“It’s A Great Big Lie”

As the most visible Arab-American critic of Yasser Arafat and the phony “Palestinian” agenda, I get a lot of hate mail.

I’ve even received more than my share of death threats.

Most of those who attack me — at least those who bother to get beyond the four-letter words and insults — say I just don’t understand or have sympathy for these poor Arabs who were displaced, chased out of their homes and turned into refugees by the Israelis.

Let me state this plainly and clearly: The Jews in Israel took no one’s land.

When Mark Twain visited the Holy Land in the 19th century, he was greatly disappointed. He didn’t see any people. He referred to it as a vast wasteland. The land we now know as Israel was practically deserted.

By the beginning of the 20th centu-

ry, that began to change. Jews from all over the world began to return to their ancestral homeland — the Promised Land Moses and Joshua had conquered two millennia earlier, Christians and Jews believe, on the direct orders of God.

That’s not to say there wasn’t always a strong Jewish presence in the land — particularly in and around Jerusalem. In 1854, according to a report in the *New York Tribune*, Jews con-



stituted two-thirds of the population of that holy city. The source for that statistic? A journalist on assignment in the Middle East that year for the *Tribune*. His name was Karl Marx. Yes, *that* Karl Marx.

A travel guide to Palestine and Syria, published in 1906 by Karl Baedeker, illustrates the fact that, even when the Islamic Ottoman Empire ruled the region, the Muslim population in Jerusalem was minimal. The book estimates the total population of

“I understand the anger. I understand the political issues



involved, but what I have to concentrate on right now is getting the violence down and getting a political discussion under way. And the political discussion ultimately has to involve the government of the United States, it has to involve the Afghan leaders, and, right now, Mullah Omar is an Afghan leader that the Afghan people look to. He has associates who work with him, who are in leadership positions, but they are empowered in their work by Mullah Omar, and so that’s the reality I have to deal with.”

THE SECRETS OF THE SCROLLS

TV SERIES

Seven 30-minute programs on two VHS tapes

In 1947 a Bedouin boy, in search of a lost goat, threw a stone through the narrow opening of a cave. Hearing the sound of breaking pottery, he entered the cave and happened upon a 2,000-year-old treasure. He had discovered the Dead Sea Scrolls.

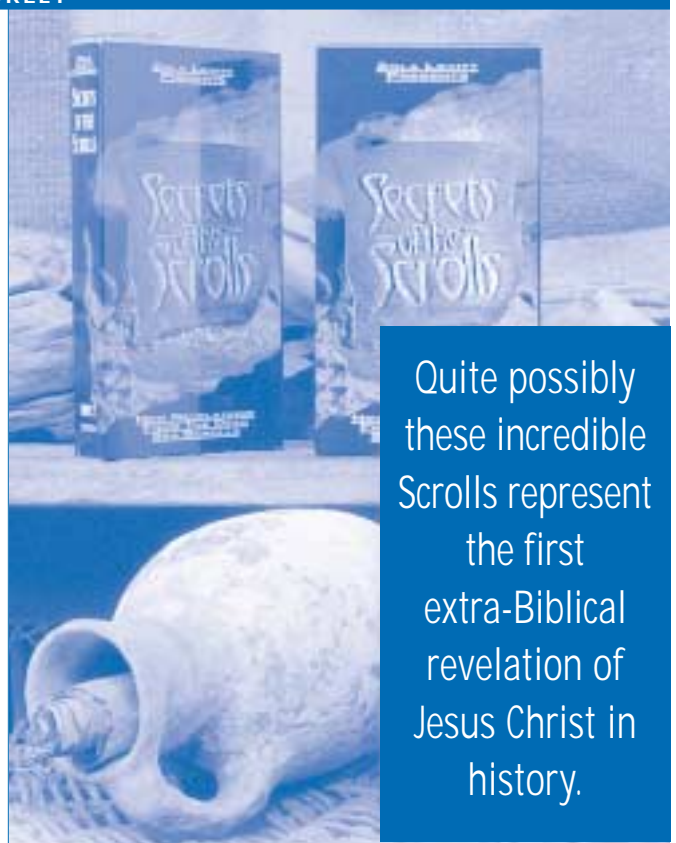

Quite possibly these incredible Scrolls represent the first extra-Biblical revelation of Jesus Christ in history.

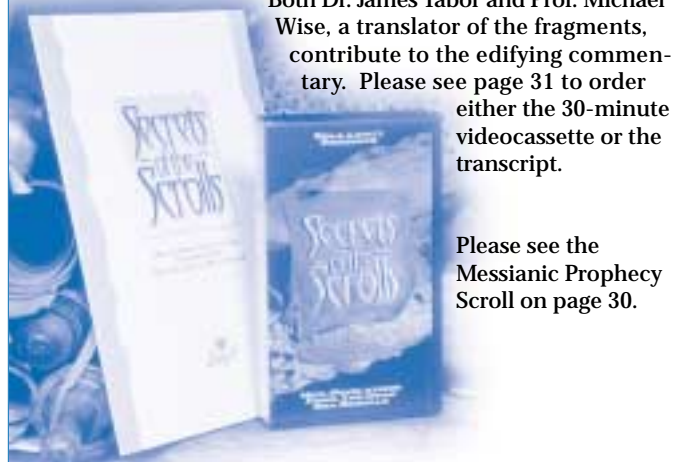

the city at 60,000, of whom 7,000 were Muslims, 13,000 were Christians and 40,000 were Jews.

“The number of Jews has greatly risen in the last few decades, in spite of the fact that they are forbidden to immigrate or to possess landed property,” the book states.

Even though the Jews were persecuted, still they came to Jerusalem and represented the overwhelming majority of the population as early as 1906. And even though Muslims today claim Jerusalem as the third holiest site in Islam, when the city was under Islamic rule, they had little interest in it.

As the Jews came, drained the swamps and made the deserts bloom, something interesting began to happen. Arabs followed. I don't blame them. They had good reason to come. They came for jobs. They came for prosperity. They came for freedom. And they came in large numbers.

Winston Churchill observed in 1939: “So far from being persecuted, the Arabs have crowded into the country and multiplied till their population has increased more than even all world Jewry could lift up the Jewish population.”

Then came 1948 and the great partition. The United Nations proposed the creation of two states in the region — one Jewish, one Arab. The Jews accepted it gratefully. The Arabs rejected it with a vengeance and declared war.

Arab leaders urged Arabs to leave the area so they would not be caught in the crossfire. They could return to their homes, they were told, after Israel was crushed and the Jews destroyed. It didn't work out that way. By most counts, several hundred thousand Arabs were displaced by this war — not by Israeli aggression, not by some Jewish real-estate grab, not by Israeli expansionism.

In fact, there are many historical records showing the Jews urged the Arabs to stay and live with them in peace. But, tragically, they chose to leave.

Fifty-four years later, the sons and daughters and grandsons and granddaughters of those refugees are all-too-often still living in refugee camps — not because of Israeli intransigence, but because they are misused as a political tool of the Arab powers.

Those poor unfortunates could be settled in a week by the rich Arab oil states that control 99.9 percent of the Middle East landmass, but they are kept as virtual prisoners, filled with misplaced hatred for Jews and armed as suicide martyrs by the Arab power brokers.



At no time did the Jews uproot Arab families from their homes.

This is the modern real history of the Arab-Israeli conflict. At no time did the Jews uproot Arab families from their homes. When there were title deeds to be purchased, they bought them at inflated prices. When there were not, they worked the land so they could have a place to live without the persecution they faced throughout the world.

It's a great big lie that the Israelis displaced anyone — one of a series of lies and myths that have the world on the verge of committing yet another great injustice to the Jews.



When asked whether Mullah Omar was a terrorist, imagine if Powell replied: “The reality I have to deal with is that whether you put a label on him or not is sort of irrelevant to the reality that he is the leader of the Afghan people.”

You catch that? “Whether you put a label on him or not” and “irrelevant to the reality.”



Funny, I thought the whole point of the war on terrorism was to decide who is a terrorist and who isn't. If the labels don't matter, how can you have a war on terrorism? Could you have a war on cancer if you refused to label what is or isn't cancer? Should doctors not concern themselves with the silly question of what is or isn't cancer? How about the war on drugs? If a dead cat or an old tire can be a “drug” — after all, the labels don't really matter — maybe we should call that off, too.

Oh, I'm sorry, I'm getting ahead of myself. The above hypothetical from Colin Powell is exactly what he said April 21 on ABC's “This Week.” Exactly, that is, except for the parts where I changed Israel to the United States, Yasser Arafat for Mullah Omar and Palestinians for Afghans.

So, as I was saying, it's next to impossible to declare war on something if you refuse to identify what the “something” is. For months, President Bush framed the issue matter-of-factly: “You're either with us or you're with the terrorists.” Straightforward. Simple. Clear.

Now that's out the window, which is the biggest source of Bush's troubles with the right these days. The mainstream media has been stunned by the “Pro-Israel” reaction of American conservatives in recent weeks. *The Washington Post* and *The New York Times* have published multiple in-depth accounts of how, and to

Saddam the Romantic



BAGHDAD (Reuters) — A romantic novel apparently written by Iraqi President Saddam Hussein has been adapted for the stage and will be performed this week in the Iraqi National Theater's biggest ever production, officials said.

"Zabibah and the King," published over a year ago to rave reviews from the local press, is a tragic tale of a ruler who falls in love with an unhappily married woman.

The novel has been adapted by Palestinian-born poet Adeeb Nasir.

"It took me one year to read the epic novel...but I made it into a play in 15 days," Nasir was quoted as saying.

The heroine Zabibah, who separates from her husband but refuses to marry the king, is raped on January 17 — the same day U.S.-led forces launched the 1991 offensive that drove Iraq out of Kuwait.

The king dies after capturing the rapists and avenging Zabibah's honor.

Saudi Telethon Raises \$55 Million for Palestinians

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia — Saudi Arabia raised more than \$55 million for Palestinians in a government-organized telethon. Half of the money came from a prince whose donation for victims of the Sept. 11 attacks was rejected last fall by then-New York Mayor Rudolph Giuliani.

Billionaire investor Prince Alwaleed Bin Talal donated \$27 million to the fund. An hour before the end of the 11-hour telethon, the committee had collected a total of \$56.7 million, the daily *Arab News* reported.

In October, Giuliani first accepted a check for \$10 million from Alwaleed for a New York relief fund, then returned it when he learned about Alwaleed's statement calling on the United States to "re-examine its policies in the Middle East and adopt a more balanced stance toward the Palestinian cause."

Saudis from all walks of life called during the telethon to pledge contributions to the fund-raising campaign ordered by King Fahd, with donations ranging from a princess' Rolls Royce to children's pocket change.

The event aimed to help relatives of "martyrs," a word that has been used by the Palestinians to refer to anyone killed by Israelis or in operations against Israel, including suicide bombers.

In the English-language *Arab News* on Friday, columnist Nourah Abdul Aziz al-Khereiji wrote that Arabs should do more than just donate money.

"Our people... demand a boycott of Israel and America," she said. "They want a jihad (holy war) in Palestine."

"You could supply arms to (Palestinians) and ignore arms being smuggled to them," she wrote. "In the end, a day will come when you will be convinced of the need for a physical jihad."

In the United Arab Emirates, a fund-raising campaign organized by the state-owned media company raised more than \$12.5 million within a few hours. Mobile phone messages were being sent urging users to participate.

A telethon Tuesday in Dubai, another of the seven emirates, raised more than \$35 million, and more than \$8.2 million was raised in the neighboring Gulf state of Qatar on Wednesday. ■



Arafat Smuggles In Chemical Weapons

RAMALLAH — Israeli military sources said documents and material found in the Ramallah office of PA Chairman Yasser Arafat point to weapons and material either sent or modified by Baghdad and Teheran. The weapons and material were apparently smuggled in Arafat's helicopter during his frequent trips abroad, the sources said.

The material found in Arafat's headquarters also raised the prospect that the PA is preparing to develop chemical weapons. The sources said the material confirms documents that referred to plans to research and develop biological and chemical weapons.

Among the weapons found in Arafat's compound were rocket-propelled launchers of Soviet origin, *Middle East Newline* reported.

The RPGs were modified by Iraq to increase their range. Iranian weapons were also found in the PA offices. The sources said these included Iranian-produced anti-tank rocket grenades.

The non-conventional material found in Arafat's headquarters included several liters of bromine. Bromine is highly volatile and poisonous and a small amount could kill people in a closed area.

The Israeli *Ma'ariv* daily reported on April 19 that Israeli forces found the bromine buried in a sandbox. The chemical was evacuated by the military's Technological and Logistics unit. ■

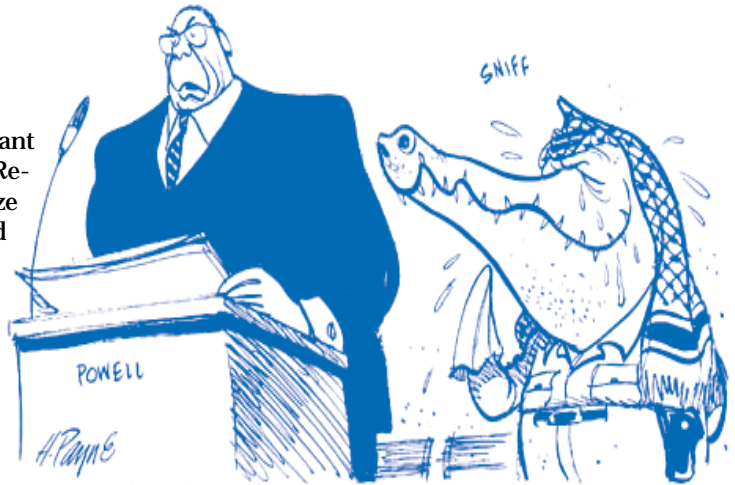

what extent, the Republican Party has become the "Pro-Israel party."

I don't want to discount what is a legitimately significant development in American politics. Historically, the Republican Party has always been more willing to criticize Israel from time to time. As the left becomes obsessed with identity politics, knee-jerk anti-Americanism and what I like to call the cult of the impoverished, Democrats are having a difficult time speaking with one voice in favor of Israel. Meanwhile, the right has become increasingly dominated by Evangelical Christians who — for religious and moral reasons — look with sympathy on Israel.

But, to the extent conservatives are disappointed with Bush's zig-zagging on Israel there's another motivation worth noting: The war on terrorism doesn't make sense if Yasser Arafat isn't a terrorist. There's vastly more evidence that Yasser Arafat is a terrorist than there is against Osama bin Laden. Don't get me wrong, I think there's more than enough evidence against bin Laden, but Arafat has been killing innocent people around the globe for decades, from the Munich Olympics to the most recent suicide bombing.

Even if you believe every single excuse, alibi and apology made in Arafat's behalf, he still qualifies as a terrorist according to the Bush doctrine because Arafat has given aid and comfort to terrorists. According to Bush, if you harbor a terrorist, you are a terrorist. TV footage from Arafat's bunker in recent weeks showed Arafat's inner circle to include known terrorists, including the men responsible for killing an Israeli Cabinet minister.

You don't have to be "pro-Israel" to understand this point. When presidents get caught bending core principles, they disappoint core supporters. (Bill Clinton seems to be an odd exception to this rule, for reasons too lengthy to get into here.)

Bush's stumble doesn't rise to the level of his father's "no new taxes" blunder, but it does reveal the fundamental problem with declaring a war on terrorism — as opposed to, say, Islamic fanaticism or anti-American terrorism or some such.

Terrorism isn't an "ism" like communism or fascism. It is a tactic. Declaring war on a tactic makes sense only if you are willing to follow such convictions wherever they take you.

But if terrorism becomes just another irrelevant "label" whenever your convictions become inconvenient, you're going to get yourself into trouble with the people who took you seriously. ■

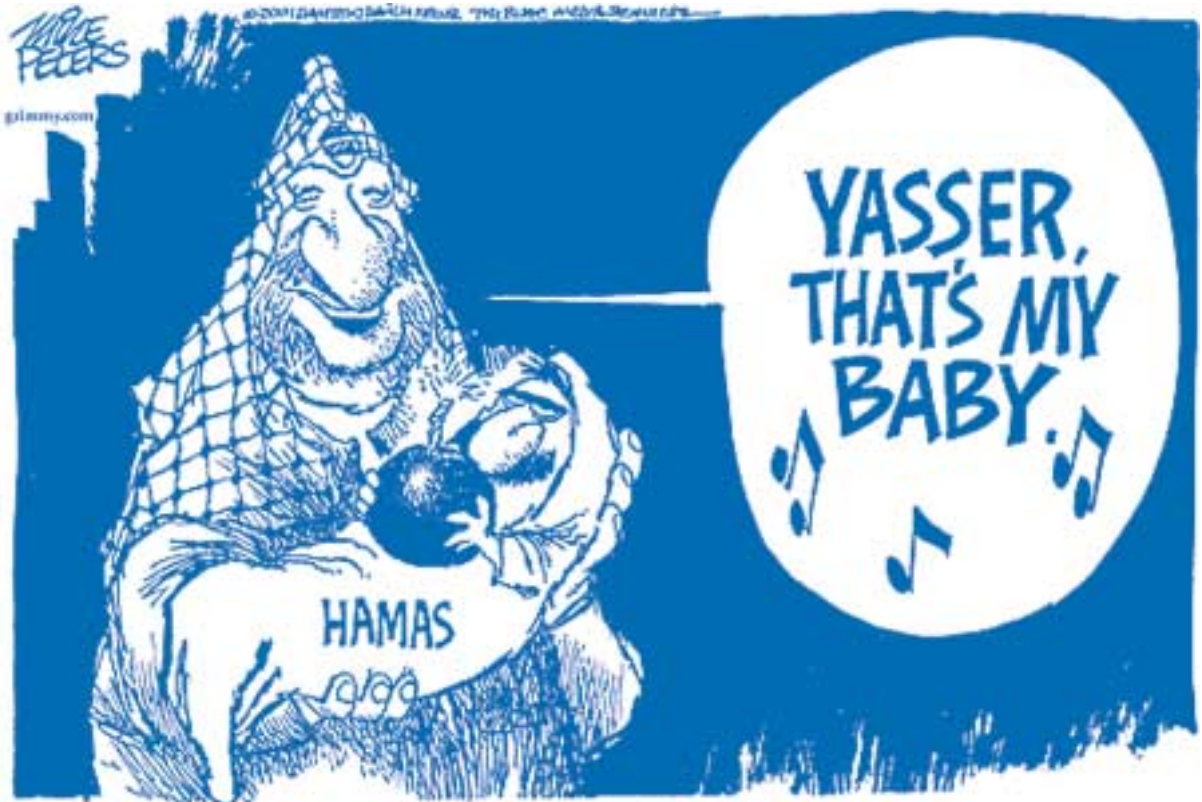

1917 – Balfour (Biblical scholar, Pre-Millennialist, friend of Zionist Chaim Weizman) issues Balfour Declaration, which guarantees homeland for Jews in “Palestine”

1917 – Beginning of Russian immigration to the Land

1920 – Oil becomes major source of energy; huge reserves in Arab countries, a provision by God to accommodate the sons of Ishmael as they accommodate the sons of Israel

SCP: 1917 – Publication in Russia of the anti-Jewish *Protocols of the Elders of Zion*

1917 – Lawrence of Arabia leads Arabs to take Damascus, beginning of pro-Arab faction in England



1921 – Hitler writes *Mein Kampf*, blaming WW I on the Jews, plans the “Final Solution of the Jewish Problem”

1924 – Henry Ford republishes and distributes the anti-Jewish *Protocols of the Elders of Zion*

1933 – Rise of Nazis in Germany and anti-Zionism in Arabic Islam

1945 – WW II, systematic destruction of 7,000,000 Jews in Europe; Hitler wishes he had played the “Arab card” sooner

GP: 1947 – “Exodus” refugee ship event, Declaration of Israeli independence; UN, U.S. recognition of State of Israel

1948 – Israel’s War of Independence, defeat of Arab armies against great odds (divided Jerusalem, Mandelbaum Gate, destruction of Jewish sites)

1956 – Gulf of Suez War; Israel temporarily takes Sinai

SCP: 1967 – Pan-Arab invasion of Israel under Nasser to destroy Israel & Zionism

GP: 1967 – Six-Day War, Israel defeats Egypt, Jordan and Syria, extends defensible borders, captures Jerusalem’s Old City and Temple Mount; rise of strong support for Israel among American Jews and evangelical Christians

SCP: 1987 – Intifada: Having failed to destroy Israel in several conventional wars, the Arab/Islamic coalition decides to use the Intifada approach, employing riots and terrorism to accomplish the destruction of Israel, resulting in the Oslo Accords and the “Peace Process,” beginning in 1993.

1993 – “Progressive Dispensationalism” begins to be taught in formerly strong Dispensational Bible schools and seminaries, undermining the previous support for Israel and anticipation of the Rapture among evangelical Christians

GP: 1997 – Israel, disappointed in the realities of the “Peace Process,” takes steps to stop Palestinian terrorism, slows down the process with the election of Netanyahu, offers the olive branch with Barak, and cracks down with Sharon, all with the general support of the U.S.

SCP: 2001 – The Arab/Islamic extremists (frustrated with the U.S. support of Israel, maintaining a military presence in the Middle East) orchestrate a

huge terrorist attack on New York and Washington, D.C.

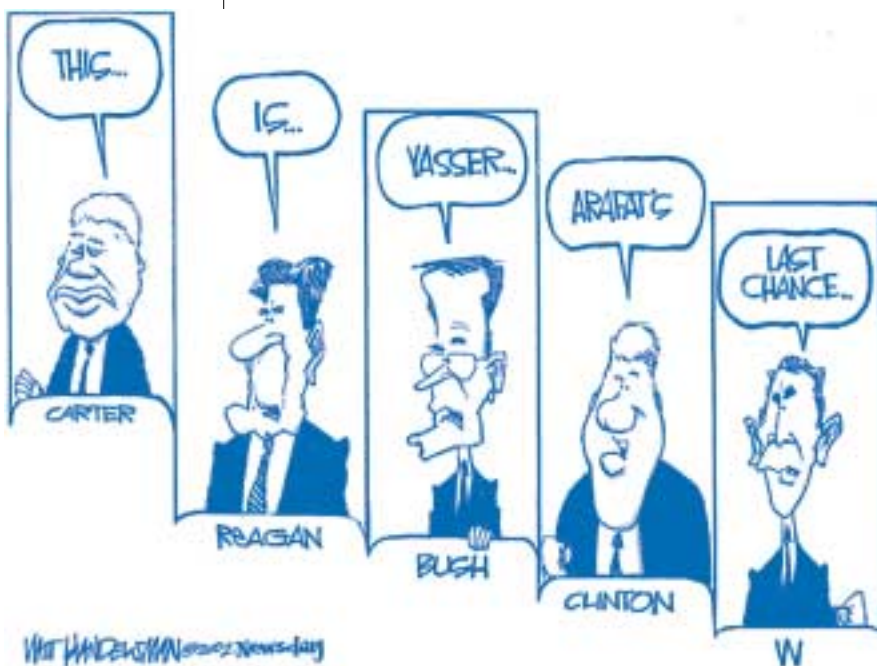

SCP: 2002 – Islamic terrorist organizations intensify efforts to destabilize Israel with attacks on civilians in numerous cities over the Passover and Easter week

GP: 2002 – Israel’s Sharon deploys tanks and special forces units throughout the Palestinian-controlled areas in order to root out terrorists and preserve the security and existence of Israel, with tacit US approval

While secular historians concentrate on the rise and fall of great nations, their armies and geopolitical strategies, the Bible concentrates on the history and vicissitudes of the covenant nation Israel, and the spreading of the gospel of Christ through local churches to individuals throughout the world. War Crimes Lie

The Palestinian big lie against Israel keeps shifting as the truth emerges.

The first big lie was that the Israelis had perpetrated a massacre in Jenin, killing more than 500 people and then stashing them in mass graves. Then, as aid workers and journalists uncovered no evidence of mass graves, the lie was that the Israelis had secretly transported the dead bodies in refrigerated trucks.

Now it's that the Israelis have violated international law relating to war. According to the BBC on Thursday, "International officials say some actions by [Israel's] troops, there and elsewhere, would appear to have breached the Fourth Geneva Convention relating to the protection of civilians in war or under occupation."

Why? Well, "the convention forbids violence being used against civilians, as well as inhumane or degrading treatment.... It is claimed that civilians died in Jenin when their houses were demolished. The convention prohibits the destruction of property except where military operations make it absolutely necessary." Lies. Lies, lies, lies. Damnable, outrageous, unseemly lies.

The simple truth is this: International law relating to the conduct of the incursion exculpates the Israelis and convicts the Palestinian Authority. Period.

The Israelis went into Jenin and made a systematic search for bomb laboratories and terror cells that had been hidden among civilians. The purpose was to destroy the laboratories and take prisoner or kill those who had been building the suicide bombs and directing the suicide attacks.

The Palestinian intifada describes itself as an armed struggle, an uprising. The word that describes the leaders and planners of such an armed struggle, in legal parlance, is "combatants."

And international law could not be any more plain. On June 8, 1977, the Fourth Geneva Convention was updated. The document is called "Protocol Additional to the Geneva Conventions of 12 August 1949, and relating to the Protection of Victims of International Armed Conflicts."

Article 37 outlaws the use of civilian populations as a shield for military actions. It explicitly prohibits "the feigning of civilian, noncombatant status; and the feigning of protected status by the use of signs, emblems or uniforms of the United Nations or of neutral or other

States not Parties to the conflict."

What the leaders of the Al Aqsa Martyrs Brigade, Hamas and Islamic Jihad do is hide among civilian populations to make it as difficult as possible for their enemies to attack them. The Geneva Convention denounces this as "perfidy."

Peter Bouckaert, a researcher at Human Rights Watch in New York who sneaked into Jenin on Thursday, told the *Washington Post*, "It's been incredibly difficult to tell the difference between fighters and civilians. If a combatant uses the civilian population as a shield in this way, the deaths incurred are the moral and legal responsibility of those who are hiding out in this grotesquely cowardly fashion."

Previously, Palestinians and their apologists had claimed the Israelis were violating the Fourth Geneva Convention by refusing to allow ambulances operated by the Red Crescent Society to move freely between Israeli hospitals and the West Bank towns in which the incursions were taking place.

Article 38 specifically addresses the ambulance issue: "It is prohibited to make improper use of the distinctive emblem of the red cross, red crescent or red lion and sun." And yet this is precisely what the Palestinians have done. The Israelis have stopped and searched ambulances emblazoned with the Red Crescent and found suicide belts hidden in them. One of these incidents, on March 27, was captured on videotape.

By using this internationally accepted symbol as a diversionary tactic — in essence turning ambulances into tanks — the Palestinians thus bear the moral and legal responsibility under international law for the Israeli refusal to allow the free conduct of Red Crescent vehicles.

The violators of international law — the criminals in this war — are the Palestinians who devised these shameful tactics. ■

Dear Friends:

When the Apostle Peter stood up before a multi-national Jewish audience on the day of Pentecost, he proclaimed that they were the special recipients of divine promises fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. In Germany, the police announced, and then retracted, that Jews ought not to wear any clothing or symbols that identify them as Jews!

Friends, this is just the beginning, and it has not escaped the United States. Take a look at this recent let-

ter published in *USA Today*:

In 1974 I witnessed the poverty and hopelessness of the Palestinian refugees firsthand when visiting their camps in the Middle East. Life there surely has only gotten worse as the years have passed.

The orgy of violence on all sides will continue until we persuade our congressional leaders to permanently stop all U.S. military aid to Israel.

The blood is on our hands: We pay the taxes that buy the bombs and bullets that kill the people on both sides of the conflict. Israeli revenge begets Palestinian revenge, and so it goes. Israel continues to kill Palestinians by the hundreds and steal Palestinian lands. Israel should be partitioned and the land returned to the Palestinians.

In the first place, those refugee camps were set up by the United Nations, not by Israel. Another failed mission by UN social services!

Secondly, the Arab world prefers the Palestinians to remain in the camps. Nonsense, you say? If the Arab nations really wanted the Palestinians to have land to settle in, they would have already carved out a portion of their vast real estate holdings in the Middle East for them. Each time the Palestinians have camped out with their Arab brothers, they've caused



trouble and been deported. The Palestinians are not liked or wanted by any other Arab state.

And to portray all the Palestinians as poor refugees is deceitful. Some of them are wildly rich and live in stone mansions that line the seashore.

Third, the United States sells weapons to many nations, including Israel, Egypt, Saudi Arabia, etc. Furthermore, the Israelis do not use — never have used — bombs against the Palestinians. On the other hand, Arafat does, by the shipload sometimes, which he purchases from Iran.

The “orgy of violence” the writer suggests parrots the myth of moral equivalence in the conflict. I wonder if this person also objects to the United States responding rather violently (using a great deal of bombs and

bullets) to the suicide bombers who brought down the World Trade Center and killed over 3,000 innocent men, women and children? We did this on foreign

soil. And we're about to attack another sovereign power — Iraq — in a violent manner.

Finally, the letter above speaks of Israel stealing Palestinian land. Never in all of history did the Arabs living on that soil ever own that land. It belongs to Israel, Biblically and historically. In fact, in 1947, the UN partitioned the land, giving Israel part of it and

the Arabs part of it. The Jewish people said, "Thank you," while the Arabs said, "No, we want all or nothing," and attacked Israel. Ehud Barak offered then the land again in 2000, but Arafat refused it and began sending teenagers and young people to kill themselves and as many Jews as they could.

If it weren't for the suicide bombings, Israel would not enter the Palestinian areas.

To be fair to *USA Today* and the coverage they've given the issue, at least among the letters they receive, let me show you another response from a reader. My comments are in brackets.

We have all heard for decades that the Israeli settlers are the major obstacle to peace. In fact, it is now taken as a given by many people around the world.

No one seems to care that these Jewish settlers are living on historically Jewish lands. They have a right to be there as much as the Arab settlers [They have much more right to live there than the Arabs], the majority of whom also migrated to the West Bank as recently as a few generations ago [Since 1948, actually, going there to get good-paying jobs in a democracy].

Even Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat and his family are settlers there, having come in the 1930s from Egypt, where Arafat lived until 1958. [Arafat is constantly lying about his background, tearfully recounting his childhood in Jerusalem. Baloney!]

There are about 1 million Arabs in Israel proper. No one is suggesting that they be removed. They live in freedom under Israeli sovereignty. Why can't thousands of Jews also live in peace among Arabs in a future sovereign Palestinian state? [Jews can live nowhere in the

entire Arab world without grave problems, while Arabs can become citizens of Israel, obtain great wealth in business and even be elected to the Knesset.]

Is the Arab murderous rage so great that this proposed Jewish minority of co-citizens needs to be removed for its own safety? [Yes!]

If that is the case, what hope is there for a future peace? [None!]

These Jewish settlers, if they are willing to live in a proposed Palestinian state, should be allowed to do so. They have as much right to live there as anyone else. [But they'll all be shot the day the state is established.]

Those Jewish settlers represent, in reality, "the canary in the coal mine," as far as a true Middle East peace between Jews and Arabs is concerned. [My friend, the canary is already dead!]

What options do the Israelis have? And what will result from each choice they make?

Option one is to accept the peace treaty and allow a Palestinian state to be established. Israel will be pushed back to pre-1967 borders and the Arabs will have an internationally recognized home from which to launch a more vigorous campaign to annihilate the Jews. With their backs to the sea, the use of nuclear weapons may be their only defense. Doing so to protect themselves from an Arab invasion will likely bring the entire world against the Chosen People and make way for the Antichrist to step in.

Option two is to resist the false peace offered by the Arab world in



order to stave off the scenario of the first option. However, refusing to make peace may in fact speed up an invasion by the Arab nations while the international community turns its head. Again, this may very well usher in the Antichrist and the Tribulation.

The world is heating up and our focus remains on Israel, which more than New York, sits prophetically at "ground zero" (I elaborate on this in an upcoming book entitled *Prophecy at Ground Zero*). Crown Prince Abdullah's visit to President Bush in April signaled a warning from Arabs: Back off of your support for Israel or risk adverse relations with the entire Arab population.

This visit, by the way, coincided with a Saudi TV ad campaign in the U.S. in which they try to convince you and me that they're not so bad after all. Not like those 15 Saudis who killed over 3,000 men, women and children on September 11. Not like the

Saudi born and bred Osama bin Laden. Not like the Prince's relative who recently donated \$27 million to the families of Palestinian suicide bombers during a 3-day government sponsored telethon.

So the diplomatic double-talk continues from our politicians, who will sacrifice Israel for the sake of drumming up Arab support for our attack on Saddam Hussein. And the media, slurping up Arab oil money, continues to fund large contingencies of

Dear Mr. Levitt:

On behalf of President Bush, thank you for your letter about the conflict in the Middle East. The President appreciates hearing from you and welcomes your views and suggestions.

President Bush strongly condemns the recent acts of murder that killed innocent people in Israel. He believes that Chairman Arafat and the Palestinian Authority must find and arrest those responsible for these acts of terror. They must also act swiftly and decisively against the organizations that support them.

The tragic cycle of incitement, provocation, and violence has gone on far too long. The President supports an approach to peace that includes building a stable foundation for restoring confidence, rebuilding security cooperation, and resuming a political dialogue between the parties.

The idea of a Palestinian state has always been part of the President's vision for peace in the Middle East, as long as Israel's right to exist is respected. Israelis and Palestinians themselves have identified the creation of a Palestinian state as the likely outcome of the negotiations process. Our objective now, however, must be to end the violence between the parties. The administration remains intensively involved in this effort.

Tools to rebuild confidence and revive a political process are available in the security work plan negotiated by CIA Director George Tenet and the Mitchell Committee report, which both the Government of Israel and the Palestinian Authority have accepted. These steps offer Israelis and Palestinians a roadmap to a cease-fire and an end to the violence. A lasting peace will come only when parties agree directly on such terms.

Though long in coming, I was glad to finally receive a response from the White House. It saddens me, however, to read the same political rhetoric and diplomatic double-talk that I can find in the papers or at a press conference.



Some letters have been edited for space.

The fact is that the White House has been pursuing its own retaliatory strikes at the cost of continued, unashamed support of the only democracy in the region, Israel. When

suicide bombers struck New York and Washington, D.C., we were *incited* and *provoked* into a military response (a rather *violent* response, since many were killed in Afghanistan) against those who were involved in crossing our borders and killing our innocent men, women, and children. And our strategy of responding to terror includes more violence, namely, attacking Iraq and finishing off Saddam. In the process, U.S. forces will kill more terrorists and those who direct their activities. 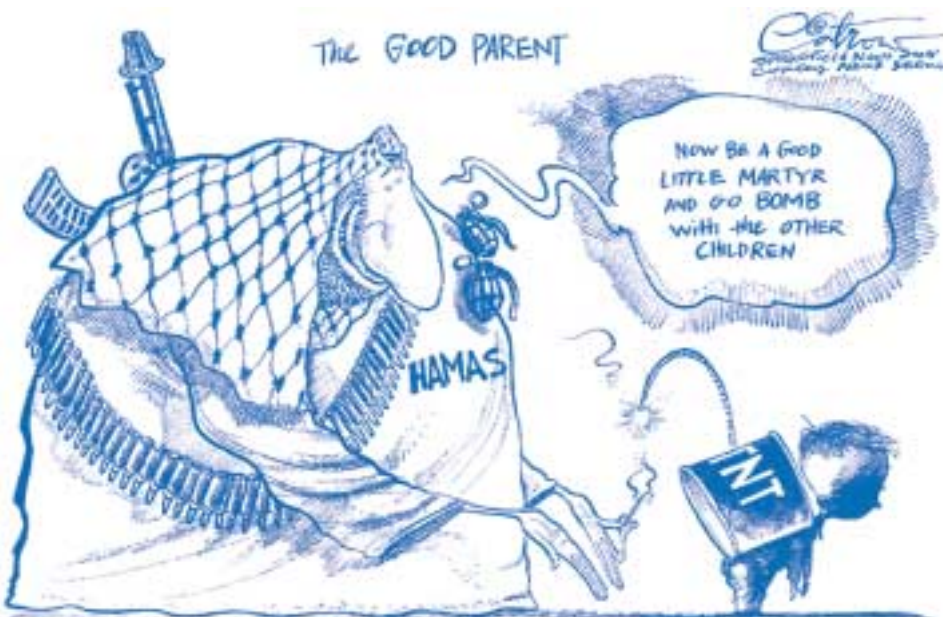

To The Jew First

Once again Zola Levitt Ministries and Shalom, Shalom Messianic Congregation commissioned and sent Kevin Parker and me to Israel to bring the hope, peace, and love of Y'shua the Messiah to the Chosen People. This was our third consecutive Gospel outreach to them.

Our encounters with the Israelis found them particularly open and receptive to our message of support and love based on the Scriptures about God's divine plan and program for the Jewish people, who find completion in the first and second comings of the Messiah.

In the wake of terrorist attacks and international censure by the media and pro-Palestinian governments, the Israelis we met eagerly listened to the message of redemption, victory, and restoration for Israel. In a time when most Jews in Israel feel hopeless, misunderstood, abandoned by the world, and betrayed in some measure by America's incoherent and duplicitous Mid-East policy, God's Spirit worked through us to reassure them they are not alone. Below are a few of the many experiences we had in taking the Jewish Gospel to the Jewish people in Israel.

In Tel Aviv we walked the streets, visited the cafes (one of which was bombed a few days later by a suicide bomber), and stopped in the shops, encouraging the Jewish people from the Scriptures that God has not forsaken them (Isaiah 49:14-16). One Jewish man we spoke with was the owner of an Internet cafe. In our witness to him, we plunged into a deep discussion of what Bible prophecy says about the Messiah and His relationship to Israel, covered topics like the regathering of Israel, the future war of Gog and Magog as predicted in Ezekiel 38-39, and the return of the Messiah. He was open and interested in the evidence from the Tenach (Old Testament) that proved Y'shua (Jesus) was the prophesied Messiah. The Holy Spirit no doubt had prepared this man's heart for our preaching. He gratefully received, and even enthusiastically anticipated, our giving him a Hebrew New Testament (Brit Hadasha) and a Messianic Jewish tract that lays out the steps to salvation. As we were leaving, the man's parting yet memorable remark to us was: "Thank you for bringing me the light." How correct he was! Jesus said in John 9:5, "I am the light of the world."

After four days in Tel Aviv we drove to the Galilee to begin our outreach there. One day while we witnessed and passed out Gospel tracts, three Jewish children came

over to us and wanted to play. Little did Kevin and I realize that these seven-year-old children (triplets — two boys and one girl) would be instrumental in opening the door for us to minister the Gospel to the entire family for three days. "And a child shall lead them" (Isaiah 11:6). We became close almost immediately, so much so that they invited us to stay with them when we return in September. We spent the entire time discussing the divine calling and plan of God for Israel as revealed in the Bible and how this fits with the current crisis in Israel (see Deut 4:28-30; Ezek. 35; Ps. 83; Zech. 12-14). They read with amazement from the Scriptures how all this was foretold long ago, and how it is being fulfilled up to the present time.

We reasoned with them that if the prophecies of Israel's history are true and have literally been fulfilled, the many prophecies about the Messiah were also true and have been literally fulfilled as well. This was the warp and woof of our witness in all of Israel. We pointed to the prophecies that pertain to the first coming of the Messiah in the Tenach, and then pointed to their exact fulfillment by Jesus in the Brit Hadasha. These dear friends made the obvious connection and understood quite clearly from their own Scriptures why we believe Jesus is the Jewish Messiah.

Through our witness of the Gospel both in love and in the spoken word, this family has adopted Kevin and me as life-long friends. We believe it is only a matter of time before they become a household of believers in Y'shua (Acts 16:31, 34). We ask Zola's readers to fervently pray to that end as our witness continues with this precious family.



A few days later we ventured into Tiberias during the evening and decided to eat at one of the restaurants, eventually striking up a conversation with the owner's son. He was a Jewish man of twenty-three years and had lived in New York City. He told us he worked a block and a half away from the World Trade Center and was a personal eyewitness of what happened on 9-11. He was still suffering from posttraumatic stress. He knew he had to return home — to Israel. He revealed to us later that he had also been taking narcotics and felt tormented and controlled by an evil spirit! We explained to him that there was a battle going on for his soul between God and Satan, and that only the power of Messiah could set him

free. Kevin and I then demonstrated to him out of the Jewish Scriptures from the Hebrew text that Jesus was indeed the prophesied Messiah of Israel who came to set humanity free from the captivity of sin (John 8:34-36). After looking at a few of the prophecies for himself, he exclaimed, "Y'shua really is the Messiah!"

The young man became teary-eyed and prayed with us to accept Y'shua into his heart as Lord, Savior and Messiah. Afterwards his face glowed with the peace, joy and relief that only the Prince of Peace can give. He is now a new creation, a completed Jew born anew and delivered from the power of darkness, translated into the kingdom of God's beloved Son (Colossians 1:13). What a thrill it is to harvest souls for our Lord!

From Tiberias we journeyed to Jerusalem to conclude our ministry there. While staying at Kibbutz Tzuba, the Lord allowed us to minister restoration to a backslidden Jewish believer who had been a pioneer of the Messianic movement in the 1970s. At first he was guarded and distant. But after two days with him the walls came down. He too was on the verge of tears as we extended God's grace and comfort to him and helped to relieve him from the heavy burden that was on his shoulders (Galatians 6:1-2).

On Good Friday, as Kevin and I were coming from Golgotha (the place where Jesus was crucified) we ran into three young orthodox Jewish men in the Armenian quarter as they were headed for prayer at the Western Wall. Our witness to them naturally focused on why Jesus is the Messiah of Israel. We talked about what the rabbis called in Hebrew the "Chevlei Ha Mashiach" (the birth pangs of the Messiah) as the time of the Great Tribulation for Israel, accompanied by certain cosmic signs (apostasy, false Messiahs, wars, earthquakes, famines, pestilences, etc.) that serve as guideposts for the soon return of the Messiah (see Matthew 24). We told them that what Israel and Jerusalem are going through now is a prelude to those future events that indicate the fact that the Messiah is coming soon (Zech. 14:1-3; Jer. 25:15-38; Ps. 83; Joel 3:1-2).

They listened as Kevin and I recited the major Messianic prophecies that mark and identify who the Messiah would be when He came and how the life of Jesus of Nazareth was the only One who could have possibly fulfilled these prophecies as the Messiah. They expressed sincere interest and took Gospel tracts from us and said they would study further what we shared with them.

Truly this Gospel outreach and others like it in the Church are fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah 62:10-12! Here we have an amazing prophecy that says God will send Gentile believers to Jerusalem "from the ends of the earth" to proclaim to the Jewish inhabitants of

Jerusalem that the Savior is coming to redeem and rescue them. These ambassadors of Messiah Jesus will prepare (perhaps like John the Baptist did when he prepared the way for the first coming of Jesus to Israel, Isaiah 40:3; Matthew 3:3) the way for His soon return that is described and predicted in the opening chapter of Isaiah 63.

Lord willing, in this vein we will resume our outreach to Israel in September 2002 during the Feasts of Trumpets and Tabernacles as God provides and empowers us by His Spirit to do so. Amen. ■

Arafat's thugs don't murder only Jews.

Israeli actions in cities like Jenin, we keep hearing, are only creating a whole new generation of suicide bombers. But as we learn whether the deaths there number in the hundreds or dozens, other news reports shed light on the radicalization of the Palestinians. To wit:

April 7: GAZA CITY, Gaza Strip (AP) — In a secret session before dawn Sunday, a Palestinian military court sentenced six Palestinians to death for collaborating with Israel, Palestinian security officials said.... Palestinian leader Yasser Arafat must approve the death sentences before they can be carried out. Some 40 similar sentences await Arafat's approval.

April 5: RAMALLAH, West Bank (Reuters) — Masked Palestinian gunmen shot dead three men suspected of collaborating with Israeli forces in their West Bank village of Toubas...Friday, Palestinian sources said.

April 1: NABLUS, West Bank (AP) — In the West Bank town of Tulkarem, gunmen from the Al-Aqsa Martyrs Brigade entered an apartment where seven suspected collaborators were being held by military intelligence Monday, the officials said. The gunmen took the prisoners into the street and shot them, leaving their bodies behind, the security sources said....

In Qalqilya...the bodies of Iyad Abu Ishab, 20, and Walid Radwan, 22, were found riddled with bullets in a side street Monday. Palestinian security sources said the two men, who had been arrested on charges of collaboration more than a year ago, were killed by their prison guards....

The body of Mahmood Rahamie, 21, was found in Bethlehem near Manger Square, the traditional birthplace of Jesus. The Al-Aqsa Brigade, which is close to... Arafat's Fatah movement, said in a statement that Rahamie had been killed after he was caught sending information to the Israelis through the Internet and e-mail.

March 15: NABLUS, West Bank (Reuters) — A group linked to Palestinian President Yasser Arafat's Fatah faction said it executed two alleged Palestinian collaborators Friday in the West Bank city of Nablus.

March 14: BETHLEHEM, West Bank (AP) — Palestinian militiamen shot dead two alleged collaborators with Israel on Thursday, then tied the body of one to the back of a pickup truck, dragged him through town and attempted to hang him from a rooftop overlooking the traditional birthplace of Christ.

March 12: RAMALLAH, West Bank (AP) — In a grim warning, the blood-streaked body of a Palestinian shot to death for allegedly collaborating with Israel was strung up by the ankles Tuesday in the middle of this West Bank city. Raed Naem Odeh was left dangling in a traffic circle downtown.

It may be that some of these victims were guilty, from a certain perspective, of treason. But the summary executions have certainly had the effect of silencing all voices of dissent. But then, this is nothing new.

Haj Amin al-Husseini, the mufti of Jerusalem and Arab leader during the British mandate in Palestine, killed many Palestinians inclined to tolerate a Jewish presence in the region. In 1967, after Israel captured the West Bank in the Six Day War, Yasser Arafat's Fatah brought back the practice. During the uprising in the late 1980s, some 800 "collaborators" were murdered, many of them simply Palestinians who had prospered under Israeli occupation.

After the 1993 Oslo accords gave him a statelet, Mr. Arafat quickly set about criminalizing "collaboration" — most famously with a law making the sale of land to Jews punishable by death. But those who get a trial are the lucky ones. Seven decades of "collaborator" killings have silenced or driven out many who would be open to co-existence with Israel.

It's yet one more reason to believe there will never be peace so long as the dictator and his brownshirts run Gaza and the West Bank. ■

Hebrew Lesson

The Tenach

The Hebrew Bible is called the *Tenach* (sometimes spelled *TeNaK* or *Tenakh* in English), an acronym for *Torah*, *Nevi'im*, and *Ketuvim*. The Tenach is divided into three main sections, as follows:

DIVISION	HEBREW	MAJOR ELEMENTS
<i>Torah</i>	תּוֹרָה	The first five books of Moses. The actual Torah itself is referred to as the <i>Sefer Torah</i> , or sacred Torah scroll. The <i>Chumash</i> is a book form of the <i>Torah</i> , usually divided by weekly Torah readings (called <i>parshiot</i>). The word <i>Torah</i> is better understood as teaching or understanding rather than law.
<i>Prophets</i> (<i>Nevi'im</i>)	נְבִיאִים	The Hebrew prophetic books are subdivided into two major parts: Four books of the “earlier” prophets and 15 books of the “later” prophets. Weekly readings are called <i>haftarah portions</i> .
<i>Writings</i> (<i>Ketuvim</i>)	כְּתוּבִים	Assorted sacred writings, including Psalms, Proverbs, and some historical books. There are 12 books in this division of the Tenach.

Notes:

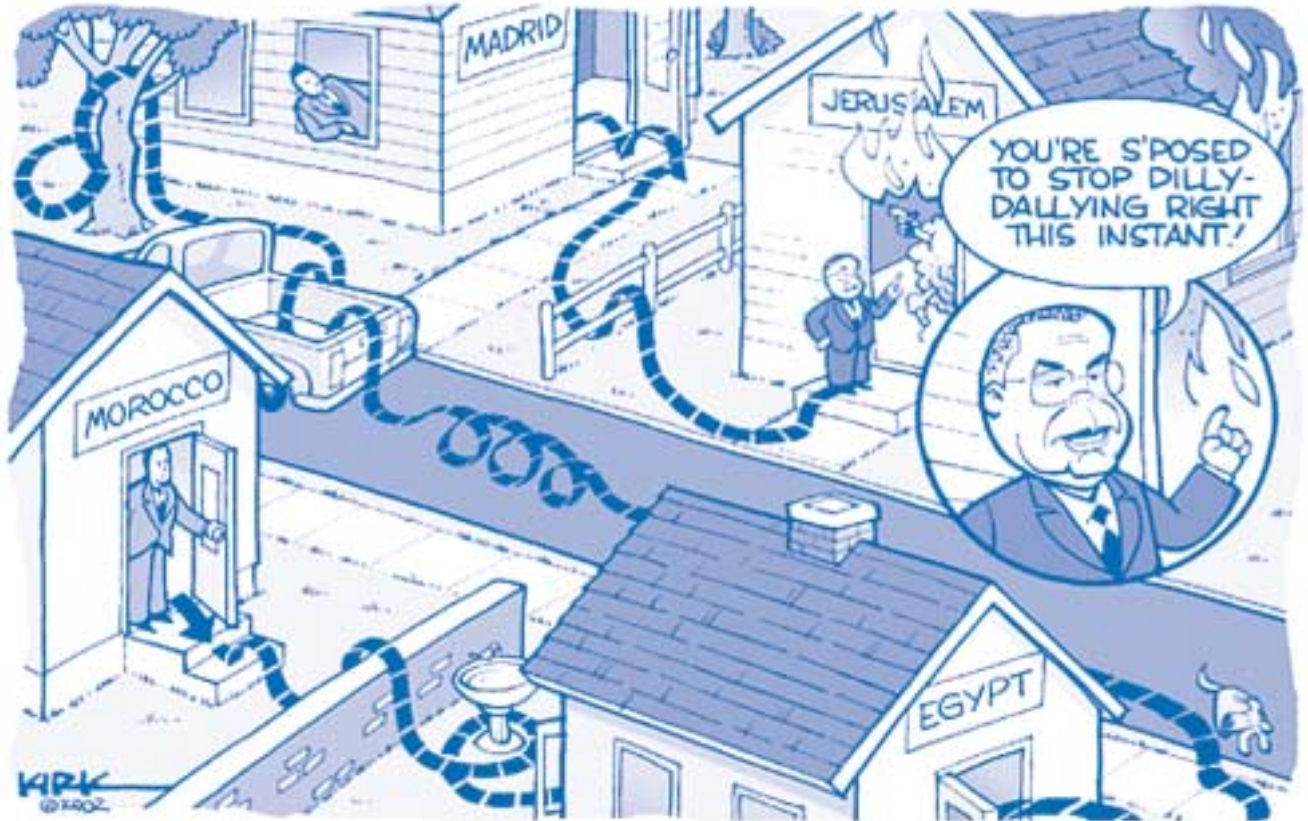
- Many Jews refer to the entire Hebrew Bible (i.e., the *Tenach*) simply as the *Torah*—without making the distinction of the divisions shown above.
- Though the Christian *Old Testament* is the result of the canonization of the Jewish scriptures, the order of the books in the Tenach is not identical to the Christian Old Testament (though all of the same content is present).
- Chapter and verse references are not always identical between the Old Testament and the Tenach.

Did you know?

The written *Torah* of Moses is called the *Sefer Torah*, or Torah Scroll, and is the most sacred object of Jewish life. The *Sefer Torah* is meticulously hand-written in Hebrew calligraphy with *tagin* (“crowns”) on kosher parchment (this style of writing is known as STA”M). You are not supposed to directly touch a *Sefer Torah*, but use a *yad* (pointer) instead. Torah scrolls are kept covered with fabric and are often ornamented with silver crowns on the handles of the scrolls and a silver breastplate on the front – adorned, in fact, like the high priest described in Leviticus. Torah scrolls are kept in a special cabinet in the synagogue called an “ark” (an acrostic of “aron kodesh,” meaning “holy cabinet”).

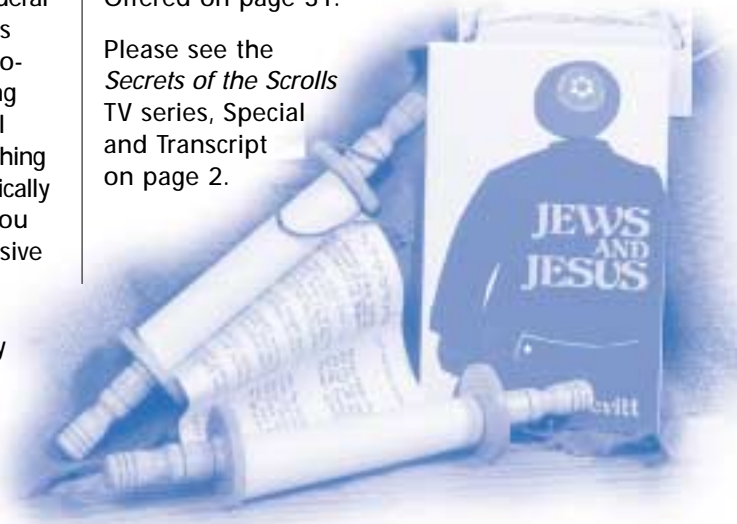
