

A Note from Mark Levitt...

The Burning Question

Here is a transcription of a voicemail that I received on Friday, February 10 at 9:00 PM from my father Zola. I have yet to delete it from my cell phone. It marked the rapidly impending end of his 35 years of ministry—the ministry that he had begun within weeks of his salvation on March 14, 1971.

“Uh, Mark, okay. Well, I got some sorta halfway diagnosis. I’m being moved to a hospital in Orlando. I’ve got three lesions on the brain, which sounds very dramatic, but Henry (Zola’s internist) said it doesn’t have to be that dramatic. It’s going to be examined by a neurosurgeon, and it needs to be done right away. I need to cancel some churches (speaking engagements) and all that, and I can’t even get back to Dallas right now. So there’s where it’s at right this minute. I’ll try to call you at home, but I bet you’re working out or something. But anyway, you can call me on my cell. I’ve got it right with me, and I’m just waiting for an ambulance ride.”



I had been dreading that “curtains for Zola” call for the better part of

twenty years in the same way ladies routinely looks for runs in their stockings that they hope not to find. Shakespeare wrote, “Cowards die many times before their deaths;/the valiant never taste of death but once.”

For a quarter-century, I supposed that heart trouble would take Zola. After his second bypass operation last July, however, he chuckled about how ironic it would be and how he’d violate every dietary restriction if he ever came down with cancer.

How prophetic.

And dine he did! When he returned to Dallas toward the first of March,

he did his all to make up for decades of restraint and moderation with regard to pizza, ice cream, monstrous greasy burgers from a local drive-in named Keller’s, tater tots and shakes. He found a sense of satisfaction and even joy in finally being able to defy all the principles that had helped his first set of coronary bypasses last for 23 years.

Our family never got around to having a cry fest. Rather than everyone





God? No; Allah, YES

In Dallas, a school district strikes the words “In God We Trust” from the photo of an enlarged nickel on a year-book cover for fear of offending students of differing religions.

In California, the 9th Circuit Court of Appeals (the one that outlawed the Pledge of Allegiance for its reference to God) approved putting public school students through Muslim role-playing exercises. *Investor’s Business Daily* reminds us:

In a recent federal decision that got surprisingly little press, even from conservative talk radio, California’s 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruled it’s OK to put public-school kids through Muslim role-playing exercises, including:

Reciting aloud Muslim prayers that begin with “In the name of Allah, Most Gracious, Most Merciful . . .”

Memorizing the Muslim profession of faith: “Allah is the only true God and Muhammad is his messenger.”

Chanting “Praise be to Allah” in response to teacher prompts.

Professing as “true” the Muslim belief that “The Holy Koran is God’s word.”

Giving up candy and TV to demonstrate Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting.

Designing prayer rugs, taking an Arabic name and essentially “becoming a Muslim” for two full weeks.

Parents of seventh-graders, who after 9-11 were taught the pro-Islamic lessons as part of California’s world history curriculum, sued under the First Amendment ban on religious establishment. They argued, reasonably, that the government was promoting Islam.

But a federal judge appointed by President Clinton told them in so many words to get over it, that the state was merely teaching kids about another “culture.”

So the parents appealed. Unfortunately, the most left-wing court in the land got their case. The 9th Circuit,


which previously ruled in favor of an atheist who filed suit against the words “under God” in the Pledge of Allegiance, upheld the lower court ruling.

The decision is a major victory for the multiculturalists and Islamic apologists in California and across the country who’ve never met a culture or religion they didn’t like — with the exception of Western civilization and Christianity. They are legally in the clear to indoctrinate kids into the “peaceful” and “tolerant” religion of Islam, while continuing to denigrate Judeo-Christian values.

In the California course on world religions, Christianity is not presented equally. It’s covered in just two days and doesn’t involve kids in any role-playing activities.

But kids do get a good dose of skepticism about the Christian faith, including a biting history of its persecution of other peoples. In contrast, Islam gets a pass from critical review. Even jihad is presented as an “internal personal struggle to do one’s best to resist temptation,” and not holy war.

This case is critical not just to our culture but our national security. It should be brought before the Supreme Court, which has outlawed prayer in school. Let’s see what it says about practicing Islam in class. It will be a good test for the bench’s two new conservative justices.

So what's Zola actually doing in heaven?

Given both Zola's custom of speaking his mind to everyone, and his personal preference to avoid "putting on airs," it may be that St. Peter has already been questioned about the need for paving the streets with gold and decorating the walls with jewels, much as the matter of individual mansions may have been addressed on the basis that souls in Heaven surely don't need all that space — not even in paradise.

On the other hand, given that in his perfected state Zola may now actually be enjoying a decent golf game (for once!) it may well be that (for once!) he may not see the need to be a trouble-maker — especially if he is reminded that God Himself designed the perfect place in the first place, and not Peter. Thus minded, Zola may now simply be adjusting to a good golf game, a deserved rest, and a much-improved status — a "promotion to the head office," as he liked to put it.

Incredible as his life was, I was particularly touched by the way that Zola died. He modeled Jesus' words, noted in John 13:1: *... when Jesus knew that His hour had come [and] that He should depart from this world to the Father, having loved His own who were in the world, He loved them to the end.*

Zola loved this ministry — his life's work — and kept at it till the very end. His final moment a lesson in personal commitment and human dignity.

The follow-up message to those who would survive Jesus' passing seems relevant as well: *Let not your heart be troubled; you believe in God, believe also in me* (John 14:1), said He. Much as Jesus' disciples were minded to not let apparent difficulties with His passing dishearten them too much, so too I feel we all do well to remember that God has His ways and plans and that *He who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion* (Philippians 1:6b), in you and me, and in Zola Levitt Ministries.

Years ago, I responded to a "calling" to the ministry, never imagining that it would lead me to walk in the immediate footsteps of the greatest Messianic-Jewish communicator of our times — Zola Levitt. I was born into a German Jewish family in 1955, to a Jewess smuggled out of Nazi Germany. Traumatized by it all, mother was never the same, distracted, with the result that I fell through life's cracks. Rudderless, I drifted about, till I ran

into a missionary with "Jews for Jesus." They opened my eyes, and I experienced what I understood as a "calling" into ministry.

Eventually, at age twenty-seven, I began college, taking Jewish Studies at Moody Bible Institute, and then degrees from the theological seminary at Southern Methodist University. In the middle, I worked with the American Board of Missions to the Jews (now Chosen People Ministries) and then with Zola for a few years, during which time as his associate I assisted with TV, co-authored books with him, wrote articles and led groups to Israel. For the last seventeen years I have served as a Bible college professor in Dallas, where I also chair a Jewish Studies Department.

A few months ago, Mark Levitt called me, and discussed the tragic coming need for a new teacher at Zola Levitt Ministries. Responding to "the calling," in fact, has led me to many interesting places, and now — to you. Placed here as I now have been, as with Zola before me, be assured that I will do my best to responsibly teach Scripture as a Jewish theologian and offer uncensored Messianic-Jewish commentary on Israel, Middle Eastern affairs and Bible prophecy; and, while at this post, know that I will forcefully combat anti-Semitism with my words and with my pen.

Our friend Zola has gone on to a needed rest and a gracious reward. To those of us presently residing in the land of the living, I say let's together honor Zola's work and memory by continuing to run the race he started; and let's do so expecting that he will be "cheering us on from the balcony." Together, remembering him, let's continue to preach the "good news," and let's continue to place a premium on doing so through the eyes of the Jews — Zola's trademark.

Let's continue to preach the "good news."

Feeding the Hungry

Jews for Jesus is a sister ministry of ours with which we have had a long and close relationship. People often confuse us with that ministry, but our calling is slightly different. Jews for Jesus approaches Jewish people directly with the Gospel, often in street witnessing campaigns. We mainly train Gentile Christians to witness to the Jews. It's not unlike the distinction between the ministry of Peter, called to witness to the Jews in Israel, and Paul, called to witness to the Gentiles in the Roman Empire. Naturally, we witness to Jews, and Jews for Jesus witnesses to Gentiles on occasion, as did Peter and Paul.



The wisdom of Moishe Rosen, now retired as leader of Jews for Jesus, has always been precious to the Messianic community and churches alike. In the following article, which appeared in the March 1997 edition of the Jews for Jesus newsletter, Moishe answers the questions of many readers regarding "On Wings of Eagles", a ministry purporting to be a "fellowship of Christians and Jews." We want to print his thoughts for your edification.

A friend of our ministry wrote to ask, "Do you have any knowledge of a group called On Wings of Eagles, a ministry of the International Fellowship of Christians and Jews?"

This friend had heard that *On Wings of Eagles* was helping Jewish people return to the Land of Israel, and since it is under the umbrella of an organization with the word "Christian" in it, wondered if it might be an appropriate way for Christians to show support of Israel.

Let me say that we do have some knowledge, mainly that the International Fellowship of Christians and Jews is headed by Rabbi Yechiel Eckstein. **Rabbi Eckstein does not believe that Jesus is the Messiah and discourages Christians from witnessing to Jews** in the strongest terms possible. In fact, it seems that his intention has been to develop relationships with committed Christians—not merely to raise funds for Israel, but

to undermine evangelistic efforts directed toward Jewish people. He's apparently a very personable man and very subtle in his approach. He has cozied up to evangelicals and many see their friendship with him as a step forward in "Jewish-Christian relationships."

Unfortunately, friendships between evangelical Christians and Rabbi Eckstein cannot help foster the most important relationship of all: that is the relationship that Jewish people need to have with Jesus, the Messiah of Israel. Eckstein's misunderstanding of who Jesus is and what it means for a Jew to believe in Him have misled many well-meaning evangelicals into the false notion that it is disrespectful and even harmful to share their faith with Jewish people.

For example, in his book titled *What Christians Should Know About Jews and Judaism*, Eckstein wrote, "When directed at Jews, however, Christian missions conflict with and even jeopardize the central ethic guiding Jewish life today—Jewish survival. While Christians have sought to convert Jews to Christianity for almost two millennia, after the holocaust those attempts are regarded as especially pernicious threats to Jewish survival—indeed, a form of spiritual genocide."

Eckstein does not have a relationship with Jesus, does not believe that the New Testament is the word of God and cannot be expected to know that "no one [Gentile or Jewish] comes to the Father except through Jesus." Christians who believe that Jews need Jesus should know that **supporting Eckstein's causes will not help Jewish people in the long (eternal) run.**

Before the wedding I use to call Zola every night to make sure he was home for the night. If you remember, in *A Christian Love Story*, the bridegroom has the right to take his Bride at midnight. We had planned an April wedding. I just didn't want to be caught with cold cream on my face.

I knew Zola as a person, not a personality. I had prayed for a Godly man, one with a sense of humor and one who loved to travel as much as I did. Did I ever get an answer to prayer! Zola loved the Lord and trusted Him daily.

I was always amazed at how God worked in Zola's life—the decisions that were made regarding speaking, the tours to Israel, production, the *Levitt Letter*. We could see God's hand in everything.

Zola's sense of humor was also well known. He would turn to me and say "that's your laugh for the day". He made me laugh every day. What a joy he had in the Lord.

As for traveling, who knew? Before we married, Zola traveled to Israel and spoke a few times a year. It seemed that about two years after we married, we traveled about

six months out of the year. The speaking really came on and, of course, we took the tours to Israel. He was a genuine person who loved the Lord.

I will miss him. The Lord gave us eight great years of marriage. I think we lived more in those eight years than a lot of people live in a lifetime.

Happy Days in the RV

I have spent the last few days cleaning up and out the RV that Zola and I traveled in the last several years on speaking engagements. It has taken longer than I planned because of the memories that come to me at almost every corner of the RV. Great memories. Ones filled with funny stories of us traveling, meeting wonderful believers, and trusting God to take care of us on the road. We used to laugh and say we were Ricky and Lucy on the road. Oh, the adventures we had together!

One of my favorite stories came the first year we had the RV. Our RV, which Zola liked to call the "trailer," consisted of a very nice 40-foot, 5th wheel and big truck. We used to laugh and say, we looked like a small country when we were driving. On this occasion we were coming back to Dallas from Florida and had gotten hungry. It was about 9pm. We liked to travel at night because there was less traffic. Zola saw a steak place and decided to pull in and see if we could park. We went past the restaurant and turned into a motel's parking lot only to discover that we had turned into a horseshoe driveway that became a dead end. The only way we could get out was to back up. It was awful. We had gone about 3 feet in an hour when a truck driver asked if he could help. He had us backed out and on our way in about 10 minutes. I promise, we would still be there. Zola and I always called this guy our angel. He was there one minute and the next he was gone. Zola and I laughed every time we saw this steak house. He would say, "Want to stop"? and we would just laugh. Great memories.

I loved that RV. It was a second home for us for about four months out of the year. We met so many nice people at RV parks. If we had a problem, there was always someone who could help. People would wave and say hello. Most of the time they didn't even lock their doors.

Zola and I used to say, this was the bastion of old time country living, back when things were a little slower and safer. It was a lovely way for us to be on the road. I still have some of the friends that we met. Zola was recognized more in the RV parks and truck stops than anywhere else. There was always some trucker coming up to Zola and telling him how much he liked the program.

I am finishing up a Bible study in Genesis. The last lesson for the year is the death of Jacob. How comforting it is to read of the promise Joseph made to take Jacob back to the land of Canaan. We too are going back home. God has promised us an eternal home with Him. 2 Corinthians 5:1. It Occurs to Me...



"Zola's promotion to the home office came through today, Wednesday, April 19, 2006." So stated the Zola Levitt Ministries website. He died after a brief bout with cancer at age 67. Perhaps some of you have never heard of Zola Levitt, but the little Messianic Jewish evangelist has been a well-known name for nigh on to twenty-plus years around the Harvill house. My wife Betty was aware of his weekly television ministry before I was. "You've got to hear this guy," she insisted. "He's

the best — my favorite TV evangelist. And he looks a little like you, Tommy." It must have been because of my beard and almost hairless head that she thought I resembled Brother Zola.

Well, being a dutiful husband, I sat one Sunday afternoon with my feet propped up on the coffee table and listened to this obviously Jewish guy quietly sharing Jesus with me. Now, Betty and I had been Christians for several years and were active in our church, where she played the organ and I taught the senior adult Sunday school class. So here was this fellow staring out of the tube at me with a beard and a bald head. On the desk beside him rested an ancient typewriter; and behind him, a stuffed-to-overflowing bookshelf. In addition, it turns out, my resemblance to Zola wasn't limited to my mirror or Betty's opinion. As a bald and bearded guy myself, a young fellow at the church called me Zola for years. I always considered it a compliment.

I found it interesting that Zola had been a professional musician with various symphony orchestras, and had traveled in several tours with the Glen Campbell Show. As a brand new Christian he realized his life among musicians and celebrities lacked fulfillment and meaning. Surely, God had a plan for the life of a Hebrew Christian oboe player who wrote for a news bureau.



When my wife Betty passed away of a massive stroke, exactly nine years to the day before Zola's promotion, I wrote Zola, thanking him for being an inspiration to her. I included a few stories about her death and the fifty years we spent together. Later I received a message on my phone answering machine from Zola, offering his condolences and agreeing with me that indeed when believers die we know where they are. I still have a tape of his brief message.

We were fortunate, Betty and I, to have visited Israel back in March, 1977. As new believers we were baptized in the Jordan River. And we planted trees, and saw so many unforgettable sites. I wish we had gone on tour with Zola. My Betty would have liked that.

And so Zola is at home now, having received his promotion to glory. Interestingly, not only did he and my Betty die on April 19 nine years apart, but they were both 67 years old. And as Betty said, "He was the best, her favorite TV evangelist." And he looked a little like me.



A Testimony and Tribute to "General Zola"

I would like to share a few words about my teacher, friend, and stepfather Zola. Like many people, I owe him so much for increasing my understanding of the Bible and helping me to get to where I am today.

Only six years ago I was a lieutenant in the US Army serving in Korea. Since my mom and Zola had been married, most of my time was spent away from home both at college then later in the military. It was only after seeing that he made my mom truly happy that I decided to learn a little more about who Zola was and what he taught and believed. With my time in Korea soon to end, I asked to go on one of Zola's tours to Israel in December of 2000.

I had grown up in a Christian home, meaning that I always knew that Jesus was my Lord and Savior, however in college and in the Army I convinced myself that I was just too busy for God. While in Israel for the first time, just after the beginning of the second intifada, I saw the places that I had learned about in Sunday school come to life before me, and something awoke within me. The places were real and right in front of me, and I decided then to reacquaint myself with the Bible and use Zola's teachings as a guide in my search.

Since I had forgotten many of the Bible stories and their details, it was almost as if I was learning them again for the first time. However, I think that studying the mate-

rial from the beginning was much easier than having to unlearn years of bad teaching. With Zola as my guide and teacher through this journey, I was able to see the symbolism inlaid within the stories that was only visible through my new Jewish glasses. Concurrent with my relearning of the Bible, I began intensely studying the history and geography of Israel, which only served to deepen my love and respect for God's people and His land.

The more I learned, the more I wanted to learn. I went on a total of four tours to Israel before ultimately deciding to leave the Army, sell everything I owned, and move to Israel. Zola was excited about having a full-time man on the ground in Israel and was a great source of support during the difficult early months there.

Thanks to the start that Zola gave me, I have grown by leaps and bounds in the gifts that the Holy Spirit has given me. Currently I work as a correspondent and tour leader with Zola Levitt Ministries, a writer and radio producer/broadcaster with Bridges for Peace, and a writer, photographer, and publisher for my own company, Images of Israel. It is my desire now to continue my education in religious studies at The Hebrew University in Jerusalem so that I can better serve the ministry in the absence of Zola.

Zola had a gift for finding the talents in others and helping people to use those talents to God's glory. I owe him a great deal for helping to place me along the course that my life has taken, and his work is still unfinished. When the Lord returns, He will be at the head of a mighty army. I see Zola as a prominent general in that Heavenly army, and if the Lord tarries, then it will be my pleasure to serve under him again in that final battle. ■

The Paradox of Self-Deception

"We have met the enemy, and he is us." — Pogo

When an enemy deceives you, he knows the truth about something and deliberately tries to conceal it from you. He may do this by telling you outright lies or by misleading your judgment in some way. Regardless of the deceptive method used, when he defrauds you of the truth, you become subject to his manipulation and control.

There is a different kind of deception, however, that is more insidious than being misled by an external enemy. This deception comes from within the heart and involves choosing to believe a lie, often for self-serving or self-flattering reasons. "Anyone who thinks he is something when he is nothing," said the Apostle Paul, *deceives himself* (Gal. 6:3).

Self-deception is a universal condition of mankind. The Scripture declares: *kol derekh ish yashar be'ainav* — "every man's way is right in his eyes"—indicating that by nature we are self-justifying creatures, prone to believe our own "propaganda" and wishful thinking. We are apt to be biased in our self-examination and ready

to excuse ourselves at every turn, rationalizing our behavior and suppressing the truth about ourselves in order to quell the voice of conscience within our hearts. When faced with an inconsistency between our behavior and our romanticized self-image, we often regard ourselves as something other than what we really are. In short, we deceive ourselves.

The remedy for self-deception is honest acceptance of ourselves as God sees us, since *vetokhein libbot Adonai*—"the Lord weighs the heart." The Hebrew word for "weighs" is *takhan*, meaning to measure, balance, make even, or adjust to a standard. God's moral law functions as a "looking glass" of our inward condition, revealing both the divine standard of life required of us and also the truth of our own need for deliverance from ourselves. It is only through the honest confession of our condition that we will find healing from the "divided self"—and thereby make our way right in the eyes of the Lord. As the Lord Jesus said, *you shall then know the truth, and the truth shall make you free* (John 8:32). May the Lord help us to be honest before Him always.



Mission Trip to Israel - Part II

My second tour of Israel was very productive as I went as a mission partner with Teresa Brown, Todd Baker and Paul Colley. What a blessing to spend ten days in the Chosen Land meeting His Chosen People and sharing His Word with those who originally brought the Word to the Jew first and also to the world of the Gentile.

Teresa and I approached two female Israeli soldiers outside of the Jesus Boat Museum. One of them accepted a *Brit Hadashah* (the New Testament in Hebrew) and other materials from Teresa.

One of my first encounters was with a young lady, Shalhevet, who works in the gift shop at the Jordan River. As I was checking out, I asked her if she believed in the Messiah. She replied yes, but that she wasn't sure. I offered to give her one of Zola Levitt's bookmarks which lists Old Testament prophecies with the corresponding New Testament fulfillments. She thanked me and wanted to pay me for it, but it was a gift.

Later, I returned to visit with her further and offered a pamphlet explaining the same prophecy verses, but in both Hebrew and English. Shalhevet gladly accepted this gift, and the *Brit Hadashah*. Shalhevet also gave me her email address so that we can stay in touch.

On another day, Teresa and I visited the Dead Sea with Zola's tour. At this great location, we visited the Ein Gedi Spa. After a few hours enjoying the wonderful Dead Sea and Spa, I asked a young man at the check-in counter how long he had worked there. His name was Nof, he was twenty-two years of age and he had been working at the Ein Gedi Spa for six months. Nof was born in the Ein Gedi kibbutz, where he lives and works today. He is Jewish and asked me if I was Jewish. I answered no, but that I support Israel, read the *Torah*, the *Tanakh*, the *Brit Hadashah*, and believe in the Jewish Messiah.

I then asked Nof if he had ever read the *Brit Hadashah*, he replied no, but accepted a copy. I told him I would look for him if I traveled to Ein Gedi again in the future. He said that he would enjoy meeting me again. Later on, I happily introduced him to my mission partner, Teresa.

Visiting the traditional site of the Upper Room was quite unusual this time. Several groups of people gathered in close

proximity — our large group of Christians, a group of Jews, a large group of Muslims and Arabs, and also a group of Israeli soldiers. Our group sang "Amazing Grace," while the Arabs knelt and bowed with their faces to the floor to pray.

After leaving this room, we returned downstairs, and I watched as a leader of the Arabs directed his group into another room that resembled a mosque. After his group had entered this room he remained outside the door. I handed him a tract in Arabic. I did not say a word, but watched as he began to read it. As he took the tract and began reading I walked around the corner. Shortly thereafter, my mission partner, Teresa, arrived to join me. I mentioned to her that I had just given a tract to an Arab man, and I pointed out that he was reading it now. She took a picture of the man with my camera as he continued to read the tract.

We were able to give numerous tracts to people in Hebrew, English and Arabic as well as a number of *Brit Hadashahs*. One of the many places we visited was the

Beit Shean ruins. After touring this amazing Roman-Byzantine site, I spoke with a man who was working the ticket counter. A bus driver interpreted the conversation for us. I told him that I would like to give him a gift. I handed him a "Loving Kindness" tract printed in English and Hebrew. I asked if he would read it and he answered definitely that he would. Before leaving our hotel in Jerusalem, I also gave a few tracts in


Hebrew and English to a cleaning lady in the lobby. She spoke very little English and I speak very little Hebrew, but she accepted the tracts.

While flying back to America and Dallas, I encountered two Jewish Americans. One read a twenty-five-page booklet I provided, *Israel's Right to the Land*, and also the prophecy pamphlet. She didn't want to keep the material, but she read each page of both items.

Another young American I met on the airplane had been in Yeshiva school for three years in Israel. He said he knew nothing of the Messiah, and because his Rabbis had not taught him about the Messiah, he was not interested in knowing about Him. This was very sad, but we enjoyed visiting and talking about Israel. I hope to visit Israel again and again. This mission tour was one of the very best weeks of my life.

For long years, the conventional wisdom among most Western intellectuals regarding the Middle East could be summed up by three words — cycle of violence. Superficially at least, the prevailing attitude regarding the struggle between Israelis and Palestinians resembled that of a parent who chastises two bickering siblings, refusing to leave an easy chair to delve into the root causes of a squabble — either to escape the tiresome process of wading through countervailing accusations or to avoid the appearance of favoritism.

“I don’t care who started it,” was the implicit message put forth by the international community. “I just want it stopped!” In reality, however, Israel played the role of the more mature, older brother, and therefore bore most of the blame and responsibility for the lack of peace.

Then September 11 happened, thanks to a group of Muslim terrorists whose central goal was the overthrow of the ibn Saud family, holders of Islam’s holy cities of Mecca and Medina. Their goals only superficially included the Palestinian cause but explicitly embraced the restoration of the Caliphate, including once-Moorish Spain.

No writer would have dared to invent scenes in which crowds of Palestinians, both in the Middle East and in immigrant communities around the world, literally cheered the pictures of the Trade Towers burning. No script consultant would have even considered having Palestinian leaders endorse al Qaida’s goals. It was too obviously an expository device designed to prove that Israel’s enemies might want more than a tad bigger slice of the disputed territories.

For balance, however, you’d have to applaud the many commentators, both in America and abroad, who blamed the terrorist attacks on America’s support for Israel. Few writers would have been so brazen, though, as to follow up the attacks on America with similar events in London and Madrid, both countries that have historically taken the Palestinian side of the argument. It was a nice counterbalance, having intellectuals argue that the attacks in Spain and England were due to their participation in the liberations of Afghanistan and Iraq. Discrediting that theory by writing homicidal terror assaults in Bali, Jakarta, Saudi Arabia, Moscow, Beslan, Paris, Turkey and Jordan, though, lacked finesse.

All these heavy-handed and gratuitously violent pedantries should have been enough to make the point that assaults on Israelis might only be part of some larger pattern of Islamist aggression: Adding a subplot in which more than a million Christians and black African Muslims are killed in the ongoing Sudanese genocide, by adherents of the Arab Sunni Islamic sect that al Qaida is part of, just seems “over-the-top.”

At this point in our movie of the mind, I’m afraid that those who continue to claim Israel is the root cause of what appears to be an international web of Islamic fascism, stretching back to the Armenian genocide and beyond, are probably beginning to come off as, well, sort of anti-Semitic. On the other hand, Israel is a long

way from America and some of those who blame the Jews for Islamic irritability may only be seeking an excuse for neutrality that doesn't require that they admit their willingness to toss tens if not hundreds of millions of people, Jew, Christian and moderate Muslim alike, to the Islamist wolves. Isolationists, after all, don't really care who the victims of tyranny are as long as they're somewhere else. And any halfway decent playwright knows good characters require nuance.

Nuance is not what we got, however, when we have the Palestinian people, usually portrayed as a peaceful if mis-managed lot, democratically elect to lead their country Hamas, a psychotically unhinged bunch of zealots whose constitution says that Jews eat Purim cookies made with Christian children's blood. Nor is it helpful to have the government of Iran promising to nuke Israel in order to bring back the Islamic messiah, especially if we're trying to keep the special effects budget under control.

But this is where our hypothetical screenwriter loses all credibility, with this preposterous Danish cartoon story arc. "Over-the-top" is the term that comes to mind when I think about having an imam from Denmark embark on an international tour of Islamic nations to gin up outrage against the very Danes who had welcomed him and his fellow immigrant Muslims into their country. Worse, it smacks of bigotry to write a "cleric" who slips into his portfolio of evidence a couple of counterfeit non-Danish cartoons portraying Mohammed as a pig and a pedophile, the latter notion apparently a particularly sensitive topic in certain spheres.

Even the choice of Denmark, from a screenwriter's perspective, lacks "balance." Having Muslims target Danes,

who have been among the Palestinians' strongest allies internationally, voting time and again to condemn Israel in the UN and other international forums, nearly has to be viewed as a gratuitous discrediting of the apologists who paint Israel, or at least support for Israel, as the insult that drives otherwise reasonable Muslims into holy frenzy.

Scenes with the embassies of Denmark, as well as any other vaguely Scandinavian-sounding country, under assault and burning in Muslim lands are so unlikely as to be patronizing. A costly international Muslim embargo imposed on Danish products is hyperbolic. In a plot twist that gives hackneyed Hollywood clichés a bad name, the demonstrators kill hundreds in the name of Allah, while sticking consistently to the theme that Jews were behind the Danish cartoons.

Finally, just to make the point that Israeli Jews might be hated simply because they are, uh, Jews, did we really need the demonstrations to spread into the very heart of the West? Did we have to have Muslim marchers in the world's capitol, seething and threatening anyone who even considers reprinting the cartoons of doom?

And the signs and banners these demonstrators brandished! What low-brow, culturally insensitive Hollywood hack would put such hatred and vitriol, threatening death to all who disobey Sharia law regarding representations of the prophets, into their hands? If you ask me, the whole thing is excessive and condescending. This is a script that will never be produced. It's just not evenhanded.



Mocking Jesus

This is a preposterous story by deluded Hollywood types, created for deluded End Times masses.

The movie *The da Vinci Code*, based on the best-selling novel of the same name by Dan Brown, opened in theaters worldwide. By the end of the summer, the movie, which attacks every major belief of the Christian faith, is expected to bring in \$500 million at the box office.

Among other things, the book and movie argue that Christ was not divine, that he was married to Mary Magdalene and had a daughter with her, and that a secret society within the Catholic Church has used the “myth” of his divinity to advance its own power and fortune. Residents of the A-Tur neighborhood on the Mount of Olives in Jerusalem in April prevented the burial in a local cemetery of Muhammad Abu al-Hawa, murdered for allegedly selling his home to Jews.



The victim's family was eventually forced to bury him in a makeshift cemetery on the road between Jerusalem and Jericho.

The body of Abu al-Hawa, a 48-year-old father of seven, was found in Jericho after he had been shot seven times in the head and chest. His body had been torched, along with his car.

Frankenstein Killed His Creator, Too

Shelly's classic is an intimate portrait of Yasser Arafat's monster, known euphemistically as "Palestinian militant groups" but rejected by their creator as "illegal" militias. Like Frankenstein's monster, when the creator died, the terrorism he spawned raged independently and out of control until it fell to his successor, PLO co-founder Mahmoud Abbas, to kill the monster for him.

And like the monster, the terrorists have chosen self-immolation, instead.

The Palestinian Mafia

"The Aksa Martyrs Brigades, the armed wing of Fatah, recently threatened to strike at US and European interests in response to international sanctions on the Palestinian Authority," reports *The Jerusalem Post's* Khaled Abu Toameh. Fatah, of course, is the "moderate" party the Palestinian Arabs voted out in favor of Hamas:

Another armed group affiliated with Fatah, the Abu Rish Brigades, threatened to launch a new intifada unless the international community agreed to fund the PA. "This will be a merciless intifada that will destroy everything," said Abu Haroon, a spokesman for the group in the Gaza Strip.

Sounds like a protection racket. Meanwhile in the *Washington Post*, Robert Malley and Aaron David Miller, who worked on the Middle East in the Clinton administration and the State Department respectively, weigh in with a fatuous op-ed urging "accommodation" between Israel and Hamas.

Can these strange bedfellows find an acceptable accommodation? That depends on whether they and others are prepared to recognize certain realities, however uncomfortable these might be.

First, Hamas will not accept the three conditions put forward by the international community (recognition of Israel, renunciation of violence, acceptance of past agreements).

Second, U.S. efforts to starve the Palestinian government of funds may be a principled position, but they are certainly not a workable policy. The result would be humanitarian catastrophe, political chaos and domestic mayhem among Palestinians — as well as resumption of full-scale violence. Instead (and parallel to Hamas's meeting the new benchmarks, particularly cessation of violence), the United States, without altering its own practice, should allow donor countries to engage with the Palestinian government and pay its employees through an international trust fund.

These warnings about the consequences of refusing to do business with Hamas are reminiscent of the arguments made in the 1980s by opponents of sanctions against South Africa—yet those sanctions surely hastened the end of apartheid. The moral case for sanctions is even stronger in the Palestinian case. Apartheid entailed the subjugation of South African blacks; Hamas seeks the elimination of Israeli Jews.

Unlock the Storehouse

Armed with key concessions from Germany, an 11-nation commission recently convened to finalize arrangements to open a vast archive documenting the death, enslavement or oppression of 17 million Jews and others deemed undesirable to the Nazi regime.

The move to unlock the storehouse of some fifty million files in the German town of Bad Arolsen comes under pressure from the dying generation of Holocaust survivors and victims' families who fear their histories will be lost forever unless the rules are changed for accessing the files.

Legal experts worked on amending the language of two documents governing the archives—a 1955 treaty among the 11 countries on the oversight commission, and an agreement between those countries and the International Committee of the Red Cross which administers the archive.

The countries on the International Commission are Belgium, France, Germany, Greece, Italy, Israel, Luxembourg, the Netherlands, Poland, Britain and the United States.

The proposed changes would give historical researchers immediate access to the cavernous rooms at Bad Arolsen containing concentration camp registrations, death certificates, transit lists and other minutiae of evil that the Nazis meticulously recorded.

They also would allow each of the 11 countries to obtain a digital copy of the Bad Arolsen archive and to make it available to researchers and victims' relatives in those countries under controlled conditions.

Still unresolved were issues dealing with how quickly the Bad Arolsen archive could be copied into digital files and distributed to the member countries, and how to speed up the pace of ratification, delegates said.

The International Tracing Service, the Red Cross custodian of the archive, says it has scanned 56 percent of the files since 1999, but it cannot move faster without more funding.

The tracing service is funded by Germany, which until recently had opposed opening the archive to public access and historical research, arguing that it would violate German privacy laws.

The ITS, which has 400 employees, was founded after the war to trace missing persons, including six million Jews killed in an assembly-line slaughter, and millions of displaced German civilians. ✱

Our readers need to understand that the government of Israel provides airfare for any new Jewish immigrant who remains two years. Not only that, Israel provides new immigrants with rental subsidies, partial grants toward the purchase of a home, free language instruction, a stipend for those without employment and free elementary schooling.

I realize that many well-known Christians have seemingly endorsed what Rabbi Eckstein is doing. It's entirely possible that they aren't aware of all of the facts.

With regard to a fellowship between Christians and Jews, this is another matter for theology. Is it possible to have fellowship with people who don't share our faith that Jesus is the promised crucified and risen Messiah for Jews and gentiles?

In II Corinthians 6:14, we read, *Do not be bound together with unbelievers; for what partnership have righteousness and lawlessness, or what fellowship has light with darkness?* (emphasis added). That doesn't mean that all believers always behave righteously and all unbelievers behave unrighteously, but even as you can't bind righteousness and lawlessness together, so you can't find unity in matters of faith between believers and unbelievers.

Most evangelical Christians fail to recognize that fellowship is a function of faith and that there are not many different kinds of faith. *There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism.* (Ephesians 4:5, emphasis added.)

I'm not advocating we stay away from unbelievers; we've got to reach out to them in love with the gospel. However, I will not advocate a friendship with someone who uses his friendship to make people ashamed of telling the Gospel. ✱



Mideast Jokes

Did you hear the one about the father of the Arab suicide bomber?

“I’m so proud of little Mahmoud,” he said. “You know, it’s funny about kids — they blow up so fast!”

I admit it. It’s a sick joke. But it’s a kind of metaphor for the madness taking place in the Middle East today.

If it wasn’t all a matter of life and death, it would be humorous. If it wasn’t all a matter of preventing another holocaust, it would be laughable. If it wasn’t all a matter of preserving Western Civilization from perhaps its gravest threat, it would be a laugh riot.

Unfortunately, what is happening in Israel and the Palestinian Authority today is not funny. It is tragic. And the stakes are life and death — not only for individuals, but for entire peoples, even civilization itself.

When Alexander Solzhenitsyn was asked what had happened to drive Russia to the insanity of exterminating tens of millions of her own people while holding the survivors in captivity, he said: “We forgot about God.”

I suggest to you that is precisely the problem in Israel today.



Israel, the little Jewish state that witnessed the demise of so many empires throughout history, dispatched its prime minister, Ehud Olmert, to Washington recently to meet with the power that has replaced God in its national life — the United States of America.

I can understand how Israel has come to feel dependent on the United States—the only nation in the world that has been a true ally of the Jewish state throughout most of the last 57 years.

I can even understand how the United States might believe it could win hearts and minds in the Arab and Muslim world by coercing Israel to turn over more and more land to its sworn enemies.

What I cannot understand is how, after seeing the failed results of 15 years of this kind of appeasement, neither leaders in the United States nor Israel have figured out they are writing a recipe for disaster.

When Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait, the United States didn’t offer him Saudi Arabia for peace. They kicked his army out of Kuwait and dictated his terms of surrender.

When Saddam Hussein violated those terms of surrender by refusing to accede to the demands of weapons inspectors, the United States didn’t offer to extend his rule over the kingdom of Jordan to enlist his cooperation with Hans Blix. The United States overthrew the dictator with extreme prejudice.

When Osama bin Laden attacked the United States with his team of suicide hijackers, the United States did not offer al-Qaida Rhode Island in exchange for a truce. The United States invaded Afghanistan, overthrew the government that supported bin Laden and continues to occupy it to this day.

When the Japanese empire attacked Pearl Harbor, the United States did not send tribute to Tokyo to prevent future misunderstandings. The United States declared war, eventually dropped two atomic bombs on Japan and occupied the country until all possibility of misunderstandings was eliminated.

Nevertheless, the United States seems to have a different expectation of behavior in its ally Israel than it does for itself. Ever since the “Oslo peace process” of the early 1990s, the United States has been pushing little Israel to appease its enemies at almost any cost.

If it means turning over land won in hard-fought combat to hostile and recalcitrant enemies, the United States pushes it and Israel accedes.

If it means evacuating long-standing Jewish communities because those hostile and recalcitrant enemies don’t like living near Jews, the United States pushes it and Israel accedes.

If it means dividing the nation in half to make room for another Mideast terrorist state, the United States pushes it and Israel accedes.

Even if it means sharing its capital city of Jerusalem with its implacable foes, the United States pushes it and Israel accedes. All of this, of course, after Israel had turned over administrative authority of the only holy site in Judaism — the Temple Mount — to those selfsame adversaries.

But the real price tag will be much higher than the \$10 billion in blood money Olmert seeks for his diabolical surrender plan. The real cost will be in more Jewish and Christian lives at the hands of the jubilant jihadists.

It's 1938 Again

When something happens for the first time in 1,871 years, it is worth noting. In A.D. 70, and again in 135, the Roman Empire brutally put down Jewish revolts in Judea, destroying Jerusalem, killing hundreds of thousands of Jews and sending hundreds of thousands more into slavery and exile. For nearly two millennia, the Jews wandered the world. And now, in 2006, for the first time since then, there are once again more Jews living in Israel—the successor state to Judea—than in any other place on Earth.

Israel's Jewish population has just passed 5.6 million. America's Jewish population was about 5.5 million in 1990, dropped to about 5.2 million 10 years later and is in a precipitous decline that, because of low fertility rates and high levels of assimilation, will cut that number in half by mid-century.

When 6 million European Jews were killed in the Holocaust, only two main centers of Jewish life remained: America and Israel. That binary star system remains today, but a tipping point has just been reached. With every year, as the Jewish population continues to rise in Israel and decline in America (and in the rest of the Diaspora), Israel increasingly becomes, as it was at the time of Jesus, the center of the Jewish world.

An epic restoration, and one of the most improbable. To take just one of the remarkable achievements of the return: Hebrew is the only “dead” language in recorded history to have been brought back to daily use as the living language of a nation. But there is a price and a danger to this transformation. It radically alters the prospects for Jewish survival.

For 2,000 years, Jews found protection in dispersion — protection not for individual communities, which were routinely persecuted and massacred, but protection for the Jewish people as a whole. Decimated here, they could survive there. They could be persecuted in Spain and find refuge in Constantinople. They could be massacred in the Rhineland during the Crusades or in the Ukraine during the Khmelnytsky Insurrection of 1648-49 and yet survive in the rest of Europe.

Hitler put an end to that illusion. He demonstrated that modern anti-Semitism married to modern technology — railroads, disciplined bureaucracies, gas chambers that kill with industrial efficiency — could take a scat-

tered people and “concentrate” them for annihilation.

The establishment of Israel was a Jewish declaration to a world that had allowed the Holocaust to happen — after Hitler had made his intentions perfectly clear — that the Jews would henceforth resort to self-protection and self-reliance. And so they have, building a Jewish army, the first in 2,000 years that prevailed in three great wars of survival (1948-49, 1967 and 1973).

But in a cruel historical irony, doing so required concentration — putting all the eggs back in one basket, a tiny territory hard by the Mediterranean, eight miles wide at its waist. A tempting target for those who would finish Hitler's work.

His successors now reside in Tehran. The world has paid ample attention to President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad's declaration that Israel must be destroyed. Less attention has been paid to Iranian leaders' pronouncements on exactly how Israel would be “eliminated by one storm,” as Ahmadinejad has promised.

Former president Ali Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani, the presumed moderate of this gang, has explained that “the use of a nuclear bomb in Israel will leave nothing on the ground, whereas it will only damage the world of Islam.” The logic is impeccable, the intention clear: A nuclear attack would effectively destroy tiny Israel, while any retaliation launched by a dying Israel would have no major effect on an Islamic civilization of a billion people stretching from Mauritania to Indonesia.

As it races to acquire nuclear weapons, Iran makes clear that if there is any trouble, the Jews will be the first to suffer. **“The Jews will be the first...”** “We have announced that wherever [in Iran] America does make any mischief, the first place we target will be Israel,” said Gen. Mohammad Ebrahim Dehghani, a top Revolutionary Guards commander. Hitler was only slightly more direct when he announced seven months before invading Poland that, if there was another war, “the result will be...the annihilation of the Jewish race in Europe.”


Recently Bernard Lewis, America's dean of Islamic studies, who just turned 90 and remembers the 20th century well, confessed that for the first time he feels it is 1938 again. He did not need to add that in 1938, in the face of the gathering storm — a fanatical, aggressive, openly declared enemy of the West, and most determinedly of the Jews — the world did nothing.

When Iran's mullahs acquire their coveted nukes in the next few years, the number of Jews in Israel will just be reaching 6 million. Never again? ❖

"Islam is a Backward Religion"

Former Muslim, Arab-American psychologist Waqfa Sultan, recently debated a Muslim cleric (Ibrahim Al-Khouli) and slammed Islam on the pan-Arab satellite TV station Al-Jazeera. The internet clip of her debate has been viewed more than one million times. This translation below is provided by the Middle East Media Research Institute (MEMRI).



Sultan: The clash we are witnessing around the world is not a clash of religions, or a clash of civilizations. It is a clash between two opposites, between two eras. It is a clash between a mentality that belongs to the Middle Ages and another mentality that belongs to the 21st Century. It is a clash between civilization and backwardness, between the civilized and the primitive, between barbarity and rationality. It is a clash between freedom and oppression, between democracy and dictatorship. It is a clash between human rights on one hand, and the violation of these rights on the other hand. It is a clash between those who treat women like beasts and those who treat them like human beings.

Host: Do I understand from your words that what is happening today is a clash between the culture of the West, and the backwardness and ignorance of the Muslims?... Who came up with the concept of a clash of civilizations? Was it not Samuel Huntington? It was not bin Laden.

Sultan: The Muslims are the ones who began using this expression. The Muslims are the ones who began the clash of civilizations. The Prophet of Islam said: "I was ordered to fight the people until they believe in Allah and His Messenger." When the Muslims divided the people into Muslims and non-Muslims, and called to fight the others until they believe in what they them-

selves believe, they started this clash, and began this war. In order to start this war, they must reexamine their Islamic books and curricula which are full of calls for *takfir* (excommunication) and fighting the infidels.

What civilization on the face of this earth allows him to call other people by names that they did not choose for themselves? First he calls them [the Jews] *ahl al-dimma* [People of the Covenant], then he calls them the "People of the Book" and yet another time he compares them to apes and pigs' and he calls the Christians "those who incur Allah's wrath."

Who told you that they are "People of the Book?" They are not the People of the Book, they are people of many books. All the useful scientific books that you have today are theirs, the fruit of their free and creative thinking. What gives you the right to call them "those who incur Allah's wrath," or "those who have gone astray," and then come here and say that your religion commands you to refrain from offending the beliefs of others?

Al-Khouli: Are you a heretic?... If you are a heretic, there is no point in rebuking you, since you have blasphemed against Islam, the Prophet, and the Koran.

Sultan: Brother, you can believe in stones, as long as you don't throw them at me. You are free to worship whoever you want, but other people's beliefs are not your concern.

The Jews have come from the tragedy [of the Holocaust] and have forced the world to respect them, with their knowledge, not with their terror, with their work, not their whining and yelling. Humanity owes most of the discoveries and science of the 19th and 20th centuries to Jewish scientists. Fifteen million people, scattered throughout the world, united and won their rights through work and knowledge.

We have not seen a single Jew blow himself up in a German restaurant. We have not seen a single Jew destroy a church. We have not seen a single Jew protest by killing people. The Muslims have turned three Buddha statues into rubble. We have not seen a single Buddhist burn down a Mosque, kill a Muslim, or burn down an embassy. Only the Muslims defend their beliefs by burning down churches, killing people and destroying embassies. This path will not yield any results.

The Muslims must ask themselves what they can do for mankind before they demand that mankind respect them.

Jewish Cowboy Runs for Texas Governor

Candidates for Texas governor have already begun campaigning, and one candidate riding on everybody's heels is none other than a Jewish cowboy.



Richard "Kinky" Friedman, a former country singer, is running as an independent candidate and believes he can win with his 13-inch talking action figure and campaign slogans such as, "Trust me, I'm a Jew — I'll hire good people," and "My governor is a Jewish cowboy."

While these slogans may be a bit unusual, they're catching on with Texans, already known for their state pride. "In terms of his slogans, I have to say that I love them," Gaia Maullem, a Jew from Houston, told *Israel Today*. "It makes me feel like he's keeping with Texas tradition but making it his own."

A Jewish governor is not a new phenomenon for the United States, but his prospective politician makes no bones about mixing "synagogue and state." He plans to place a *mezuzah* [protective scroll] on the governor's mansion and pardon Max Soffar, the only Jew on death row.

Friedman's songs contain a country Jewish twang and titles such as *Ride em' Jewboy*, a song about the Holocaust, and *They Don't Make Jews Like Jesus Anymore*.

Choices and Consequences

Israel Today

The Palestinian people voted for Hamas. It was their choice, let them live with their choice. There are consequences to everyone's choices. Why should the Palestinians be any different?

Members of the Quartet (European Union, United States, the United Nations and Russia) agreed recently on an "international mechanism" to directly transfer funds to the Palestinians. This channeling of aid will be a three-month trial period. United States Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice said she was concerned about the situation because while governments don't want to see Palestinians suffer, they don't want to deal with a government responsible for terror attacks.

The US announced that it would transfer \$10 million to the PA as part of a health care program. The European Union suggested transferring funds directly to Palestinian Authority Chairman Mahmoud Abbas in order to bypass Hamas and serve humanitarian needs.

Foreign Minister Tzipi Livni supports Quartet aid if it serves PA humanitarian needs. He approved of the Quartet's decision as long as the money reached the Palestinian population. "The big question is, where will the money go? Israel was always in favor of giving money to the Palestinian population but not via the Palestinian Authority," she said. Livni also conveyed that they must decide how these funds will operate as she believes it is important to keep the Hamas-led Palestinian Authority an illegitimate entity. The US and EU have cut off direct aid to the PA government, but are bending over backwards to meet humanitarian needs. Israel has refused to transfer \$55 million in monthly tax revenues to the Hamas-led government.


News from a Dead Society

Several thousand Hamas supporters gathered recently to collect money and jewelry for the cash-strapped Palestinian government, criticizing Western economic pressure on the Islamic group.

Some 5,000 people joined the demonstration, most of them wearing green Hamas hats and clothing. People announced over megaphones how much participants were donating. Some said they were donating their entire paychecks.

“These donations are our way of telling the world that we can live without them, and our children are paying what the Europeans should be paying,” said Bassam al-Shaqqa, a former mayor of Nablus.

Concerned about the worsening situation, Western donors have agreed to restore some humanitarian aid to the Palestinians. But it remains unclear when the money will start flowing.

Representatives of the US, UN, EU and Russia began to discuss requests of the PA to renew financial support in light of its inability to pay salaries or provide services. In the first part of the discussion, Quartet members were joined by the foreign ministers of Egypt, Jordan and Saudi Arabia.

US Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice said that “the one thing that we cannot do is to let Hamas continue to pretend that it’s the international community’s fault that there’s a health care problem in the Palestinian territories.”

“Remarkable Resiliency”

Moody’s Investors Service recently raised to “positive” from “stable” the outlook on Israel’s key foreign-currency ratings, saying the country has shown “remarkable resiliency” in meeting the numerous challenges of the last few years. “Israeli institutions have proved to be extremely robust in the face of considerable external and internal shocks, including global recession, the incapacitation of Prime Minister Ariel Sharon, the reformulation of the political spectrum, and repeated terrorist threats and actions.

“When combined with the unusual sources of financial assistance afforded by various programs of the US government and Israelis and Jews living outside Israel, the result over time may imply a diminution of credit risk,” the ratings agency said.

The outlook change affects Israel’s foreign-currency ceiling, its foreign-currency government bonds (not guaranteed by the US government), its foreign-currency bank deposit ceiling, and its local-currency bonds (all currently rated “A2”). Israel’s local-currency bank deposit ceiling (“Aa2”) and its local currency guideline (“Aa1”) have a “stable” outlook and were not affected by the rating action.

Moody’s also noted that Israel was exhibiting considerable growth of gross domestic product per capita (purchasing power parity basis), moving towards a level more often associated with advanced economies than with developing ones.

Opposing Israel—Again

Former President Jimmy Carter says Israel’s unilateral plan to establish its own geographical borders is an “illegal action” that must not be accepted as a permanent solution to a longstanding problem. In an op-ed published in *USA Today*, Carter said Olmert’s plan would effectively divide the Palestinian West Bank into three parts.



“This confiscation of land is to be carried out without resorting to peace talks with the Palestinians, and in direct contravention of the ‘road map for peace,’ which President Bush helped to initiate and has strongly supported,” Carter wrote.

“What is the alternative to this ill-advised move toward the unilateral confiscation and colonization of a major portion of the West Bank?” Carter asked, answering his own question: “Good-faith negotiations should be initiated under the auspices of the international Quartet with President Abbas.” Presumably, these talks would be monitored and orchestrated by the United States, and any successfully negotiated terms of the road map would subsequently be approved by both Israelis and Palestinians. Carter said although it will be difficult to come up with a mutually acceptable agreement, the final document must include “reasonable border compromises based on the swapping of land, which could leave a substantial number of Israeli settlers undisturbed on Palestinian land.”

Such an agreement would also result in Arab nations fully recognizing Israel, and “permanent peace and justice for the Palestinians.” Carter said realization of such an agreement would eliminate a major cause of international terrorism — “and greatly ease tensions that could precipitate a regional or even global conflict.”
