Beauty Pageants Can Be Murder

Inasmuch as liberals are demanding that Americans ritualistically proclaim, “Islam is a religion of peace,” Muslims might do their part by not killing people all the time.

Covenants of God Video Series, Music Tape and CD

The president of Nigeria, Olusegun Obasanjo, tried to downplay the Muslims' murderous rampage by cheerfully explaining:



"The beauty queens should not feel that they are the cause of the violence. It could happen at any time irresponsible journalism is committed against Islam." Well, that's a relief.

It seems an article in a Nigerian newspaper had mused that the Prophet Muhammad "would probably have chosen a wife" from among the Miss World contestants. This upset the practitioners of the Religion of Peace, whose polygamous prophet preferred his wives a little younger—one was 6 years old.

They expressed their displeasure with the article by bludgeoning, stabbing and burning Christians to death. In one part of Nigeria, enforcers of the Religion of Peace commanded that Muslims kill Isioma Daniel, the authoress of the blasphemy. (Overheard at Miss World contest: "Does this make me look fatwa?")

The *New York Times* can't bear to think that their little darlings—angry, violent Muslims—could be at fault in this melee. That makes no sense because Islam is a Religion of Peace. So the *Times* reviewed the facts, processed it through the PC prism, and spat out the headline: "Religious Violence in Nigeria Drives Out Miss World Event." According to the *Times*, rampaging Muslims pouring out of mosques to kill Christians and torch churches resulted from "the tinderbox of religious passions in the country."

Islam is peaceful, but religion causes violence. Pay no attention to the fact that the most bloodthirsty cult in the 20th century was an atheistic sect known as communism. But that was not "true communism," just as Muslim terrorists are not practicing "true Islam." The ironic thing is, liberals would hate Muslims who practiced only "true Islam." Without the terrorism, Muslims would just be an-

other group of "anti-choice" fanatics. But these are the good Muslims—the Mumia Muslims, not the Jerry Falwell Muslims. The police step in to try to quell violent Muslims and the *Times* reports this as "fighting between Christians and Muslims." Ah, the cycle of violence.

It would be as if a conservative newspaper, with no basis in fact, referred to all murderers as "environmentalists." Environmentalists Fly Planes Into World Trade Center; Environmentalists Rape Woman In Central Park.

Winning "Best in Show" was the *Times'* headline on an article about the Christian missionary shot dead in Lebanon by a Muslim: "Killing Underscores Enmity of Evangelists and Muslims." This is like referring to the enmity between a woman and her rapist. She hates him, he hates her. It's a cycle of violence! Except the funny thing about the Christians is, they still love the Muslims.

The Muslims' main beef with the Christians was that they "destroy the fighting spirit of the children, especially of the Palestinian youth, by teaching them not to fight the Jews, for the Palestinians to forgive the Jews and leave them Jerusalem." No new data are capable of shaking the *Times'* faith that Islam is a religion of peace and Christians, as a general matter, deserve to be shot.

The *Times* seemed to agree the Muslims had a point with the evangelicals. In a news analysis, the *Times* said the missionaries claimed they were merely exposing people to Jesus Christ. "But," the *Times* charged in a "j'accuse" tone, "a somewhat more direct goal emerges amid the Web site postings." They were asking for it. (On the bright side, at least this means the *Times* is holding the gun innocent in this one instance.) The Christians were caught red-handed committing irresponsible Web postings against Islam.

Fortunately, Christians do not rip

out people's entrails in response to irresponsible journalism committed against Christianity. ■

I think most Americans and most non-Israelis draw certain mental pictures when they hear this term. I know I did before I began visiting "settlements" in Israel. I discovered they were not armed camps. They were not frontier outposts in alien territory. They were not fortresses built to grab more land for Jews. No. Much to my surprise, I found these "settlements" to be nothing more than communities—peaceful Jewish communities that don't interfere with nor abrogate anyone else's rights. They reminded me of suburban developments in Southern California more than threats to peace.

The word "settlement" itself is loaded. Who is a "settler" in the Mideast? According to the Arabs, only Jews are "settlers." But that simply is not the case.

Arafat himself was born in Egypt. He later moved to Jerusalem. If, at the moment, he is living in the West Bank, he is a "settler" there, not a native. Indeed, most of the Arabs living within the borders of Israel today have come from some other Arab country at some time in their life. They are all "settlers."

For instance, just since the beginning of the Oslo Accords, hundreds of thousands of Arabs have entered the West Bank or Gaza—and never left. They have come from Jordan, Egypt and, indirectly, from every other Arab country you can name—and many non-Arab countries as well. These surely aren't "Palestinians."

Since 1967, the Arabs have built 261 settlements in the West Bank. We don't hear much about those settlements. We hear instead about the number of Jewish settlements that have been created.

"Crime Sells"

Did vengeful Americans unleash an orgy of anti-Muslim violence in the wake of 9-11? You'd think so to judge by the media coverage that followed the recent release of the FBI's 2001 hate-crimes report. Reality's another story.

First, the media version. "According to the FBI, hate crimes in America targeting Muslims or people who just appear to be Middle Eastern surged in the aftermath of 9-11," Dan Rather announced grimly. "There were 500 such hate-motivated attacks reported last year; the year before, just 28." Headlines in *The Washington Post* ("Hate Crimes Against Arabs Surge, FBI Says"), the *Los Angeles Times* ("Hate Crimes Against Muslims Soar, Report Says") and many other papers followed suit. The *Times* and many other outlets repeated the alarming figure that anti-Islamic crimes were up 1,600 percent.

...Though the percentage increase sounds dramatic, it doesn't represent very many actual crimes. The report found 481 anti-Muslim "incidents" (not 500 "attacks," as Rather claimed) involving 546 separate offenses.

More telling, though, is the kind of crimes the FBI found. Say "hate crimes" (much less "attacks") to most people and they think violence, a la Matthew Shepard or James Byrd. Yet the number of murders the report attributes to anti-Muslim sentiment is zero; the number of aggravated assaults, just 27.

So what were these crimes? By far the largest number (296) fell into the nebulous catchall category of "intimidation" — a category which the FBI doesn't use outside of hate-crimes reports. At worst, these are "low-level offenses," note New York University sociologists James Jacobs and Kimberly Potter in their book *Hate Crimes: Criminal Law and Identity Politics* (Oxford University Press, 1998) — "the ad hoc disputes, arguments and fights that frequently erupt in a multiracial, multiethnic, multi-religious society." Largely these offenses amount to talk, and in many states, it can mean no more than saying something someone else doesn't like. (A typical statute in Illinois defines it as "expos[ing] any person to hatred, contempt or ridicule.") Throw in the vandalism numbers (123) — graffiti and the like — and you've got most of the anti-Muslim offenses. Nasty? Yes. A crime wave? Hardly.

"Minority groups have good reasons for claiming that we are in the throes of an epidemic," Jacobs and Potter write. "An 'epidemic' demands attention, remedial actions, resources and reparations." As for the media, Jacobs and

Potter point out that while crime sells, it sells better if you add a dash of racism, sexism or homophobia. "Garden-variety crime has become mundane," they point out. "The law-and-order drama has to be revitalized if it is to command attention." ■

Palestinian TV: "Proud of Our Martyrs"

"If I see an Israeli, I will blow up among them."



Palestinian television broadcast an interview with a mother who prayed during a pilgrimage to Mecca that her son would die fighting against Israel. The mother also launched into a warning to Israelis, expressing her desire to become a shahid, or "martyr," herself.

"I have one wish for all Israeli mothers, for all Israelis," she said. "They should not relax, they should not sleep peacefully, they should always have nightmares, night and day." The Palestinian television presenter ended the interview with the comment: "Of course, we are always very proud of all of our shahids."

The woman said that when she did the Islamic pilgrimage circuit in Mecca and Medina, "I swear to Allah, that I prayed for him...and said: 'Praise Allah, my children asked for shahada, and it is better than the way we will die. Their death is for Allah, death for our country, death for our Jerusalem.'"

The mother said she wished that all Israelis "should dream of how the Palestinian people kill them and blow them up. They should not be relaxed, and should not sleep — not them and not their sons, not their children nor the Israeli army."

"They should not be able to travel on the buses, nor drive a tank, nor even ride a bike," she said. "Wherever they turn, the Israelis should see [someone] and say: 'Maybe it's a Palestinian.'"

The mother, also speaking to Israelis, said: "This Jerusalem is our Jerusalem, and not yours."

"We are the children of Palestine, the Muslim nation," she said. "No Israeli of any kind should live in comfort," she continued. "Even in their sleep, they will have nightmares. We will blow them up day and night, wherever they go. And I, as the mother of two shahids, if I see an Israeli, I will blow up among them." ■

SAUDI ARABIA INFLUENCES FBI...

Send in the Clowns (Again!)

Two veteran FBI investigators say they were ordered to stop investigations into a suspected terror cell linked to Osama bin Laden's al Qaeda network and the Sept. 11 attacks.

...In the mid-1990s, with growing terrorism in the Middle East, the two Chicago-based agents were assigned to track a connection to Chicago, a suspected terrorist cell that would later lead them to a link with Osama bin Laden. [Agent Robert] Wright says that when he pressed for authorization to open a criminal investigation into the money trail, his supervisor stopped him.


"Do you know what his response was? 'I think it's just better to let sleeping dogs lie,'" said Wright. "Those dogs weren't sleeping. They were training. They were getting ready."

...In 1998 al Qaeda terrorists bombed two American embassies in Africa. The agents say some of the money for the attacks led back to the people they had been tracking in Chicago and to a powerful Saudi Arabian businessman, Yassin al-Kadi. Al-Kadi is one of 12 Saudi businessmen suspected of funneling millions of dollars to al Qaeda and who had extensive business and financial ties in Chicago.

Yet, even after the bombings, Wright said FBI headquarters wanted no arrests.

"Two months after the embassies are hit in Africa, they wanted to shut down the criminal investigation," said Wright. "They wanted to kill it."

The move outraged Chicago federal prosecutor Mark Flessner, who was assigned to the case despite efforts Wright and Vincent say were made by superiors to block the probe. Flessner said Wright and [Agent John] Vincent were helping him build a strong criminal case against al-Kadi and others.



"There were powers bigger than I was in the Justice Department and within the FBI that simply were not going to let it [the building of a criminal case] happen. And it didn't happen," Flessner said.

He said he still couldn't figure out why Washington stopped the case — whether it was Saudi influence or bureaucratic ineptitude.

"I think there were very serious mistakes made," said Flessner. "And I think, it perhaps cost, it cost people their lives ultimately."

Perhaps most astounding of the many mistakes, according to Flessner and an affidavit filed by Wright, is how an FBI agent named Gamal Abdel-Hafiz seriously damaged the investigation. Wright says Abdel-Hafiz, who is Muslim, refused to secretly record one of al-Kadi's suspected associates, who was also Muslim. Wright says Abdel-Hafiz told him, Vincent and other agents that "a Muslim doesn't record another Muslim."

"He wouldn't have any problems interviewing or recording somebody who wasn't a Muslim, but he could never record another Muslim," said Vincent.

Wright said he "was floored" by Abdel-Hafiz's refusal and immediately called the FBI headquarters. Their reaction surprised him even more: "The supervisor from headquarters says, 'Well, you have to understand where he's coming from, Bob.' I said no, no, no, no, no. I understand where I'm coming from," said Wright. "We both took the same damn oath to defend this country against all enemies foreign and domestic, and he just said no?"

Far from being reprimanded, Abdel-Hafiz was promoted to one of the FBI's most important anti-terrorism posts, the American Embassy in Saudi Arabia, to handle investigations for the FBI in that Muslim country.

The FBI said it was unaware of the allegations against the Muslim agent when he was sent to Saudi Arabia or of two similar incidents described to ABCNEWS by agents in New York and Tampa, Fla. They said Abdel-Hafiz contributed significantly to many successful terror investigations.

Al-Kadi is on the U.S. government's "dirty dozen" list of leading terror financiers being investigated by the CIA. The federal government says it is pursuing possible criminal charges. ■

Selling the Sizzle

The five-minute video clip could have been produced by Jennifer Lopez to the music of Pink Floyd. It is professional, dreamy and haunting. It begins with a handsome young schoolboy writing a farewell letter to his parents. In this pop saga, the boy goes off on a “mission” in which he dies, and his farewell letter is handed to his father, who tears his hair at the news.

Scenes of the boy’s last day scroll across the screen as an enchanting male voice puts the words of his letter to a haunting melody. “Do not be sad, my dear, and do not cry over my parting. Oh, my dear father; how sweet is Shahada (martyrdom). How sweet is Shahada when I embrace you, oh my land.”

In the video, the boy embraces the ground with his arms stretched out as upon a cross. His death is gentle, innocent, heroic — not at all the brutal dismemberment that awaits suicide bombers. “Mother, my most dear, be joyous over my blood,” he sings. “And do not cry for me.”

That same line, “Mother, do not cry for me,” has appeared in at least three farewell letters from 14- to 17-year-old Palestinians who have carried out suicide bombings since the film clip first aired on Palestinian television in May 2001, says Itamar Marcus, an Israeli researcher who unearthed the music videos.

...There is no precedent for this type of indoctrination. “Not even Hitler did this,” Marcus says. “The Hitler Youth were taught to kill, not to be killed. This is the ultimate in child abuse. Here you have a whole generation of kids who think the most they can accomplish in life is to die for Allah. This is a tragedy with implications that no one in the West has begun to contemplate.”

...Addressing a chanting auditorium full of children in August, Arafat put an end to any doubts: “Oh, children of Palestine! The colleagues, friends, brothers and sisters of Faris Ouda (a 14-year-old who died in the conflict). The colleagues of this hero represent this immense and fundamental power that is within, and it shall be victorious, with Allah’s will! One of you, a boy or a girl, shall raise the (Palestinian) flag over the walls of Jerusalem, its mosques and its churches. ...Onward together to Jerusalem!”

As the children responded with wild cheering and chanting, Arafat shouted: “Millions of Shahada marching to Jerusalem!”

To the Jew first – Part 3

The Holy Spirit led us to travel to Qiryat Shemona, a northern city in Israel that borders Lebanon. The terrorist group Hizbollah often victimizes this harmless Jewish community by firing missiles over from the Lebanese border. While at Qiryat Shemona the Lord guided us to witness to a young lady who was working in a lottery booth. We had asked her directions to an Internet café. This encounter opened a door to witness about Jesus being the Jewish Messiah. We told her the fact that the God of Israel created the Chosen People so He could reveal His saving power and love to the world through the greatest Jew of all, Yeshua of Nazareth. She listened with interest and was so grateful for our Gospel witness to her that she kept saying, "Thank you, thank you for telling me about God's love," and blew kisses of appreciation at us. We gave her a Jewish Gospel tract and an Old and New Testament Bible in Hebrew and suggested to her that she read about the wonderful story of what Yeshua has done in bringing God's redemptive love to the Jewish people and the world.

In Galilee as we walked to our car in the parking lot, I looked to my right and spotted the Caesar Hotel. The Spirit quickened me that we should go in to witness to someone. HEBRAIC INSIGHT

How often we are confused! How often deceived! How often do we seek to please other people — living in anxiety and desperately seeking their acceptance — at the very expense of the abiding peace that only the Lord God can give! How many times have we made this "bargain" and exchanged the eternal peace of God for the sake of a moment's fragile solace? How many times have we been moved by the opinions of others, abiding in their fleeting acceptance and conditional love, and thereby neglected the everlasting Source and Fulfillment of all that may be truly called Love? Living in the fear of men is an entanglement — the Hebrew word (*maqesh*) refers to a bait or lure that is used to capture prey — whereas living in the trust of the Lord sets the soul securely in the heights of God careful provision.

Yielding to the fear of man results in a form of bondage — the Qal imperfect (*yitten*) suggests that the final capture is currently underway — while trusting in the Lord results in true inner peace — the Pual form of the verb *sugav* indicates that it is the Lord God who sets the one trusting in Him on high, free from the slavery of the need to gain other people's approval. May we become free of the trap of living to please others, and may we begin to earnestly trust in the all-sufficient grace of the Lord God of Israel.

Messiah was coming soon. The two young men asked if we were Jewish. We answered that we were Jewish in our hearts, circumcised by God's Spirit as promised by Adonai in the New Covenant from Jeremiah 31:31-34.

In the afternoon on the same day the Lord afforded another witnessing opportunity, this time to an owner of a restaurant. She was a Russian immigrant who had come to Israel several years before. We talked with her about how the Jewish Scriptures predicted in Jeremiah 16 and 23 that at "the end of days" God would bring the Jewish people back into the Land from the "far north" country of Russia. We ended the conversation by concluding that God is regathering the Jews to prepare His people for the return of the Messiah.

Our last day in Jerusalem was spent looking for a Hebrew language computer program. We came to one shop and found out that the manager was into the New Age Movement and Astrology. I spoke with her about how the prophetic Scriptures in the Tanakh (Old Testament) foretold the history of the Jewish people, including their restoration from dispersion to be born a nation again in 1948. I related to her that this partial regathering back into the Promised Land in unbelief (Ezekiel 20 and 37) is a sign and indication that the Messiah is soon to return. I deliberately used the word "return" with her because I declared that the Messiah had come before in the person of Jesus of Nazareth, showing her proof of this from a list of the major messianic prophecies given in the Tanakh and their corresponding fulfillments in the Brit Hadashah. She listened with interest and we left her a Messianic prophecy list and Hebrew New Testament.

We are grateful to God and to you for sending us to the Chosen People. This outreach will continue in the spring of 2003. Pray that God will water the seeds we have sown so that Jewish souls will be saved and become complete in their Jewish heritage by faith in Yeshua the Jewish Messiah. ■

PBS Peddles Islam to America

Losing Their Heads Over Fashion

Three young women have been killed — one beheaded — in Indian-controlled Kashmir, days after posters appeared in the state ordering Muslim women to wear burqas.

The killings came during 24 hours of violence in the Himalayan region in which six people died, including a newly-elected state legislator who was shot as he emerged from a mosque after Friday prayers.

The reports said the three women had been taken from their village houses in the Rajouri district, where the posters containing the dress diktat recently appeared. A police official was quoted as saying the deaths and the posters may have been linked.

Indian officials say that last year an obscure Islamic group, Lashkar Jabbar — whose name was on the recent posters — issued a dress code for Kashmiri women, threatening to shoot those who failed to cover themselves head-to-toe.

Reports in India also alleged that the same group carried out an acid attack last year on a woman in the Kashmiri city of Srinagar, for defying the dress code.

...The killings by Islamic militants — which have been a factor in bringing India and Pakistan close to war several times this year — have continued unabated.

Also, the headless corpse of a civilian was found in a village and a man was shot dead in Srinagar. ■

"Adolf Hitler was Right!"

His voice breaking, David Ahenakew, a former chief of the Assembly of First Nations and a member of the Order of Canada, apologized for saying Adolf Hitler was right to "fry" Jews to rid the world of a "disease."



"I am ashamed and truly sorry for my conduct," Mr. Ahenakew, 68, read from a prepared statement in which he atoned for remarks he made in an interview.

Mr. Ahenakew, who assailed Jewish corporate interests and said Hitler was right to use the Holocaust to clean up Europe, was condemned by people across Canada, including natives, Jews and Prime Minister Jean Chrétien.

"I was clearly out of line as a person who has been regarded as a leader in the community," said Mr. Ahenakew, who resigned his post as chairman of the senate of the Federation of Saskatchewan Indian Nations and all other committee positions with the group.

"I want to extend my most sincere apologies to the members of the Jewish community and to the Holocaust survivors and your families. I am deeply sorry for the pain I have caused you."

Mr. Ahenakew's contrition comes as the RCMP considers laying hate crime charges against him, and Jewish groups press the Governor General to strip him of his Order of Canada.

For many Jewish leaders, Mr. Ahenakew's apology not only falls short, but underscores their fears his earlier remarks hold the potential to incite violence.

"In my view a crime has been committed," said David Matas, lawyer for the B'nai Brith. "Like any crime, the apology of the perpetrator doesn't remove the fact of the crime."

After the Sept. 11, 2001 terrorist attacks in the U.S., Jewish leaders across Canada reported an increase in the acts of vandalism and threats aimed at Jews. Among them: a Quebec City synagogue was firebombed, and a Molotov cocktail was thrown at a synagogue in Saskatoon.

Three Edmonton synagogues were attacked, while a synagogue in Ottawa and Jewish organizations in Toronto were also vandalized. More recently in Quebec, tensions rose at a Montreal campus over debates about the Middle East.

"The Jewish community in the last two years has suffered an onslaught of threats, harassment, graffiti, intimidat-

tion," Mr. Matas said from Winnipeg, adding Mr. Ahenakew's praise of Hitler was harmful. "What I'm concerned about is that this sort of behavior is just becoming more acceptable, more prevalent and more dangerous."

Keith Landy, national president of the Canadian Jewish Congress, called Mr. Ahenakew's apology "a positive gesture.

"But Mr. Ahenakew himself said that words are not enough, and it will require actions to make amends. In our view it will require extraordinary actions."

Mr. Landy said the congress has written Supreme Court of Canada Chief Justice Beverley McLachlin, in her capacity as Chair of the Advisory Council of the Order of Canada, requesting the Order of Canada bestowed upon Mr. Ahenakew be revoked.

Set against the history of recent anti-Semitic incidents in Canada, Mr. Ahenakew's comments must not be regarded lightly, because they took it to a new level, Mr. Landy said.

"Previous anti-Semitic sentiments were expressed by way of Holocaust denial, or perhaps the Holocaust wasn't as bad as people say it was," Mr. Landy said. "But (Mr. Ahenakew) not only acknowledged the existence of the Holocaust, but said it was a good thing. It was so over the top and so monstrous."

However, it's unlikely Mr. Ahenakew can make amends to Jewish Canadians, said Irving Abella, a York University professor, former Canadian Jewish Congress president and Order of Canada member since 1993.

"Frankly, I don't see how he can," Mr. Abella told the CBC yesterday. "I don't think it's nearly enough to make up for the hurt he's done to the thousands of Holocaust survivors and their families in this country, as well as other Canadians."

The controversy began after Mr. Ahenakew spoke with a reporter from the *Saskatoon Star Phoenix* following a profanity-laced speech he delivered. Mr. Ahenakew called Jews a "disease," and said Hitler was only trying to clean up Europe.

"That's how Hitler came in. He was going to make d—sure that the Jews didn't take over Germany or Europe. That's why he fried six million of those guys, you know. Jews would have owned the g—d—d world. And look what they're doing. They're killing people in Arab countries," he said.

In his interview with the *Star Phoenix*, Mr. Ahenakew said had it not been for Hitler "you would be owned by Jews right now the world over. Who the h— owns many of the banks in the states, many of the corporations?"

We hear how destabilizing they are — how provocative they are. Yet, by comparison, only 144 Jewish settlements have been built since 1967 — including those surrounding Jerusalem, in the West Bank and in Gaza. Why is it that only Jewish construction is destabilizing?

The Arab "settlement" activity is not new. This has always been the case. Arabs have been flocking to Israel ever since it was created — and even before, coinciding with the wave of Jewish immigration into Palestine prior to 1948.

And that raises a question I never hear anyone ask: If Israel's policies make life so intolerable for Arabs, why do they continue to flock to the Jewish state? Why aren't they leaving in droves if conditions are as bad as they say?

The truth? There is more freedom under Israeli rule than there is in any Arab country. If you're a headstrong Arab, bent on protest, this is the place to be. Don't try throwing stones at Syrian police. You won't live long. Don't try publishing anti-kingdom newspapers in Saudi Arabia. You won't live long. Don't try fomenting revolutionary jihadism in Egypt. You won't live long.
