous paths" is moving, what David is saying is that the shepherd leads the sheep in the most direct, safest and straightest course possible to get to their destination.


The reason the shepherd does this is that His reputation is on the line! What kind of shepherd exposes his sheep to unnecessary danger, meandering off course, taking needless detours before arriving at their destination? The Lord, YHWH, has pledged to protect and provide for his people. Scripture is clear that the Lord directs the steps of His people. We all have a tendency, like sheep, to go astray, but when we follow Him, He does not lead us in an aimless course, but rather with divine purpose and direction. We believers are indeed on the fast track – our God is Even though I walk through deepest, darkest valleys, I won't fear any danger, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me (v. 4). I have been to Israel many times and have seen with my own eyes the deep dark valleys of the Judean

hills. In these potentially treacherous gullies (called "wadis" in Hebrew), danger may well lurk for unsuspecting sheep. These deep dark valleys might well be valleys of "the shadow of death" for sheep or their shepherds, as, even today, they provide cover for wild animals to prowl and pounce. Indeed, it is not "evil," as in moral corruptness, the sheep has to be afraid of there, but the danger of what could be waiting in the unknown darkness.

However, the sheep are not traversing this valley alone. God the shepherd protects His sheep by means of the shepherd's common tools of the trade – a heavy rod, to beat off

attacking animals, and a staff, to keep the sheep in line and on course. Our Lord uses these tools with his "sheep," even today; He offers the same protection and guidance with us as with David, three thousand years ago.

You prepare a table before me in my enemies' presence; You anoint my head with oil: my cup overflows! (v. 5). David now concludes the shepherd/sheep metaphor of verses 1-4 and for the final two verses switches to one of a host and his guest. The Lord is viewed as a host who honors David, the guest, with abundant provisions and hospitality. A private table is laid out before David by his host. Anyone who has partaken of Middle Eastern hospitality, as I have, knows full well the elaborate and abundant meals that are so typical of that tradition! Course after course is laid out: appetizer upon appetizer, entree upon entree, dessert upon dessert. David's choice of language is such that a sense of ongoing provision is meant here - in other words, this is not just one trip to the all-youcan-eat buffet, rather, this is a lifestyle! This divinely prepared banquet never ends!

Best of all, continues David, God is performing all this blessing in full view of David's enemies. This "feast-ival" is happening right in front of their faces, leaving no room for doubt as to whose side the Lord is on. The divine host has spared no expense or amenity; as was customary in Biblical times, the host anointed the head of his honored guest with oil. David's cup cannot contain the blessing the Lord is pouring out. There have been many times that I have felt like that this past year. I have a beautiful new wife, a home, a car that still runs; I minister with Zola Levitt Ministries; I get to write this column – my cup overflows! Take a moment and meditate on the times you have felt this way in 1993. Have you viewed your cup as being only half-full? Half-empty? Overflowing?

Assuredly, goodness and love will pursue me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the Lord forever (v. 6). David, as a member of the Covenant (Continued on Page 10)

would see it even more than once. And keep in mind that it came about to begin with through government leaders meeting with and drawing up peace agreements with Adolph Hitler!

Assad's own people, the Syrians – about whom the world never gets a single news story – are so terrorized that in their last "election," held a decade or so ago, Assad won with 99.9% of the "vote." I assume one small cemetery could hold the dissenters comfortably.

On our programming in 1994 we intend to keep a close eye on all of these "peace" negotiations, and also on the advancing signs of the Antichrist – the neo-Nazi movement, the expansion of Islam fundamentalism, the increasing economic woes of the democracies everywhere and the intensification of anti-Semitism. If we are reading the Bible correctly, these are just the signs that need to come together to form the awful tribulation period.

people of God, is confident that God's goodness and love will pursue Him the rest of His life. Note the irony here – instead of David's enemies (v. 5) in hot pursuit, God's love pursues Him! The word translated, "love" means God's loving loyalty to His people, His steadfast love that never ceases (Lam. 3:22). This is as true for God's New Covenant people as it was for Israel. We can run but we can't hide from the relentless pursuit of the Lord's goodness and love for us. Sooner or later it will catch up to us, and He will shower blessing after blessing on us.

It has been my purpose to provide a fresh and refreshing study of a very familiar psalm. The imagery David uses in Psalm 23, although ancient, is timeless. He portrays God as both provider and protector, shepherd and host. The psalm is particularly concerned with the personal aspect of God's protection and provision for the single, individual sheep. It is my prayer for all of you that in 1994 God's goodness will catch up with you and that you will dwell in His presence all the days of your life – and forever after.



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
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
