

Messianic Jew on Christmas

Growing up in Israel in the 1970s and 80s, I had no idea about Christmas other than the

Christmas on December 25. It was just another day.

In my early 20s, after I came to faith in Yeshua, my wife and I moved to the U.S. Then, I experienced the Christmas holiday that, as a Jew, I had never known. The colorful lights and decorations, along with the holiday gatherings, made that dark and cold time of the year joyful and beautiful. It was special to join with fellow Believers* during Christmas church services worshiping the King of Israel. The words of Christmas songs celebrating the birth of the Jewish Messiah in my homeland, Israel, touched me deeply.

Baby Jesus

Beyond the consumerism and materialism that infiltrate much of America's Christcredit: Maria Levkina/ iStocs mas season, one thing about the holiday felt a little strange to me — the widespread focus on Yeshua as a baby. I was already a Believer, but I gave little thought to Him as a baby. However, as I considered this "baby Jesus" focus during Christmas, I realized that Isaiah spoke of the Child Messiah. The terms that the prophet used to describe this special Child are a majestic description of His mighty and awesome character and calling.

What Child is This?

Isaiah 9:6 describes the Child who will carry the government on His shoulders. God's juxtaposing the smallness and weakness of a human child with the weight of this mighty calling on His shoulders highlights the plan of salvation in such an astounding way!

Next come the heavy titles that this Child carries: Wonderful Counselor, Mighty

God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Each title reveals who Yeshua is — His calling and identity. The nuances in the original Hebrew terms reveal different levels of meaning and connections that can be lost in translation.

Pele Yoetz (Wonderful Counselor) — If we allow Yeshua to be our personal Counselor, He will do wonders in our lives! Pele is the Hebrew word for "wonder," and Messiah's name as "Wonderful" recalls a scene in the Torah where the "Man God" in the form of the Angel of Yahweh describes Himself to Samson's father in Judges 13:18, saying: "My name is

wonderful (pele)."

El Gibor (Mighty God)

— This title makes
absolutely clear
that the Messiah
who is born a
human child is
the Mighty God
Himself!

Avi'Ad (Everlasting Father)
— This title can be confusing because Yeshua is God the Son, but He is not God the Father. So, what does this mean? Here, understand-

ing the Hebrew can be helpful. Looking at the Hebrew grammar, Avi'Ad can just as easily be translated as "Father of Eternity," which makes much more sense: It is only through Yeshua that we have eternal life. He is the Father of our eternal life.

Sar Shalom (Prince of Peace) — This Child is the bringer of peace — first in our hearts in this age. Then in the Messianic age, He will be the One who brings global peace — a great task indeed!

To everyone who celebrates the birth of our Messiah this Christmas season, I pray that the deep and awesome revelation of the Child who is Mighty God fills your hearts with wonder and light!

What made this gift outstanding was not the shotgun itself but what it represented — a priceless, self-sacrificial love. That shotgun said to me that Cynthia understands and cherishes who I am and acts on it at personal expense. Her gift to me was vastly greater than the one I might have chosen for myself.

The best gifts are not beautiful, expensive, or even what we think we want. The best gifts are meaningful; they say, "I love you" by communicating, "I understand who you are."

During Hanukkah, Yeshua (Jesus) pointed to Himself as just such a gift. With the Maccabee victory over the Greeks on their minds during Hanukkah (the Feast of Dedication, John 10:22–39), the Jewish leadership in Yeshua's time had a vivid picture of the "gift" they wanted.

Here's what they asked: "How long will you keep us in suspense? If you are the Messiah, tell us plainly" (John 10:24). Here's what they wanted to know: "Are you the gift we want, a Maccabee-like Messiah who will ascend David's throne as king in Jerusalem, vanquish our Roman overlords,

drive them from the land, and bring peace, prosperity, and justice to Israel, thus establishing God's promised Kingdom throughout the Earth?" Nothing less would make them happy.

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Yeshua's reply, "I told you, and you do not believe" (John 10:25), explained why many struggled to recognize Him as Messiah. He was offering something greater than mere political deliverance (John 10:28). Then He shocked them by saying, "I and the Father are one" (John 10:30) — a direct claim to deity and equality with God!

Why, at Hanukkah, did Yeshua point to His deity in response to their question about the Messiah? Because He was offering a gift vastly more valuable, the one that they would not have chosen for themselves.

Like us, the religious leaders in the first century thought that what they needed and wanted could be provided by political, economic, and social means. They assumed that if God provided the right man to rule on Israel's throne with enough power and authority, that leader would rid them of their enemies, bringing peace and prosperity to their nation.

Yeshua knew that even if they got what they wanted, it would not be enough.

The Maccabees themselves experienced this. Their 164 B.C. victory over Antiochus IV Epiphanes and subsequent rededication of the Second Temple, both hard-won military and political struggles, were short-lived. By 67 B.C. the corruption of Israel's leadership, themselves descended from the Maccabees, resulted in a civil war and the conquest of Jerusalem by Rome's General Pompey in 63 B.C.

Yeshua understood the reason for this failure. Until our inborn rebellion against God's rule in our lives is transformed, and His Kingdom is established on Earth, we are doomed to live out the same failures and defeats, generation after generation.

In the wake of the horrors of October 7 in Israel and the subsequent display of worldwide anti-Semitism, my people (the Jewish people) are longing once again for our enemy's defeat so we can live in peace. And like our ancestors — the Maccabees and the people of Yeshua's day — my people's hope

is in military and political leaders. They are unaware that even the best outcome of the current conflict will be temporary.


What we really need is not new leaders, but new life — something God alone provides. By pointing to His deity during Hanukkah, Yeshua is saying, "I am the gift you really need, offered in love and at great personal cost."

As we pray for Israel's military victory over Hamas, and a just and peaceful political future for Gazans and Israelis alike, let us not fail to pray for many to find the narrow path leading to life, and the lasting peace of Messiah's Millennial rule on Earth.



Seeking Shalom

Do you remember the famous song, *The Impossible Dream*, from the Broadway musical *Man of La Mancha*? The main character, Don Quixote, sings of a quest: "To right the unrightable wrong, to love pure and chaste from afar, to try when your arms are too weary, to reach the unreachable star."

Don Quixote was on a quest to find something he did not have. I can relate to his quest, as I seem to be searching for the impossible dream of *shalom* in this time of great sorrow and unrest. For some reason, sorrow seems more prevalent than peace. While some people use the Hebrew word *shalom* to refer to the absence of conflict, it has a deeper meaning. It reflects a state of harmony and tranquility that goes beyond external circumstances.

Peace on Earth

Whether you celebrate Hanukkah, Christmas, or both, we are in a season when we seek "peace on Earth, goodwill to men," as the angel proclaimed to the shepherds in the fields of Bethlehem (Luke 2:14). Many people desire peace and goodwill for others. But why does it seem so difficult to find lately?

The ongoing Israeli conflict has deprived many of the peace that they desire. I can't imagine the horrors experienced by the families of Israeli captives who wonder whether their child, sibling, or spouse is still alive in Gaza. Will they ever see their loved ones again? What atrocities

have they experienced over the past 14 months? How do Israelis even get up each day and function normally in the present while being constantly flooded with thoughts of the agonizing past and an uncertain future?

In John 14:27 (TLV), Jesus stressed, "Shalom I leave you, My shalom I give to you; but not as the world gives! Do not let your heart be troubled or afraid." The only way that we can achieve peace is by seeking God's presence. Jesus promised that we can find true shalom through Him. That is truly wonderful news!



Don't Judge Me?

This won't be a typical Hanukkah or Christmas narrative, but it's Biblical and divinely inspired.

Almost 3,500 years ago, God called Moses to lead the Israelites out of Egypt. Along this arduous journey, Joshua zealously committed to Moses until Moses' rebellion prohibited him from entering the Promised Land. Because of Joshua's (and Caleb's) faithfulness, God eventually promoted him to lead Israel in claiming their inheritance. During Joshua's lifetime at war, he followed one essential refrain: Choose you this day whom you will serve ... but as for me and my house, we will serve the LORD (Josh. 24:15).

Upon Joshua's death, the period of the Judges begins. Throughout this era, Israel fell into one of two traps that continually plagued the nation: sin or disbelief. Regardless of how many times God delivered Israel, at some point the nation (not unlike a professional football player who lost his short-term memory) started sinning again with the idols of their neighbors. This is more than rebellion — it's a literal conversion! They abandoned

faith or belief in one deity for another. Since they were isolated — living in territorial tribes without clear leadership for a united nation — neighboring enemies overtook Israel again and again because God removed His hand of protection.

Why all the back story? (Yes, we know that this remedial history could be covered in 32 felt board lessons in Sunday School.) In the Book of Judges, God has a unique way of delivering Israel; it's not by a king, a president, or a Homeowners Association (HOA — We firmly believe that HOAs are unbiblical, but that's another story). God used flawed, average, normal people — just like you and us — to save the Israelites.

What was the prerequisite for being an Othniel, Gideon, Samson, Shamgar, Deborah, Jephthah, or Ehud? The answer is simple: being willing(ish). For an example of this, look at Gideon. There's a reason the word "fleece" is synonymous with him. Gideon nervously asked God for so many confirming signs that the dictionary should have put his picture next to the entry for "fleece."



The Book of Judges chronicles some of the most epic, violent, and crazy histories in the Bible. Ever heard of Shamgar? His whole life warrants a single verse: After Ehud came Shamgar son of Anath, who struck down six hundred Philistines with an oxgoad. He too saved Israel (Judg. 3:31).

Imagine being the guy who smote 600 Philistines with a pointed stick!

God has one condition for using anyone: obedience. The Father calls on "regular" people to change the world, yet we typically disqualify ourselves because we refuse to obey. Some of us question our value, while others may blatantly rebel or won't let go of sin. Remember, before God used Gideon to defeat the Midianites, the Lord first required him to destroy the local Baal altar. Unfortunately, failure to destroy local altars is where God loses most applicants.

Even today, the "wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). The United States and our world stand at a pivotal junction in

history. Soon, we may suffer bondage for our sin, just as the ancient Israelites did. While the elections are over (and you may not like the outcome), God is still searching for righteous men and women to stand up and lead His people to repentance. Just as during the time of the Judges, He's not looking for a king, but a willing servant:


For the eyes of the LORD run to and fro throughout the whole Earth, to show Himself strong on behalf of those whose heart is loyal to Him (2 Chron. 16:9).

Don't be caught clinging to sin. Make the choice now to be ready, vigilant, and willing to usher in God's world-changing presence.

Classic **Zola**Truth and Peace

I was amazed by the recent headline in *The Dallas Morning News:* "Battle Call by Arafat Fuels Riot." I think this is the first time since 1969, when Arafat's long and bloody reign began, that an American newspaper has acknowledged that the Palestinian dictator, a terrorist his whole life, has caused the terrorism in Israel.

With the media, which dutifully films every Palestinian funeral (have we ever seen so many funerals filmed during "wars"?), the Palestinian mobs are whipped into a virulent frenzy (for the cameras) and fight hopelessly, wielding rocks against guns. Arafat has called them "to continue, wave after wave ... until victory."

The Israelis, for their part, try to dissuade them as gently as possible, which is not easy with a frantic mob. When one considers the superior weaponry Israel has and the small casualty figures that have actually occurred, we must realize that Israel is being very patient. They are reasoning that there has to be a moment when even the most dedicated Palestinian zealot will understand that this "battle" is pointless and hopeless.

At fault is the peace process. Nine years of false hopes and posturing by diplo-

mats and handshakes for cameras have produced exactly nothing. In fact, the process has gone backward. Rather than youngsters throwing small stones at a few border policemen, we now have Palestinian adults using the rifles (given to them to police their own people) against Israeli regular army soldiers. Since false peace is the theme of the upcoming Tribulation period, many feel that the present situation leads directly to the antiChrist. The most serious point of the media coverage of this so-called "war" is that it brings international pressure to bear upon Israel, which is a major theme of the Great Tribulation.

Some people ask, "Why should we pray for the peace of Jerusalem when we know from prophecy that there won't really be peace until the Prince of Peace returns?" The answer to that is that it is God's own request (Ps. 122:6), and that even if the ultimate outcome is Armageddon, peace on any potential battlefield will preserve lives, among which will be some saved souls. We are never to turn our backs on Israel. That is the meaning of this ministry's criticism of liberal churches, our battles with the seminaries, and our constant teaching of the relevance of the prophets of the



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Old Testament and the fully Jewish New Testament. Bible, Bible, and Bible is the solution to all of Israel's woes and to our own, as well, and any Believer knows that. Pretending that one is teaching the Bible while one is actually teaching error is no better than pretending to make peace while one is throwing rocks. But just as surely as Arafat cries, "This Intifada will never stop," some seminaries cry, "We will never abandon our false teaching."

What should be understood about the Arabs who call themselves Palestinians is that they are not particularly religious people. Jerusalem doesn't mean much to the vast majority of them, and Israel itself was never their land. Among these rioting mobs there are typically a few rabble-rousers, a bunch of neutral people trying to stay away from the front, and thousands who just yell slogans and pose for TV cameras. And finally, citizen for citizen, the majority of Palestinians would much rather live under the Israeli government than the corrupt regime of Arafat and his henchmen. So would most other citizens of the world.

The news keeps repeating that it is the Israelis who are the occupiers, and that the peace process might yet work. Neither one of those things is even remotely true, and the whole world knows it.

The peace process can be given credit


for nothing. The silly "Arab Summit" in

Cairo — the Olympics of Israel-bashing — tried to make world headlines about Israel's supposed "war crimes." Even American reporters are smarter than that (in general).

The Dallas Morning News called the unrest an "age-old conflict." Truthfully, the conflict started in 1987 and is 13 years old. Another columnist, Bill Maxwell, wrote in the Morning News, "Why argue who came first, the Jews or the Palestinians?" Well, the Jews came in 2,000 B.C. — 4,000 years ago — and the Palestinians in A.D. 1964 — 36 years ago. So, I'm not arguing, either.

Here's an idea going around the Knesset (the Israeli Parliament): If there were a legitimate peace treaty that really held, then the countries would live separately but peacefully in Israel. As things are now, some Knesset members have thought of drawing a line on the ground and building a big fence or whatever, and unilaterally severing from the Palestinians, period. They will show passports like any visitors to come into Israel. If that's how the peace process has to end, then as the Israelis say, "Lu Y'hi — Let it be."

Ask the Chaplain

Who Are the Elect of God?

Part 1

The elect are those who have been chosen and predestined by God for salvation and service to Him. Just as an employer chooses to hire an employee, so God chooses to elect every person whom He will save.

Faith follows election; God chooses first before anyone can choose Him. Jesus affirms this: "You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you" (John 15:16).

God chose the elect in eternity past — before anything was created, or humanity fell into sin. Paul states this in Ephesians 1:4 when referring to Believers: "He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world."

The doctrine of divine election — God's choosing the elect beforehand — is taught throughout Scripture. In the Old Testament, eight passages emphasize Israel as God's elect (Deut. 7:6; Ex. 19:4–6; Ps. 135:4; Isa. 41:8–9; 43:10; 44:1–2; 45:4; Amos 3:2). Despite Israel's widespread unbelief toward Jesus, God reaffirms their election in the New Testament (Rom. 11:1–3). When Jesus returns, Israel's elect destiny will resume in the coming Messianic Kingdom.


Several New Testament passages (John 10:4-5; 1 Thess. 1:4-5; Eph. 1:4-14; 1 Pet. 1:1-2; 2:9; 5:13) also affirm the Church as God's elect. The Church includes those chosen and called from all nations, both Jews and gentiles who are redeemed through faith in Jesus Christ. Election is based solely on God's will rather than human actions, whether good or bad. Paul references Jacob and Esau in the womb (Gen. 25:21-23) to prove this: "For the children not yet being born, nor having done any good or evil, that the purpose of God according to election might stand, not of works but of Him who calls" (Rom. 9:11). Divine election also depends solely on God's sovereign grace and mercy (Rom. 11:5-6) rather than human activity (Rom. 9:16).

Election is based upon God's foreknowledge (1 Pet. 1:2), which means that God knows everything that will happen. Still, humans are responsible to believe the Gospel of Christ for salvation. For those who reject the Gospel, God will hold them accountable for their unbelief on the Day of Judgment.



Next month, we will consider the relationship between predestination and election.




Model of the Second Temple as it might have appeared in A.D. 66 (Israel Museum, Jerusalem)


Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu



Mark Memmott (left) CBS News's senior director of standards and practices, emailed all of the network's employees in August, directing them

to "be careful with some terms when we talk or write about the news" from Israel and Gaza.

According to a report in *The Free Press*, Memmott instructed all CBS journalists and reporters regarding Jerusalem: "Do not refer to it as being in Israel. Yes, the U.S. embassy is there, and the Trump administration recognized it as being Israel's capital. But its status is disputed. The status of Jerusalem goes to the heart of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. Israel regards Jerusalem as its 'eternal and undivided' capital, while the Palestinians claim East Jerusalem — occupied by Israel in the 1967 Middle East war — as the capital of a future state."

Jerusalem was unified in the 1967 Six-Day War and annexed in its entirety by the Israeli government under the Basic Law: Jerusalem, Capital of Israel passed by the Knesset in July 1980. While the U.S. government recognized Jerusalem as Israel's capital under the Jerusalem Embassy Act that Congress passed in 1995, President Donald Trump finally opened a U.S. embassy in Jerusalem in 2018.

The story comes as part of ongoing revelations made by *The Free Press* on "a double standard [that] exists for journal-

ism at CBS when it relates to Israel and Jews."

A previous report revealed a recent meeting of CBS Mornings' editorial team debating whether it is "fair to talk about whether Israel should exist at all." During the debate, Tony Dokoupil was admonished by CBS News leadership for his tough questioning of Ta-Nehisi Coates about the inaccuracies and anti-Israel views that Coates expressed in his new book, The Message.

"Why leave out that Israel is surrounded by countries that want to eliminate it? Why leave out that Israel deals with terror groups that want to eliminate it?" Dokoupil had asked Coates.

One CBS employee told *The Free Press* that the controversy surrounding Dokoupil, who is Jewish, has revealed a double standard at the network. "There is a huge difference between how all ethnic or minority groups are treated and how Jews and Jewish issues are treated," the CBS insider noted. "The rule of thumb is: If you are Jewish and you are interested in reporting on Jews or Jewish issues, that's a 'hold on' or a 'no,' whereas for any other group it would be an enthusiastic 'yes.""

A legal watchdog group filed a complaint with the FCC, accusing CBS News of "significant and intentional news distortion" in its editing of the 60 Minutes interview with Kamala Harris that aired on October 7. —Mark \$\Phi\$

Smartwatches Could Cut Spread of Contagious Disease

Physiological sensors in smartwatches can detect infectious diseases days before symptoms appear, potentially averting future pandemics. In a two-year study involving nearly 5,000 partici-

study involving nearly 5,000 participants, researchers from Tel Aviv University (TAU) found that the wearables could detect changes in vital signs 23 hours before the first COVID-19 symptom, 62 hours before symptoms of Group A streptococcus (GAS), and 73 hours before influenza symptoms appeared.

The findings also suggest that early detection via wearable technology can prompt reduced social contacts when a contagious disease is most infectious, thus potentially preventing widespread outbreak.

"Previous studies have shown that during the recent pandemic, about 40% of all transmissions occurred about a day before the first symptoms appeared. In other words, the person transmitting the disease was not yet aware that he/she was infected," noted TAU Prof. Dan Yamin, who led the study, which was published in The Lancet Regional Health-Europe.

Participants answered daily health questionnaires and also wore smart-watches that continuously monitored key physiological parameters. The smartwatches recorded pulse rate and heart rate variability (HRV) at 15-second intervals, providing data on heart and brain activity.

"When a person becomes ill, the immune system prioritizes fighting the disease, keeping the heart rate relatively steady and reducing HRV. These changes indicate physical stress," Yamin explained.

Participants also had home test kits for COVID-19, influenza, and GAS, which they used at their discretion.

Over two years, the researchers collected 800,000 questionnaires and compared this data with the smartwatch readings, documenting 2,206 COVID-19 cases, 490 influenza cases, and 320 GAS cases.

Researchers found that the first physiological anomaly in heart rate measures appeared 96 hours after exposure to COVID-19, but individuals didn't notice the first symptom until 130 hours after exposure. The testing that ultimately diagnosed the

ultimately diagnosed the disease happened about 168 hours after exposure. These intervals were even shorter for influenza and GAS.

Despite early symptom detection, participants tended to delay testing, resulting in prolonged periods of unintentional disease spread. Prof. Erez Shmueli, also from TAU, added that most people did not avoid contact with others until after the disease

had peaked, when they were less likely to infect others.

Yamin stressed that digital diagnosis can significantly reduce the spread of infectious diseases by prompting earlier changes in social behavior. Early diagnosis is also vital for effective treatment, particularly for COVID-19, where treatments are most effective when administered early.

"Our new method using wearable sensors for early detection can potentially reduce epidemic threats to a minimum," Yamin added.



Discovering Alzheimer's Markers 20 Years Before Onset



Researchers at The Hebrew University of Jerusalem have discovered a distinct cellular pathway in the brain that indicates markers for future onset of Alzheimer's disease, some 20 years before symptoms would be exhibited. This early detection could eventually lead to a treatment to prevent the degenerative disease.

"The study shows that Alzheimer's disease is not just a form of accelerated aging but follows a different cellular path," explained Prof. Naomi Habib, who led an international team of researchers in the study.

"We now believe we know what's driving the disease, but we need to prove that changing the response would reverse that." she added.

Using data from 437 aging brains, the researchers mapped 1.65 million brain cells and showed that these cellular changes — which start at least 20 years before the first signs of dementia — determine the fate of the aging brain and the progression of Alzheimer's.

Previously, researchers only had access to post-mortem brain tissue. Thus, they could only compare advanced cases of "Alzheimer's brains with healthy brains," Habib noted. Their information was biased because they only had "a tiny window into the late stage of the disease." There was also no way to isolate the different parts of the brain tissue.

In recent years, however, researchers built the data set to map 1.65 million brain cells. At the same time, Habib and the other researchers developed an innovative algorithm that enabled them to examine those brain cells' trajectories.

Now that research has found the molecular markers, "we can predict if an individual is on the cellular path to healthier aging or a path to Alzheimer's," Habib explained. "We were able to untangle these two processes occurring in these aging brains and look at the entire dynamics. We can see what's happening along the different stages."

Habib, who watched relatives suffer from cognitive decline, is passionate about talking to people about how they can prevent Alzheimer's, and age more healthily. "For most individuals, there is a genetic risk for Alzheimer's disease, but healthy aging is also determined by your lifestyle." Thus, what we eat, our level of exercise, and our community engagement have an impact.

"Lifestyle is not something you should start thinking about when you're 80," Habib remarked. "It's important to lower your blood pressure and blood sugar to prevent the DNA damage and inflammation that might drive Alzheimer's disease."

"Even before the big discovery of the Alzheimer's drug, which we are all working for, there are insights that people can use in their daily life," Habib concluded.



"Recovered Anti-Semite" **Advocates for Israel**

"I went from someone who said that Israel and the Jewish people were cursed to saying, 'How beautiful are your tents, Jacob, your dwelling places, Israel," explained Loay Alshareef, an Arab-Muslim activist who campaigns for peace in the Middle East.

Alshareef, a self-described recovered anti-Semite, was born and raised a religious Muslim in Saudi Arabia. In 2010,

he decided to participate in a language immersion program in France. The program gave participants choices — such as staying in homes that had pets or whether they wanted a single or double room — but asked nothing about religion. Surprisingly, he was placed with a Jewish family.

"When I saw a big Star of David in their living room, I realized they were Jewish. Before them, I never had an encounter with a Jewish person. At the time, we only knew about Jews from extremist scholars. I was very anti-Jew, anti-Israel, and even anti-Christian because of my education," Alshareef explained.

Initially, he emailed the school asking to be moved elsewhere because he did not feel comfortable. "When you see the Star of David, what comes to mind immediately is Egyptian TV, Arabic songs that associate it with the Mossad, The Protocols of the Elders of Zion, and the Israeli armed forces," Alshareef noted. "It is scary."

Despite the religious differences, Alsha-

reef lived with the Jewish family for a couple of months. to ask the family all my questions about Judaism and Israel. This was really the trigger to make me want to learn more. Hebrew Bible.

He stated: "I was able I fell in love with the

"I still practice Islam. I'm still a Muslim, but I

have different ideas from the dangerous ones I had when I was young," he added.

Alshareef started advocating for Israel in 2017. "You receive a lot of hate. I defend the idea that Israel is an entity that existed 3,000 years ago and was reborn in 1948. It is very ironic that we, as Muslims, name our kids after prophets, kings and heroes





who are Jewish, but we don't connect the dots.

"There is zero contradiction between feeling the suffering of the Palestinians and believing that Israel has the right to exist. I love the Palestinians as much as I love the Israelis, I support their right to live in dignity and to exist peacefully side by side," Alshareef continued.

While noting that the situation in Gaza was not ideal before October 7, he added that Hamas's massacre made things worse. "I'm against Hamas, Palestinian Islamic Jihad, and all those monsters who want to destroy Israel and kill all the Jews.

"There was no [Israeli] occupation of Gaza on October 7. Israel unilaterally withdrew in the summer of 2005. There was a siege but only because of threats coming from Gaza."

He continued: "There was room for improvement, but the way to reach it is through peace, in the same way that Egyptian President Anwar el-Sadat did it [in 1979]; not through wars but through negotiations."

The timing of Hamas's October 7 massacre was no coincidence, according to Alshareef. "Iran issued a command to Hamas to launch its assault because Saudi Arabia was so close to normalizing relations with Israel."

Alshareef lives in the United Arab Emirates and believes in that Gulf country's example set with the Abraham Accords. "Countering Iran means having more peace treaties with Israel. It means integrating Israel more into the region. Once Israel becomes what it should be as part of the Middle East, the enemies of peace will be put in a tight corner and isolated. This is how we defeat Tehran, and this is what I hope happens."

In September, he spoke at a Jewish community organization in Montreal. While there, he also tried to secure an engagement with an Arab group. "I want people to listen to someone who held their views in the past but changed them with knowledge, facts, and the truth." One Arab organization turned him down, explaining that the audience was not interested in hearing his views, which they deemed were too supportive of Israel.

Still, Alshareef remains optimistic about the future of the Middle East. "I believe that God assigned us with a mission to fix the world, heal the world, 'Tikkun Olam.' This holy mission is our fuel."

IDF Rescues Yazidi Woman Kidnapped by ISIS IsraFan.com

The Israel Defense Forces (IDF) recently rescued Fawzia Amin Sido, a Yazidi woman kidnapped by ISIS at the age of 11 and trafficked to Gaza, where she had been held for a decade. The rescue was coordinated with the U.S. and others, who successfully reunited Sido with her family in Iraq.

Sido was abducted in 2014 during ISIS's brutal attack on the Yazidi community in Sinjar, Iraq, in which thousands were killed or enslaved. She was eventually sold to a man from Gaza, where she remained captive. Recently, her captor was killed in an Israeli strike in Gaza, allowing her to escape and seek help.

In a statement, the IDF stressed that this is further evidence of the connection between Hamas and ISIS, noting the crimes committed by these terror groups.

Fawzia's story is a powerful reminder of the horrors faced by the Yazidi community. In 2014, ISIS launched a campaign of genocide against the Yazidis, resulting in over 5,000 deaths and the abduction of more than 6,000 Yazidis, primarily women and children. Many were sold into slavery or indoctrinated into extremist ideologies. While thousands have been rescued over the years, approximately 2,600 remain missing.

Scientists Revive Ancient Tree | Possibly Mentioned in Genesis

can be fully described. It had already been identified through DNA sequencing as belonging to the genus *Commiphora Jacq*, a genus of myrrh. Myrrh is a gum-resin used in medicine, incense, and perfume (frankincense being the best-known used in the latter two).

Identifying the Sheba seed wasn't easy. Scientists first surmised that it was a candidate for the "Judean Balsam" or "Balm of Judea," a

highly fragrant tree

or shrub exclusive to the region and cultivated in antiquity. However,

> The ancient seed

An ancient mystery seed that was found in a cave in the Judean Desert four decades ago has been revived. Dating from A.D. 993–1202, the seed was nicknamed "Sheba" after the queen of Saba (also called Sheba) located in South Arabia. According to first-century historian Josephus, the queen brought the balsam root to King Solomon as a gift. [The queen's visit to Jerusalem is recorded in 1 Kings 10:1-13.]

The tree grown from the seed, now 14 years old, is about 10 feet tall and has reached the point where most of its characteristics

after further analysis in which little or no fragrance was found in the leaves, bark, or resin, scientists believe that it may be an extinct species of *Commiphora* whose resinous extract, *tsori* (Hebrew for "flow" or "drip"), was first mentioned in the Bible in Genesis (37:25; 43:11).

In the Biblical sources, it was associated with healing, but not described as fragrant. Strengthening this hypothesis, chemical analysis of its leaves and resin revealed many compounds known to be medicinal, including high levels (30%) of squalene, positive for the skin as an emollient, antioxidant, hydrator, and anti-tumor agent.

Biblical *tsori* was associated with the historical region of Gilead in the Dead Sea-Jordan Rift Valley, a forested mountain area in antiquity with a lower fertile, cultivated valley. The Sheba seed was found in a cave in that valley.

Scientists aren't certain whether humans or animals left the seed in the cave, but the small number of seeds in the cave suggest animals as the source. Small rodents store *Commiphora* seeds and its ripe fruits are eaten by birds.

It is unknown when or if the Sheba plant will flower. 🌣

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

Muslim Cleric: Genies Helped Israel Kill Nasrallah


The Israelis recently astounded the world with several unparalleled feats of wartime ingenuity, most notably the explosion of thousands of pagers that belonged to high-level Hezbollah operatives. Adding to that was the elimination of arch-terrorist Hassan Nasrallah of Hezbollah, who had been in hiding for nearly two decades and was in a bunker 60 feet underground when he died. One Iranian Muslim cleric, however, claimed that Israel's success wasn't due to ingenuity. Instead, they had a certain "supernatural" help.

Mostafa Karami, who teaches at a Shi'ite Muslim seminary in Iran, claimed that the Israelis were able to kill Nasrallah with the aid of jinn, or genies. According to the Koran, jinn are spirit beings that Allah created from "smokeless fire" (55:15). These beings can be dangerous — the Koran adds that the "assembly of the jinn" has "seduced many among mankind" (6:128), and some of them even try to turn prophets away from their mission.

Karami stated: "Considering the Zionists' history of subjugating genies, they carry out many of their missions through this means, and demons are their secret army." According to Karami, Nasrallah wasn't the first victim of the Zionist jinn: "They [the Jews] have had access to genies and cosmic science since the time of David and Solomon. Historically, they have always used genies, their documents and traditions proved that. They have used genies and demons for warfare and intelligence operations throughout history."

Apparently, that explains the stunning, against-all-odds Israeli victories in 1948, 1967, and 1973.

Muhammad ibn al-Uthaymeen, a 20th-century Islamic scholar, explained how *jinn* operate: "There are numerous reports which indicate that a man may come to a deserted area, and a stone may be thrown at him, but he does not see anybody, or he may hear voices or a rustling sound like the rustling of trees, and other things that may make him feel distressed and scared. A *jinn* may also enter the body of a human, either because of love or with the intention of harming him, or for some other reason."

Of course, it isn't just the *jinn* who are adversaries to the Muslims. The Koran describes Jews as "the most vehement of mankind in hostility to those who believe" (5:82). So why shouldn't these two great enemies of Muslims join forces?





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
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
