


"Brethren, My Heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they might be saved." - Romans 10:1

# A Trip to La-La-Land

ASSER ARAFAT DIED IN NOVEMBER. His death is prompting plans for a foreign aid bounty of \$500 million to \$1 billion a year for the Palestinians.

That's the scoop Steven R. Weisman published in *The New York Times*. He revealed that Western, Arab and other governments plan to add a 50 to 100 percent bonus to the \$1 billion a year they already direct to 3.5 million Palestinians in the territories, contingent upon a crackdown on terrorist groups and the holding of credible elections.

(Asked about Weisman's report, White House spokesman Scott McClellan neither confirmed nor denied it. But President George W. Bush did subsequently make some hugely ambitious statements about the Palestinian-Israeli conflict: "I am convinced that, during this term, I will manage to bring peace." and "Next year is very important, as it will bring peace.")

Aid-wise, residents of the West Bank and Gaza have hardly been neglected until now. They receive about \$300 per person, making them, per capita, the world's greatest beneficiaries of foreign aid. Strangely, their efforts to destroy Israel have not inspired efforts to crush this hideous ambition, but rather, to subsidize it. Money being fungible, foreign aid effectively funds

# Signs of the End

In our Lord's stunning picture of the Tribulation Period, detailed in Matthew 24, He gives fair warnings of the impending "end of the age." Among these is His dire prediction: "there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes in diverse places."

The context is the Lord's answer to questions from his worried disciples about Endtimes prophecy. In I Corinthians 10:11, the church, in general, is apprised that we are those "upon whom the ends of the world are come."

What are we to make of the horrible Tsunami? Perhaps a quarter million people will perish by the time this awful disaster works its terrible ways. Most of the casualties were Muslims. An Israeli medical team and field hospital volunteered to help, as usual. They have done this repeatedly in other parts of the world, but they were turned away because they were Jewish. Hatred knows no limits — even in a time like this one.

If we are we to watch for hunger, disease and mighty earthquakes, on the day after Christmas we were presented with all three at once.

the Palestinians' bellicose propaganda machine, their arsenal, their army, and their suicide bombers. This, however, does not faze international aid types. Nigel Roberts, the World Bank's director for the West Bank and Gaza, blows off past failures. Addressing himself to donors, he says: "Maybe your \$1 billion a year hasn't produced much, but we think there's a case for doing even more in the next three or four years."

Roberts is saying, in effect: Yes, your money enabled Arafat's corruption, jihad ideology, and suicide factories, but those are yesterday's problems; now, let's hope the new leadership uses donations for better purposes. Please lavish more funds on it to enhance its prestige and power, then hope for the best.

This la-la-land thinking ignores two wee problems. One concerns the Palestinians' widespread intent to destroy Israel, as shown by the outpouring of grief for arch-terrorist Arafat at his funeral, the consistent results of opinion research, and the steady supply of would-be jihadists. The Palestinians' discovery of their

inner moderation, to put it mildly, has yet to commence.

The other problem is blaming the past decade's violence and tyranny exclusively on Arafat, and erroneously assuming that, now freed of him, the Palestinians are eager to reform. Mahmoud Abbas, the new leader, has indeed called for ending terrorism against Israel, but he did so for transparently tactical reasons (it is the wrong thing to do now), not for strategic reasons (it is permanently to be given up), much less for moral ones (it is inherently evil).

Abbas is not a moderate, but a pragmatist. Unlike Arafat, consumed by his biography and his demons, Abbas offers a more reasonable figure, one who can more rationally pursue Arafat's goal of destroying Israel. In this spirit, he has quickly apologized to the Kuwaitis and made up with the Syrians; compared to this, reaching out to the Americans is easy. But, no less than his mentor Arafat, Abbas remains intent on eliminating Israel. This is evident, for example, from his recent comments insisting that millions of Palestinian "refugees" be

permitted to enter Israel so as to overwhelm it demographically; or from his keeping the virulent content of the Palestinian Authority's media in place.

To give additional money to the Palestinians now, ahead of their undergoing a change of heart and accepting the permanent existence of the Jewish state of Israel, is a terrible mistake, one that numbingly replicates the errors of the 1990s' Oslo diplomacy. Prematurely rewarding the Palestinians will again delay the timetable of conciliation.

As I have argued for years, money, arms, diplomacy, and recognition for the Palestinians should follow on their having accepted Israel. One sign that this will have happened: when Jews living in Hebron (on the West Bank) need no more security than Arabs living in Nazareth (within Israel).

Until that day of harmony — which I predict is about 30 years off — the outside world should focus not on showering money or other benefits on the Palestinians, but on pushing them relentlessly to accept Israel's existence.

A tragedy like this one seems to bring out extremes among the reactions. While most of the world has been very generous with aid and support, some people have shown a much lesser side of themselves.

U.N. administrator Jan Egeland called the United States (far and away history's

most generous supplier of financial aid) "stingy."

A Vatican official cited the Israelis for not volunteering to help (which, of course they had) and said they were only interested in making war.

Intended recipients of Israel's help stated that they did not want the Israelis to come, because "they will steal our land."

The prejudice and the ignorance are overwhelming. In Israel's 4,000 year history, it is very difficult to cite a time when that country ever took anyone else's land. That doesn't stop them from being accused of it, but they have never done it.

Lastly, the Islamic nations of the world, over a billion people strong,

and generally quite well to do, have given only the most paltry amounts to their stricken "brothers" in the Tsunami area.

Muslims are always willing to travel to other nations to fight alongside their "brothers," as in Iraq, but giving money is not nearly as thrilling or self-aggrandizing as killing Americans and Israelis.

Religious folks of all stripes are commenting on this great disaster, but only those with a comprehension of Biblical prophecy understand what's really going on.

# Why Kofi Annan Must Go

### A liberal opinion of Kofi Annan and the U.N. — Zola

Genocide, not oil money, is the proof of Kofi Annan's failed leadership of the United Nations. A debate currently rages about whether Annan enjoys the moral authority to lead the United Nations because the Oil for Food scandal happened under his command. That debate is 10 years too late and addresses the wrong subject. The salient indictment of Mr. Annan's leadership is lethal cowardice, not corruption; the evidence is genocide, not oil.

As the controversy roiled over the past several weeks, I was on a research trip to the two ground-zeros of Mr. Annan's failed leadership while he was head of the U.N. Department of Peacekeeping Operations — Rwanda and Bosnia. We have heard from too many conservative commentators and Republican politicians recently — most of whom reject multilateralism anyway — about Mr. Annan's qualifications to lead. We have not heard from enough Rwandans or Bosnians. I thought I'd talk to a few.

Before my recent return, the last time I was in Rwanda was 10 years ago; I was counting skulls. A young U.N. human-rights officer, I was tasked with collecting evidence for the U.N.'s forthcoming war-crimes tribunal after the successful genocide of Rwanda's Tutsi minority by Hutu militias in 1994. We were looking for the mass graves of mass murder. We found them in churches, schools, gardens, latrines — anywhere Tutsis had gathered seeking protection or their killers had dumped their bodies, dismembered

and entangled, like life-size rag dolls. Some 800,000 bodies rotted in the African sun.

But it isn't just the stench of death I remember so vividly; the odor of betrayal also hung heavily in the Rwandan air. This was not a genocide in which the U.N. failed to intervene; most of the U.N.'s armed troops evacuated after the first two weeks of massacres, abandoning vulnerable civilians to their fate, which included, literally, the worst things in the world a human being can do to another human being.

It did not have to happen. Gen. Romeo Dallaire, the U.N.'s force commander in Rwanda, sent Mr. Annan a series of desperate faxes including one warning that Hutu militias "could kill up to 1,000" Tutsis "in 20 minutes" and others pleading for authority to protect vulnerable civilians. But at the crucial moment, Mr. Annan ordered his general to stand down and to vigorously protect, not genocide victims, assembled in their numbers waiting to die, but the U.N.'s image of "impartiality."

The outline of this story is well known,

but its most important detail is not: Tutsis often gathered in compounds (large church complexes, schools and even stadiums) where they had assumed they would be safe based on implicit, and sometimes explicit, promises of protection by Blue Helmeted peacekeepers. The U.N.'s withdrawal was, therefore, not a passive failure to protect, but an active, and lethal, perfidy.


Rwandans still seethe. Last month, I went to a tiny, remote village, deep in the central Rwandan hills, to meet Charles Kagenza, a famous Tutsi survivor who hid in the bell tower of a church full of Tutsis that was bull-dozed to the ground, burying victims alive. When I told him I worked for the U.N. 10 years ago, just after the war, he looked me straight in the eye, with his one remaining good eye, and shot back, "What are you doing here? You had the capacity to save us, but you abandoned us."

Some 3,300 miles directly north from Kigali is the town of Srebrenica, a grim, shell-pocked village on the border of Republika Srpska and Serbia. A few kilometers down a decrepit road is a sprawling abandoned battery

#### Dear Friends:

In my zeal to comment on the Presbyterian Church USA denomination for divesting from Israel (and the Episcopalians who intend to dutifully follow them), I haven't, for the moment, been talking about other liberal churches. After all, the prize for the world's most unbiblical church is still in contention. God, however, called this to my attention when I received two e-mails, which shed a lot of light on what is going on elsewhere in the liberal church community.

One of our viewers e-mailed her pastor as follows:

Dear Pastor:

I don't know if God is trying to tell me something or what, but I keep coming across all this stuff that the United Methodist Church believes and promotes. Quite frankly, it's making me sick. I don't have the fortitude to fight the establishment like the group "Confessing UMC" has. And, in good conscience, I can't bring myself to tithe when I see what it is supporting. I don't care if it's one half of one percent of what I give — it's not right.

We sent my dad to Israel last October for his 70th birthday. He went with a group through Zola Levitt's ministry. Zola is a Messianic Jew based in Dallas. Anyway, I picked up dad's mail the other day and started reading Zola's newsletter that he sends out monthly. I came across a letter to Zola that talked about the UMC position on Israel. So I went to his archives & found this article.

When you get a moment, I'd like to hear (read) your thoughts.

We have written several items in the *Levitt Letter* concerning this particular denomination, in reply to certain ministers. I pointed out in one arti-

cle how awful the United Methodist "missionaries" behaved toward the Jewish people in Israel. And, of course, I have some domestic experience with that church in general.

The pastor responded to her email as follows:

Be very careful of black and white thinking on issues that are far more complex than you or I can easily understand. There is a big difference between Israel's right to exist as a nation, which we derive from a Biblical understanding, and the very complicated religious/political/cultural situation that exists in the Middle East.

I'm sure you understand that I am not taking the side of the Palestinian Hamas fanatics. I also do not blindly take the side of Israel in everything that they are doing in that part of the world. Neither do I believe that God approves of everything that the Israeli Jews are doing in that part of the world, just as He has been overwhelmingly disappointed with them throughout their history. They are a disobedient people who have rejected the Messiah sent to them.

Their existence will never be without turmoil and conflict. You and I have very little in common with the Jews. Much less than you think. I have told you before when you have raised various issues that I would be happy to get together to talk. You've yet to take me up on it. I'll come over any-



time you want.

Regarding the Council of Bishops, they are entitled to their official statements. But never do those statements affect the larger church or the destination of our submitted funds to the larger church. That spending is determined by the larger church at General Conference, by pastors and lay people like yourself.

I don't want to just give a knee-jerk reaction to this ignorance. Is it anti-Semitic? Yes. Is it anti-Israel? Yes. Is it utterly unbiblical? Of course. But I must confess to a very human weakness. The kind of wishy-washy language of this pastor absolutely galls me. I would much rather he come out and say "I don't like Jews. I don't like Israel. I don't believe the Bible and I don't understand God," rather than posturing diplomatically as he does. So having said that, please expect that I am not very sympathetic to his remarks.

#### I'll go through them point by point:

First, there's no difference between Biblical and modern times in Israel. If the pastor was acquainted with Scripture, he would know that unrest (like what is going on right now) is common in the Holy Land (and is common to our country as well.

Many more people have been killed by terrorism in America than in Israel and we have far more crimes against persons).

Next, no one should ever have to say "I'm sure that you understand that I'm not taking the side of the Palestinian Hamas fanatics." Is he guilty about something? Does he think he sounds like he favors terrorists? Perhaps he sounds that way because in his heart, he prefers them to the Chosen People. After all, elder Ron Stone of the Presbyterian USA denomination proclaimed exactly that after his inspiring meeting with those murderers.

I personally "blindly take the side of Israel in everything they are doing" because that is God's will. That doesn't mean that I approve of every move of the government, the military or any other contemporary issue, but I deeply approve of the Chosen People resettling the Promised Land and reestablishing their residency there, at least to promote the marching onward of God's prophetic plan and the preparations for the Kingdom. And I might say that I don't judge what God approves or "overwhelmingly disapproves," as does this pastor.

How arrogant to refer to the four-thousand-year old Chosen People by saying, "They are a disobedient people. Their existence will never be without turmoil and conflict." When he says he has very little in common with the Jews, I believe that. I don't think he's going to come to the Kingdom. I don't think he's going to live in Israel a thousand years and I don't think he's going to live in the New Jerusalem. In any case, if he does, I'm going to want to talk to him.

And so will the King of the Jews.

His double-talk in the last paragraph, which is very hard to understand, becomes much clearer when you study the actual spending by

Methodists. Virtually none of it goes to the support of Israel.

"That spending is determined by the larger church at General Conference, by pastors and lay people like yourself" is malarkey.

It's the same idea as with the General Assembly of the Presbyterians who voted for that awful divestment from Israel. They did not really represent their people at all.

#### A few other comments:

Is the United States' existence without "turmoil and conflict?" The pastor's view of the world is so narrow and so caught up in his own religiosity that he literally sets my teeth on edge.

Let me invite you to send in whatever opinion you may have in reply to the pastor's comments. I'm open to that and I will read them and perhaps learn from them. Maybe we can run a few of them in upcoming *Levitt Letters*. In any case, please know that one of Israel's worst problems in this world is the range of false friends down to utter enemies to be found among "Christian" churches throughout America, Europe and the rest of the world.

On the other hand, Christian Zionists, like most of our viewers and readers, are always welcome in Israel as honored guests. The real people of God have no problem with the people of Israel and vice versa.

Now I owe you a very great debt of thanks for the year-end giving. Every January I say this because at each year's end you are so very kind. 2004 was a giant leap for our ministry, and I really mean that. I was astounded when we went onto the PAX network and I saw that a ministry that had started on half a desktop shared with my high school-age son, Mark, had now become a national television force, reaching into tens of millions of homes. Potential viewership is overwhelming — most of the nation — and we are already receiving very glad and willing support from the viewers of PAX.

With their generous contributions and your own selfless year-end giving, we have balanced our costs on that network and are on to even bigger and better things. As the Lord leads, we will stay at our posts until the end.

As for Israel, believe me, it will survive. Despite these Methodists, Presbyterians and Episcopalians and the others of our "generation of vipers," Israel will gladly welcome any right-thinking Christian Zionists at any time.

Please make your plans early for our upcoming spring tours to Israel. Our Deluxe Tour is scheduled from March 13-23 and the Grand Petra Tour to Israel and Petra, is March 13-27. ### **Bad News and Good News**

U.S. Joint Chiefs Chairman General Richard B. Myers, following the horrific December 22 suicide bombing of a U.S. military dining tent (by a Saudi medical student

and son of a Saudi diplomat) in Mosul, Iraq, said in a news briefing the following day: "We have had a suicide bomber apparently strap something to his body and go into a dining hall. We know how difficult this is to prevent — people bent on suicide, and stopping them."

### **Hebrew**Lesson

#### The Lord's Prayer-Part 5

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. (Matthew 6:13)



#### Hebraic Insight - The "hands of Massah"

Massah comes from a root that means to melt, dissolve, or consume — as by fire that tests the quality of something. As a noun, the word is often translated as "test," "trial," or "temptation," and is directly used to name the place where the children of Israel rebelled against God in the wilderness (Exodus 17:7; Deuteronomy 6:16, Psalms 94:8; Hebrews 3:7-9). Significantly, massah can also mean "despair," in the sense of "melting of heart," and is usually rendered as mockery or scorn (Job 9:23).

When we petition the Father to be "led not into temptation," we are asking to be redirected in our heart's attitude in the face of difficult and trying moments. To fall into the "hands of Massah" means yielding to despair — and to the psychological dissolution that results in bitterness, scorn, and mockery.

#### Deliverance from Yetzer Hara

The origin of this despair is what Jewish tradition calls *yetzer hara*, or the inner impulse to gravitate toward selfish gratification (idolatry). This concept first appears in Genesis 6:5 where the wickedness of man

is described as "every *imagination (yetzer)* of the thoughts of his heart was only evil *(ra).*" In the New Testament, *yetzer hara* is called the "carnal mind," the "old nature," or the "natural man."

The word *yetzer* itself is a neutral word used to refer to something formed or shaped, like pottery fashioned by the hand of a potter. Just as a potter purposes a shape before forming an object, so that which is intended within the heart will form our character. But since God has "power over the clay" to make one vessel for honor and another for dishonor (Romans 9:21), we are to appeal to the Father alone for deliverance from the evil impulse.

The ultimate source of the evil impulse is *hara* itself, that is, the evil one, since it is Satan who seeks to entice us into idolatry. Satan does this in order to rob God of His glory by blinding us to the truth of His love and of our desperate need for Him. He seduces us with vain imaginations that we might be satisfied with things other than God Himself. But Yeshua instructs us to pray to be delivered from the evil one by the power of God's salvation. May you be so delivered today.

### Discovered! The Pool of Siloam

Progress continues at the excavation of the Siloam Pool, located at the southern end of the City of David in Jerusalem. Until recently, only a small part of the stone staircase leading to the pool had been uncovered, but now some 30 yards of the stairway, along with a corner of the pool, can be seen.

The only permanent water source for the city of Jerusalem in the first century AD, the pool is viewed as one of the most exciting discoveries of recent times. Israel's President Moshe Katsav introduced the excavation to the public at a small ceremony.

The stones date back to both the First and Second Temples, when repairs at the pool were carried out. Fed by the waters of the Gihon Spring diverted through Hezekiah's Tunnel, this was where Jesus sent the blind man to wash the clay from his eyes and receive his sight (see John 9: 6-7).

The present-day Siloam Pool is situated about 50 yards west of the Biblical pool, which can be reached by going along a newly excavated connecting canal.

# "Death for Allah"

The hope that the situation in the Palestinian Authority (PA) will improve dramatically with the demise of Yasser Arafat is based on the mistaken assumption that the problems in the PA stemmed mainly from Arafat as an individual and not from the society he created.

But an interview with a Palestinian mother on PATV indicates the depth of the PA society's worship of Death for Allah (Shahada), and support of suicide terror, which has not changed merely because of a change of leadership. In this



program, a Palestinian mother of a suicide terrorist talks about how she and other mothers in her position see their sons' Shahada death as a positive event — like a joyful wedding.

The following is an excerpt from the PATV, Nov. 17:

**Moderator:** "They [Israelis] accuse the Palestinian mother of hating her sons and encouraging them to die. This is what we hear from Israelis. Is this true?

Mother Um Al-Ajrami: "No, we do not encourage our sons to die. We encourage them to Shahada [martyrdom] for the homeland, for Allah."

[She then talks about a group of women, all mothers of Shahids, who go to other mothers of Shahids during the period of mourning]:

"We don't say to the mothers of the Shahids, 'We have come to comfort you', but 'We have come to bless you on the wedding of your son, on the Shahada of your son. Congratulations to you on the Shahada...' For us, the mourning is joyous. We give out drinks, we give out sweets. Praise to God — the mourning is a joyous occasion."

The "Islam Online" website (www.islamonline.org) points out that this woman, Um Al-Ajrami, is quoted as saying: "I brought sweets and biscuits in order to change the day of joy to a new wedding, not mourning. I will sweeten anyone who will come to me to bless me on the occasion of the first holiday of the Shahada of my son."



# "Bias, Baloney and Bigotry" By Wesley Pruden, The Washington Times

You never know who's looking for a new place to sit down until you put out an empty chair.

For a lot of the journalists of television's "entertainment news," the most inviting chair in town is at CBS, where Dan Rather will soon leave for "other duties" with the seat of his pants on fire. He can take his faked documents with him. Now the moguls at "Black Rock" are looking around to see whose bottom might be big enough to fill his chair.

This is particularly rich for the millions of viewers who have been throwing shoes at their TV screens for years, frustrated by the bias, baloney and bigotry spread out before their eyes by pretty faces with IQs of a hamster. But now the times, they are a-changing. The dominant media culture is as arrogant as ever, often as ignorant as ever, but not quite so dominant as it used to be, and getting less so.

Television news in particular is not what it used to be. The Internet, with its hundreds of news sources, some reliable and many others not so reliable, is doing to television news what television news did to newspapers a generation ago, nibbling away at audience. Some of the bites are getting dramatic. The audience for network newscasts is but a shell of what it used to be. Advertisers are taking notice; Internet advertising is growing spectacularly.

What has often infuriated newspapermen is that television news couldn't exist without newspapers, since the newspaper is where the television producers not only clip most of their news, but where they go to find out what's news and what's not. You'll see dozens of reporters and columnists from major newspapers as talking heads on your television screen, but rarely if ever see the byline of a television personality on the op-ed page of a serious newspaper.

Compounding the irony now, the newspaper sites are the major purveyors of news on the Internet, thus giving some newspapers audiences of a size that dwarfs that of a network newscast. The Drudge Report, despised as it may be by the media elites who read it (as if) religiously, can strike with a bigger impact than a network news broadcast.

The gloom at CBS is particularly dark, wet and deep, because Dan Rather, for all his huffing and puffing, is the fading face of a shriveling medium. The "CBS Evening News," once the gold standard of television news, has

struggled and stumbled to an audience behind both NBC and ABC and even on rare nights, Fox News. The sacking of Dan Rather, even if a self-sacking, gives the network an opportunity to throw out a lot of the deadwood. Andrew Heyward, the president of CBS News, may soon be on the street himself, rubbing his own raw hind quarters.

Scott Pelley and Matt Lauer are replacement hopefuls, and even Bill O'Reilly, the chief spinmeister at Fox News, has mailed in his resume with a remarkable hymn to both CBS and Dan Rather, published in the New York Daily News, the fiercest rival of the New York Post, which is owned by Mr. O'Reilly's current employer.

If a chair is big enough, somebody will want to sit in it, even if there won't be room for both his bottom and his ego.

# Terrorists' Little Helpers By Heather MacDonald, www.opinionjournal.com

How long will it be before Washington's political correctness leads to new hijackings?

One of the highest priorities for the new Homeland Security Secretary should be to take political correctness and a fear of litigation out of national security decisions. From immigration enforcement to intelligence gathering, government officials continue to compromise safety in order to avoid accusations of "racial profiling" - and in order to avoid publicly acknowledging what the 9/11 Commission finally said: that the enemy is "Islamist terrorism." This blind antidiscrimination reflex is all the more worrying since radical Islam continues to seek adherents and plan attacks in the U.S.

The government antidiscrimination hammer has hit the airline industry most severely. Department of Transportation lawyers have extracted millions in settlements from four major carriers for alleged discrimination after 9/11, and they have undermined one of the most crucial elements of air safety: a pilot's responsibility for his flight. Since the charges against the airlines were specious but successful, every pilot must worry that his good-faith effort to protect his passengers will trigger federal retaliation.

Litigation phobia is the mindset that the Department of Transportation is hoping to cultivate in flight personnel: Ten days after 9/11, the department started rolling out "guidance" documents on nondiscrimination. While heavy on platitudes about protecting civil rights, they are useless in advising airlines how to avoid the government's wrath. The closest the DOT gets to providing

airlines a concrete rule for avoiding litigation is a "but-for" test: "Ask yourself," advise the guidelines, "But for this person's perceived race, ethnic heritage or religious orientation would I have subjected this individual to additional safety or security scrutiny? If the answer is 'no,' then the action may violate civil rights laws."

In application, the "but-for" test reduces to a "never-ever" rule: Ethnic heritage, religion or national origin may play no role in evaluating risk. But when the threat at issue is Islamic terrorism, it is reckless to ask officials to disregard the sole ironclad prerequisite for being an Islamic terrorist: Muslim identity or its proxies—national origin or ethnic heritage.

American Airlines contested a DOT action over their denial of boarding for a passenger, but fighting the government civil-rights complex is futile. In February 2004, the airline, while denying guilt, settled the action for \$1.5 million, to be spent on "sensitivity training." American's pilots were outraged. "How dare they second-guess our decision?" said Denis Breslin, a pilots' union official.

Not satisfied with just one scalp, DOT lawyers brought identical suits against United, Delta and Continental. Those carriers also settled, pledging more millions for "sensitivity training" — money much better spent on security training than on indoctrinating pilots to distrust their own security judgments. And in the government's wake, the private civil-rights bar, led by the ACLU, has brought its own airline discrimination suits. An action against Northwest is seeking government terror-watch lists, Northwest's boarding procedures, and its cabintraining manual. If these materials got loose, they would be gold to terrorists trying to figure out airline-security procedures.

# Leadership and Indifference in Humanitarian Crises

The Bush and Blair administrations have taken heat for not responding quickly enough and with significant aid to tsunami stricken East Asia. World leaders and their countries should take the lead and set the example for others through their level of monetary, food, medical, and other aid, or so the argument goes. But with multiple nations and populations affected by this tragedy, is it fair to blame one or two countries for alleged foot-dragging and stinginess? As the scope of the tragedy became clearer, nations began to pour more money and resources into the relief effort.

Several of the countries affected by the earthquake and tsunami have significant Muslim populations, including the world's largest Muslim population in Indonesia, an estimated 182 million. Speaking on NBC's *Meet the Press*, Secretary of State Colin Powell said of the American relief effort: "We should be seen not just because it's a Muslim nation, but because these are human beings in need. The fact that it is also a Muslim nation, I think, contributes to the importance of the effort." While some may argue that the response of the world's Western and democratic nations may have been initially too slow and too little, it has since picked up speed and continues to grow by the day. But what have the world's Arab and Muslim regimes contributed to help their suffering brethren?

As of January 5th, CNN reported the following numbers (in millions of US dollars): Algeria, 2; Bahrain, 2; Kuwait, 10; Libya, 2; Qatar, 25; Saudi Arabia, 30; Turkey, 1.25; UAE,

20. This brings the total monetary donations from Muslim nations to approximately \$92.25 million. Additionally, Muslim Aid, a private charitable organization based in London, has pledged £1.1 million (approx. \$2,059,000) for the relief effort.

While this is a respectable amount, it would be much higher if the remainder of the world's 57 majority Muslim nations decided to pitch in. In order to put the total \$94.3 million number and individual country contributions into clearer perspective, let's look at some of the following information.

Michael Schumacher, seven-time world formula one champion, personally pledged to give \$10 million, more than Algeria, Bahrain, Libya, Turkey, and Muslim Aid combined.

Suha Arafat will receive a \$22 million a year pension for the rest of her life from the Palestinian people.

In April of 2002, soon after the attacks of 9/II and the subsequent American response in Afghanistan, several Arab nations held telethons to raise money for the Palestinian people, a year and a half into their latest violent uprising. The telethons were billed as an outlet for Muslims to vent their anger at the US and Israel, and were highly criticized in the US for inciting violence. Saudi Arabia raised over \$100 million, while other Arab nations had smaller hauls: UAE, \$35 million; Bahrain, \$10.5 million; Qatar, \$8.2 million; and Abu Dhabi TV (based in UAE) \$50 million. The total amount raised by Arab nations for the Palestinians was roughly \$203.7 million, or more than double their tsunami relief contributions.

Police at Paris' top airport lost track of a passenger's bag in which plastic explosives were placed to train bombsniffing dogs. Warned that the bag may have gotten on any of nearly 90 flights from Charles de Gaulle, authorities searched planes upon arrival in Los Angeles and New York.

French police said the explosives were harmless and there was no chance of their going off, since no detonators were connected to them.

More than 300 passengers were evacuated and their luggage searched when their Air France flight from

Charles de Gaulle arrived in Los Angeles, the U.S. Transportation Security Administration said.


One American Airlines and two Air France flights to Paris were also searched in New York City, TSA spokesman Norm Brewer said. No explosives were found on any of the flights.

French police at Charles de Gaulle deliberately placed up to five ounces of plastic explosives into a passenger's luggage, police spokesman Pierre Bouquin said.

But a "momentary lack of surveillance" led to the bag being lost on a conveyor belt carrying luggage from check-in to planes, he said.

Authorities immediately alerted the relevant airlines that one of between 80 and 90 planes that left the French capital could be carrying the explosives, Bouquin said.

Four of the flights were en route to the United States, while others were headed to places like Japan and Brazil, Bouquin said. Some were domestic French flights. The flight searched in Los Angeles was delayed two to three hours before continuing on its next leg to Tahiti in the South Pacific.



# The Clinton Legacy By Niles Lathem, New York Post

Billionaire Marc Rich has emerged as a central figure in the U.N. oil-for-food scandal and is under investigation for brokering deals in which scores of international politicians and businessmen cashed in on sweetheart oil deals with Saddam Hussein, the Post has learned.

Rich, the fugitive Swiss-based commodities trader who received a controversial pardon from President Bill Clinton in January 2001, is a primary target of criminal probes under way in the U.S. attorney's office in New York and

by Manhattan District Attorney Robert Morgenthau, sources said.

#### "We think he was a major player in this—a central figure,"

a senior law-enforcement official told the Post.

Investigators are looking into a series of deals that took place in the months after his pardon from Clinton. If criminal wrongdoing is established in these deals, he could be subject to prosecution.

Investigators say they have received information that Rich and Ben Pollner, a New York-based oil trader who heads Taurus Oil, set up a series of companies in Liechtenstein and other countries that they used to put together deals between Saddam and his international supporters in the controversial oil-voucher scheme — which the dictator designed to win international support against U.S. sanctions at the United Nations.

Under the scam, hundreds of international political and financial figures from France, Russia and other countries were awarded middleman vouchers allowing them to purchase set quantities of Iraqi oil at discount rates. These so-called "non-end users" could then resell the oil on the open market and make profits of up to 50 cents a barrel. Benon Sevan, who headed the U.N. oil-for-food program, is among those listed in Iraqi Oil Ministry documents as having been a recipient of the vouchers.

Since most of the recipients did not have refineries or cargo ships, they needed to sell the oil to someone else who could ship the oil out of Iraq in order to cash in. Investigators now believe Rich and Pollner brokered many of the deals by finding buyers for the oil allocated to people who were bribed by Saddam. The discount Iraqi oil would be resold to major oil companies at higher prices and Rich and Pollner would pocket percentages of the profits, worth hundreds of millions of dollars, sources said.

# Islamic Stars, Menorahs, but no Nativity Scenes www.worldnetdaily.com

Two prominent legal cases battling policies that outlaw public display of the Christian Nativity while allowing symbols of other religions have reached a critical stage.

In New York City, arguments will be presented in a federal lawsuit challenging the city's display of the Jewish menorah during Hanukkah and the Islamic star and crescent during Ramadan in more than 1,200 public schools while barring Nativity scenes during Christmas.

In Florida, U.S. District Court Judge Cecilia Altonaga will soon rule on a request for a temporary restraining order that would require the town of Bay Harbor Islands to allow a Christian resident to display the Nativity along-side existing Jewish menorahs.

Both cases are being argued by attorneys with the Michigan-based Thomas More Law Center.

"Christmas is under siege throughout our nation, and the cases in New York and Bay Harbor Islands demonstrate the kind of hostility and double standard being used by officials to deny Christians the right to publicly celebrate one of their holiest seasons," said Richard Thompson, president and chief counsel of the Law Center.

The New York suit against the city's Department of Education is in the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit after senior U.S. District Court Judge Charles Sifton ruled the city's discriminatory policy was permissible because it was an accommodation of "multiculturalism" and "an attempt to diversify the season and provide non-Christian holidays with parity."

This last paragraph clearly explains why the U.S. Senate must stop the filibustering of President Bush's judicial nominees. — Zola

Our administration takes these matters seriously, and your opinion was heard loud and clear here in Washington. For the humanitarian crisis in Darfur, Sudan in 2004, only two Muslim nations donated money through the UN for relief causes. Saudi Arabia gave \$3 million (1% of all donations) and Oman gave \$2,865.

In December 2004, a fundraising meeting was held for the United Nations Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA), an organization established specifically to deal with issues concerning Palestinian refugees. The donor countries pledged \$90 million to UNRWA, only \$2,035,000 of that coming from Muslim nations. According to UN sources, Arab nations made up a total of only 2.76% of global humanitarian contributions in 2004, just slightly less than Denmark at 2.96%. When it comes to world humanitarian and disaster relief, Muslim nations in general appear not to donate money and goods on par with the Western and democratic nations.

However, to say that Arab and Muslim nations don't give generously would be incorrect. Apparently, Arab and Muslim nations prefer to make their contributions directly to their favorite charity, the Palestinians, thereby circumventing any accountability in organizations such as the UN. According to Israeli government figures, Arab nations contribute approximately \$45 million per month directly to the Palestinian Authority. There also exists a multitude of Muslim charities which send money directly to the Palestinians, some of which have come under US and international scrutiny for their funds distribution.

It is clear that when it comes to humanitarian and natural disasters, whether they occur in a Muslim country or not, the world can count on only symbolic support from the oil rich Arab and Muslim nations. The very fact that America, Britain and other Western and democratic nations were criticized so vociferously underscores where the world looks for leadership and help during its most challenging situations. In contrast, the absence of criticism of the Arab and Muslim nations' relief response is the world's acknowledgement and acceptance of the fact that humanitarian help is apparently not expected of them.



Every single time there is a terrorist attack — or a plane crashes because of pilot error — Americans allow their rights to be contracted for no purpose whatsoever. The airport kabuki theater of magnetometers, asinine questions about whether passengers "packed their own bags," and the hostile, lumpen mesomorphs ripping open our luggage somehow allowed over a dozen armed hijackers to board four American planes almost simultaneously on Bloody Tuesday. We carpet-bombed German cities, we killed civilians. That's war.

# The Enemy in Plain View

Saddam's regime has not yet been defeated.

Washington must seem like a very strange place from the vantage point of Baghdad. While the world's so-called power capital debates whether Donald Rumsfeld has been solicitous enough of U.S. Senators, on the front lines of the war on terror three Iraqi election workers are dragged from their car in Baghdad and murdered in front of the world's cameras.

Do we need any clearer picture of the stakes, and the nature of our enemy in Iraq than the photo of those assassinations that appeared on front pages? The dead Iraqis were targeted precisely because they are trying to build a new, democratic Iraq. Their killers can't abide a free election, or a newly legitimate Iraqi government, because they know it will make it less likely that they can ever return to power. The car bombs targeting Shiite Muslims in Karbala and Najaf are sending the same brutal message.

These events ought to put to rest the canard that what we are facing in Iraq is some kind of "nationalist" uprising opposed to U.S. occupation. The genuine Iraqi patriots are those risking their lives to rebuild their country and prepare for elections. They are being threatened, and murdered, by members and allies of

the old regime who want to restore Sunni Baathist political domination. Or to put it more bluntly, we haven't yet defeated Saddam Hussein's regime.

If Mr. Rumsfeld has made a single large mistake as Defense Secretary, it has been underestimating the resilience of this enemy. To be fair, this is a familiar mistake in U.S. history, the tendency to declare victory too soon and let the enemy regroup and fight on. To be fair, mistakes are inevitable in war and Mr. Rumsfeld has been far from alone. The CIA seems to have completely missed that Saddam's strategy from the beginning was to disperse his allies and conduct a decentralized insurgency. And

we don't recall John McCain predicting today's events. The first person we saw who noted this likelihood was retired Marine colonel Gary Anderson, in an April 2, 2003 op-ed in *The Washington Post*. His warnings were dismissed at the time, especially by the CIA, which still believed that Iraq could be pacified with a "decapitation" strategy eliminating Saddam and his top aides.

But the more we learn about the insurgency, the more Mr. Anderson's analysis has proven true. The latest evidence comes from a batch of intelligence documents reported in *U.S. News & World Report*. Reporter Edward Pound cites U.S. documents saying "former regime elements" are behind most of today's terror attacks in Iraq. He quotes one document as noting that Saddam and his allies "appear to have planned for an insurgency before the beginning of Operation Iraqi Freedom." Months before the Coalition invasion, members of Saddam's intelligence service and Fedayeen were planning how to build roadside bombs and to target convoys and such soft targets as water plants and oil pipelines.

When these columns endorsed the war in Iraq, we didn't sign up for a short or easy war. We signed up to support whatever it takes to win. No war ever goes as planned, and Iraq is no exception. But surely we can all admit that when we see those enemy assassins on our front pages, we are staring at what would be the consequences of U.S. defeat.





# The Assault on Democracy

Some events are so obviously historic that the world understands immediately that the course of human events has changed. Some, however, seem to get lost in the swarm of journalistic trivia.

An example of the latter sort took place in the weeks leading up to the elections in Iraq, when various media, military and intelligence sources reported new evidence that Syria is allowing former Iraqi government officials to organize and fund terrorist attacks in Iraq. Journalists have reported that Iran and Syria are cooperating to destabilize Iraq, as they did successfully in Lebanon. Mosques operating in both countries as de facto government agencies, are openly recruiting and funding jihadists to fight in Iraq.

Interim Iraqi Prime Minister Iyad Allawi, President Bush and other administration officials have all pointedly warned Syria and Iran to cease and desist — with no apparent effect. The seriousness of the situation is difficult to overestimate.

There was a time, before Afghanistan's Taliban and Iraq's Baathist tyrants were quashed, when the Arab/Muslim world had reason to wonder if the infidel West had the will to take action against Middle Eastern tyrannies — but those days have passed. The message that governments supporting terrorism will be treated as terrorists themselves, has gotten through even to Libyan dictator Moammar Qaddafi, who has backed off from many of his previously provocative policies.

While Iran's game of brinkmanship might be explained by the insular world of self-reinforcing narcissism surrounding the ruling mullahs, this is not the case with regard to Syria. President-for-life Bashar Al-Assad has never exhibited the peculiar arrogance behind Osama bin Laden's and Saddam Hussein's certitude that a morally weak West could be perpetually intimidated and outfoxed.

Bashar Al-Assad had taken refuge in England, studying medicine and computer technologies while staying clear of his family's internecine and frequently lethal power struggles, when the heir-apparent to the Syrian dictatorship, his older brother, was killed in an 1994 car accident. Assad, who speaks perfect English, knows the risks he is taking by meddling in Iraq.

His strategists may be hoping that the U.S. is too busy with Iraq and Afghanistan to undertake another invasion,


but the signs are that the American military would forgo "nation building" and simply decapitate the existing governments of Syria and Iran if it became necessary. It would not, in fact, be difficult. A joke, circulating now in military circles, has it that it would take twenty minutes to destroy Syria's military capabilities — one minute to target and launch the missiles, and nineteen minutes to laugh about it.

This, of course, begs the question; why are Syria and Iran willing to risk, by waging a not-very-covert cold-war, a reprisal that could easily bring down their governments. The answer is that both fear, more than U.S. military intervention, a democratic eruption on their borders.

As did Saddam Hussein, Assad leads a minority elite ruling over an exploited and resentful majority population of a differing Muslim sect. His attempts to interfere in Iraq without provoking American retaliation may seem risky business, but he would be in even greater personal danger if he neglected the interests of the ruthless Alawite aristocracy — a group well-schooled in the dark arts of conspiracy and assassination. Iran also has a healthy and growing opposition movement, especially among the student population, that is increasingly angry at the privileged clerics who maintain a monopoly on political power in their country.

Though little is said in the state-run media of the Arab and Muslim world, the recent and successful Afghan elections have shaken the Middle East to its core. Fearing that elections in the Palestinian territories and Iraq will plant further democratic notions in the minds of their subjects, representatives of the ruling Arab powers met in November at the Sharm Al-Sheikh summit to declare the elections in Iraq illegitimate — because of the presence of the occupying coalition.

Remarkably, a number of Arab writers have broken ranks, speaking out against their rulers' hypocrisy and garnering considerable attention in the process,

Columnist Salama Ni'mat, for example, wrote in the London-based daily *Al-Hayat*:

"It is outrageous and amazing, that the first free and general elections in the history of the Arab nation are to take place in January: in Iraq, under the auspices of American occupation, and in Palestine, under the auspices of the Israeli occupation.

It is sad and pathetic that the eyes of the entire world are upon the Palestinian and Iraqi elections that will be held under the lances of foreign occupation, while the peoples of the 'independent, free, and sovereign' Arab countries have no way of expressing their will. It is sad and pathetic that certain countries today are treating the Iraqis with the cheapest kind of political hypocrisy, even though no one heard any particular Arab protest during the time of the regime of the mass graves.

Although the Taliban's regime of darkness has become history, and Saddam Hussein sits in his cell awaiting trial on charges of war crimes and crimes against humanity, the Arab regimes still act as if nothing has happened. Further, [they act] as if history is not happening as long as they do not acknowledge its existence and do not announce it in the papers and on the television channels which they control. Can anybody ask the Arab League why the media in occupied Iraq and Palestine enjoy freedom under the occupation, while the media in the other Arab countries do not?"

Even on the Islamist-dominated Al-Jazeera television network, Egyptian journalist Nabil Sharaf Al-Din said: "We are not being fair to the current Iraqi government, but history will do justice to them. These people are establishing the first democracy in the Middle east. This country will be a platform for liberties in the whole region. In Iraq, the days of a leader who remains on his throne until he dies are gone. This is over. For the first time, the Iraqi leader will be elected by Iraqi ballots."

If there is an upside to the efforts by Arab and Muslim leaders to delegitimize and sabotage elections in Iraq, it is that they couldn't make it more obvious that the last thing they want is democracy, for their own people least of all. For decades, these totalitarian regimes have managed to convince the naive and gullible that the problems of the Middle East are caused by democratic Israel — even while they funded and directed terrorists anxious to kill anyone, Jew or Arab, who does not share their fear and hatred of democracy.

Could the truth be any clearer?

The Trouble with Tarry

I was so shocked and disappointed by an article that I found in the December 6 *US News and World Report* that I sent them this editorial. In the story by Jay Tolson, which covered some four pages, the maga-



zine all but weeps over the fact that a potential Notre Dame professor, Tariq Ramadan, will not be joining that faculty at all due to the US State Department, "acting on advice from the Department of Homeland Security" revoking his visa.

The opening page bears a picture of a rather handsome, athletic-looking Muslim with a deeply concerned expression. The article specifies that despite various pretenses, he is as radical and dangerous an Islamic operative as one could find, even on an American university campus.

One of his credits refers to him as "gentle jihadist," and the article states: "If not an advocate of violence, his detractors say, Ramadan provides the ideological seedbed of a highly politicized Islam — Islamism as it is called — in which more violent forms can take root." Citing that Ramadan, typical of many Islamic speakers, talks differently depending on who's in the audience, the article states: "Islam condones dissimulation in dealing with 'unbelievers." Dissimulation means, according to the internet dictionary, "To disguise (one's intentions, for example) under a feigned appearance," but in this case, it's garden variety lying.

The would-be professor is the grandson of the Egyptian terrorist who founded the bloody Muslim Brotherhood. "There is a miasma around him," says Daniel Pipes, director of the Middle East Forum in Philadelphia. "You can explain one, two, three, four, five things. But finally, when there are so many charges, you can't explain everything away. We don't need him in this country."

That's the issue — discussion over whether this particular Islamic professor is radical enough to do some damage or whether he's worth hearing from. But now comes the part that disheartened me. Writers Anna Mulrine in Berlin and Elizabeth Bryant in Paris join Tolson in stating: "The controversy clearly weighs most heavily upon the man and his family, but it has much wider implications. Above all, it raises questions about how America, and the West in general, are engaging in the struggle for the hearts and minds of the Muslim world."

That's the part that confuses me. I didn't understand that we were in a struggle for the hearts and minds of the Muslim world. I thought we were trying to keep the Muslim world from continuing to murder us.

The writers go on to say: "It is hardly news that a decisive conflict is underway in that global community (of Islam) with a small but well-financed minority hoping to make its absolutist and puritanical construction of religious law (or Shari'a) the foundation of an all-encompassing political and social order." Well, personally, I wouldn't say that Shari'a represents any particular "construction of religious law." Shari'a is the stuff where they behead folks, hang young girls for acting romantic, cut out tongues, etc. This is no "absolutist and puritanical construction" of anything. It's barbarism. It belongs in a jungle of ten thousand years ago.

The article goes on to say: "The question, of course, is how America and the West can identify and encourage those other Muslims — particularly intellectual and clerical elites — who see the radical Islamist agenda as a betrayal of the true spirit of traditional Islam and an unworkable blueprint for future states..."

Well, yes, there I do agree. I really do think World Trade Center attacks, mass graves, totalitarian dictatorships, enslaved hundreds of millions, and the like, really is "an unworkable blueprint for future states." I would prefer that our own states, the United States of America, once they're taken over by Muslims, not follow that blueprint. (The takeover, as I've said many times, is well under way.)

A professor at The Institute of Political Studies in Paris talks about "the deplorably politicized state of Middle Eastern and Islamic studies in the United States, where



# Legacy of a Dead Terrorist By Victor Mordecai, Israel Today

I will never forget a conversation my wife, Rachel, and I overheard years ago in a Jerusalem restaurant. An Arab patron next to us began arguing with the waiter, who was also an Arab. They didn't know we understood their conversation, which basically went like this: "When are we Palestinians going to get rid of Arafat? When will we have democracy and a normal life like the Israelis?"

Between 1976 and 1986, we had a business that often took us to the Palestinian areas. We NEVER had a problem with the Arabs. We loved them and were always well received. In 1987 the first intifada began.

Following the signing of Oslo I in September 1993, IDF assessments were that there would never be a Palestinian state for two reasons:

- I. If the Palestinians had a state with territorial contiguity with Jordan, they'd be able to launch anti-aircraft missiles (stingers, SAMs and Strellas) and bring down any plane from any airport in the center of the country, including Ben Gurion, Israel's gateway to the world.
- 2. Arafat would always remain a terrorist, for whom guns and bullets took precedence over bread and butter for the local Arab population. He never had the good of his people at heart.

At an IDF officer's training course I attended, we were told that Arafat would not encourage local Palestinian businessmen to develop an entrepreneurial economy. Instead, he would shake down and destroy the very same men we'd done business with in the earlier years. Arafat knew that money equals power, and he wanted it all for himself.

In July 2000 at Camp David II, Arafat walked away from Israel's most generous offer and chose instead a second intifada that destroyed indigenous Palestinian businesses and industries and sent their owners fleeing

Thanks to Arafat, Palestinian unemployment leaped from 6 percent in September of 2000 to 50 percent in Judea and Samaria, and 70 percent in Gaza today. Arafat's legacy was always destruction and suffering for the Palestinian people.

The decision by Israel's left-wing leadership in 1992 to undergo a "peace process" with Arafat breathed new

life into the financially and politically bankrupt PLO terrorist ranks, which Arafat helped found in 1964, with the goal of liquidating Israel.




# POSTCARDS (Pack of 12)
