

President Trump's recent statements about Gaza have raised many questions: What will be in Gaza? Who will be in control? Who will rebuild? Where will Gazans live? Who will be responsible for ensuring that neither the physical terrorist infrastructure that Hamas built, nor the genocidal Islamic ideology that it represents, will ever threaten Israel or the well-being of Gaza's Palestinian Arabs?

Trump's discussion of evacuating Gazans and the U.S. controlling Gaza has received wide celebration and criticism. Whether these were meant as a negotiating tactic or new U.S. policy, it has undoubtedly opened the door for needed out-of-the-box solutions.

One thing is clear: The idea of a "two-state solution" has been debunked as it would give Palestinian Arabs a state unilaterally as a consequence of their decades of terror and incitement rather than through negotiations and recogniz-

Only 40% of Americans Believe God Exists or "Affects Lives"

research found that 60% of Americans do not believe that God exists or "affects lives." Nearly half (47%) of self-identified Christians and 40% of theologically identified born-again Christians said the same.

Dr. George Barna, director of research at ACU, commented on the report: "It seems obvious that political, economic, legal, or institutional improvements are not what America needs most desperately today. ... Nothing short of sweeping national repentance and spiritual renewal can save America from itself."

Among Americans who believe that God exists and "affects lives," 38% defined God as the "most important element" in their lives, 23% described Him as "extremely important," 18% as "very important," and 14% agreed that God was "somewhat important" in their lives. Only 5% considered God either "not too" important or "not at all" important in their lives, while 3% stated that God's influence on them "varies."

However, only 20% of "those who believe the God of the Bible exists and affects lives" noted that they had "an intimate and interactive spiritual relationship with Him, with constant two-way communication." Another 45% classified their relationship with God as "close," defined by frequent prayer and trust in Him to "do what is best and right."

While 11% described their relationship with God as being at "arms-length," 18% replied that they don't have an interactive relationship with Him, and 7% didn't know how to describe their relationship with Him.

When asked what they believed God provided to them, most who believe in God cited Him as a source of hope (72%), comfort (71%), peace (65%), guidance (64%), compassion (60%), joy (60%), mercy (58%) and purpose (54%). Fewer respondents believed God is a source of miracles (47%), opportunities (41%), security (38%), responsibilities (33%) and power (31%). Less than one-quarter of those who believe in God think that He provides identity (24%) and boundaries (19%).

"The fact that more than three out of four people who believe God exists and is influential in their lives nevertheless do not get their identity from their relationship with Him explains a lot," Barna declared. "The fact that two out of three people who believe in God's existence and influence do not believe their connection to Him comes with responsibilities, delivers additional insight," he added.

According to Barna, "Finding that two-thirds of those who believe He exists and is influential nevertheless say that God has not given them power to serve Him and pursue His agenda reveals even more about the deceptions and weakness of American Christianity. And the list of startling insights into a Christian faith that bears little resemblance to Biblical teaching and to God's intent could continue."

The American Worldview Inventory 2025 is based on responses collected from 2,100 U.S. adults in January. The survey has a margin of error of +/-2 percentage points. ❖

Christians: The Only Solution for Peace in Gaza

ing Israel's legitimacy. It's foolish to think that creating a Palestinian state would or should be a foundation for a broader peace with the rest of the Arab world. It's ridiculous because it has never worked despite numerous opportunities going back to 1947. The root of the problem is not the lack of a Palestinian state but their acceptance of the existence of the Jewish state.

Other than a two-state solution being an inappropriate reward for terror, it's impractical because the Palestinian Authority (PA) has no authority over the areas that it was created to govern. The PA is inept, corrupt, and only slightly less hostile to Israel's existence than Hamas.

Taking Responsibility for Gaza

Some suggest that other Arab states should take responsibility for Gaza's future, something none are willing to do publicly. It's not a viable solution because, for decades, much of the Arab world has funded the Hamas infrastructure, turned a blind eye to and even facilitated the smuggling of weapons into Gaza, and used the status of Palestinian Arabs against Israel rather than seeking a genuine solution. No single Arab or Islamic state can be trusted or

relied upon to take responsibility. The last thing Israel or Gazans need is the rebuilding of Hamas's extremist Islamic ideology and the resumption of terror. If there's ever hope for a lasting peace, there needs to be an overhaul of more than the physical infrastructure. There needs to be a radical change of heart.



This of course, assumes that two million Gazans are not relocated to other countries, something that many would resist, no other country wants, and would be destabilizing for any country that would take them in. Nor does it address the root of the problem — jihadi Islamic extremism — with which they have been indoctrinated for a century.

Thinking Outside the Box

With no good solutions based on past failed models and unreliable partners, it's time to think out of the box — to look at a solution not through a prism of how we want things to be but based on reality. I have a solution that's as radical coming from an Orthodox Jew as it is one, perhaps the only one, that can bring true peace.

The solution for long-term peace in Gaza is Jesus.

In the past, one might think that the Arab-Israeli conflict was about land. It's not. It's a religious conflict fueled by an Islamic ideology that holds that the sole Jewish state is by definition illegitimate. Islamists like Hamas and their Iranian patrons, who embody that ideology, seek Israel's annihilation, not to live side by side with it.

The solution is to counteract that ideology, to upend the failures that extremist Islam has caused in Gaza.

With the widespread destruction of Hamas in Gaza and the suffering that Gazans have endured as human shields at the hands of Hamas, it's legitimate for them to see that theirs is an ideology that offers only suffering and that their god, Allah, has failed them.

Physical and Spiritual Restoration

To change the hearts of two million Palestinian Arabs in Gaza by reversing an intolerant, hateful, extremist, and genocidal ideology, Christians must play a pivotal role in Gaza's physical and spiritual restoration. With exposure to Christians and a Christianity that reveres the God of Israel, Gazans will begin to love the people of Israel and understand the prophetic significance of the State of Israel: that Israel is the cornerstone of the solution and not the foundation of their problem.

To implement this, 100,000–200,000 Christians need to take responsibility for Gaza's complete reconstruction. This will include professionals in engineering, construction, and all aspects of human welfare. They will spend months, if not years, among the population, helping rebuild their lives and creating a foundation upon which to build their future. When Gazans are offered a diet of Christian love to counteract the buffet of hate that they have been force-fed, they might realize the opportunity to prosper.

Gaza's destruction has been commensurate with how deeply Hamas embedded itself among the population and within civilian infrastructure such as schools, mosques, hospitals, United Nations facilities, and residential areas.

Where to Begin?

Rebuilding needs to start from under the ground and up. Anything left of the maze of terrorist tunnels, along with the evil Islamic ideology that birthed Hamas originally, and nurtured from Iran all these decades, needs to be purged. Perhaps this time, Gazans will want to get it right. If rebuilt properly, purging the terrorists, Gaza can become a thriving, peaceful society.

Christians would bring the greatest ability to rebuild Gaza by both genuinely loving and caring about Israel and its safety, and also about the well-being of Palestinian Arabs. They will not allow the restoration of a massive terrorist infrastructure under their noses as the United Nations, Red Cross, and other "humanitarian" groups have allowed over the decades, both because it is wrong, and because it is self-destructive.

Nobody would to live in peace more than the Jewish people. But to really bring lasting peace, we need Gazans who love and embrace us and want to live in peace as much as us, or at least who do not want to kill us. The key to the true Solution for Peace in Gaza is from Christians.

It may sound crazy for an Orthodox Israeli Jew to propose peace based on the transformation of our neighbors living in spiritual darkness to become theological allies. However, with Gazans' anger toward Hamas growing, if the people of Gaza are presented with a viable alternative — one based in morality that can bring prosperity and hope — the ground is fertile for such an opportunity and true peace.





May 14 marks the modern State of Israel's 77th birthday. That day is also the birthday of our youngest grandson, who turns five years old this year. While May 14 is a joyful two-in-one celebration for our family, this year's national commemoration of Israel's independence will be bittersweet for many Israelis.

I believe that the deepest shame that can come upon a believer in Jesus Christ is to be seen as hating His brethren, the Jews. He said, after all, "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these My brethren, ye have done it unto Me" (Matt. 25:40).

I was terribly disheartened to see that some American Christians have been noticed in Israel for their anti-Semitism. Imagine my embarrassment as I try to win souls among "the lost sheep of the house of Israel" to whom our Lord was sent (Matt. 15:24). If we are unable to love those whom God loves, let us at least not hate them!

The following paragraphs appeared in a *Jerusalem Post* article, written by Franklin Hamlin Littell, on American anti-Semitism.

Another sign of an anti-Jewish groundswell is the increasingly bold effort of some church offices to mobilize political support for the PLO. The customary show of "even-handedness" is wearing thin, and demonstrations against Israel and the American links to Israel are growing bolder.

One illustration was a strenuous effort to turn out hundreds of church

people to pressure Congress against Israel. The May 13–15 "Washington Advocacy Days" promoted by "Churches for Middle East Peace" was based in the Washington office of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.). It linked its appeal to the February appeal for "attention to the plight of the Palestinian people" circulated by the Middle East Council of Churches, as well as to "the Palestinian Prayer" proposed for use in churches at Easter time.

President George Bush's reported remark to reporters on Air Force One that it is time to forgive the Holocaust may indicate a trend. He is apparently unaware that the only ones save God who are entitled to forgive are the dead. Bush's dramatic telephone calls to families of the victims of a deranged Israeli gunman make some of us wonder when he last telephoned the families of victims of Shiite or PLO terror. What are the political implications of a pathos that is so selective?

Fortunately, the Washington "rally" was a failure, with fewer than 200 participants, in spite of the large quantity of mailings, advertisements in church journals,

and commendations by certain denominational and ecumenical bureaucrats. But during the same time period, there were meetings in local congregations across the U.S. — wherever a preacher or prominent layman took the time and

effort to set up a pro-PLO/anti-Israel session. Reports by telephone and letter indicate that in some instances, at least, these local meetings lent themselves to the most open and unrestrained anti-Semitic attacks.

It is a common error to think that anti-Semitism consists mainly of obvious and malicious vandalism or terror. Anti-Semitism is a malaise in Christendom, with deep cultural and theological roots.

In open societies, the "higher anti-Semitism" of the moralists and the pious carries the chief danger to Jewish survival. But it is precisely this covert and unexamined anti-Semitism that opens the doors to the lies of the deniers, and the vicious politics of the terrorists and their fellow travelers.

In order to combat such unfairness in our churches, I am hereby volunteering to speak, without compensation of any kind, in any Presbyterian or other church that is anti-Semitic. It must be understood that I will quote profusely from Scripture, and I will attempt to bring the congregation to true belief in Jesus Christ, which seems to be necessary in such cases.

And, of course, I will teach about Israel — the land of our Lord and the

strong application of Scripture is usually enough to fumigate the place and get rid of the hatred of those of whom God said, "And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the Earth be blessed" (Gen. 12:3).

From Air Quality to Donative Intent

Below are excerpts from the CBS News story, "Indoor Air Systems Crucial to Curbing Spread of Viruses..."* The broadcast inspired me to acquire a carbon dioxide (CO₂) monitor to analyze the quality and safety of the air in my home, car, gym, etc. —Mark

The pandemic has taught scientists that improving indoor air quality is more beneficial than social distancing, hand washing, and masking. Whether the threat is flu, COVID, or measles, plenty of fresh air abates transmission risks.

Over the past century, America has improved our water quality, food safety, and sanitation while too often neglecting indoor air quality. In October 2023 and June 2024, the television news magazine 60 Minutes highlighted a 2020 super-spreader event at a church in Mount Vernon, Washington. Though half of the Skagit Valley Chorale members there stayed home from their weekly rehearsal in question, COVID hit 53 of the 61 people who attended. Two, both in their 80s, died.

Skagit County health officials concluded that choir members had "an intense and prolonged exposure" to surfaces, droplets, and microscopic airborne particles called "aerosols" containing the virus.

Dr. Linsey Marr is a Virginia Tech professor who specializes in aerosol science. She used a portable fogger to explain how so many choir members got sick that evening.

Apparently, the choir room's HVAC (heating, ventilation, and air conditioning) system was turned off, resulting in minimal if any ventilation. In 2022, a study in Italy found that using a school's fans and air ducts to mechanically exchange indoor air with outdoor air five times per hour decreases the risk of infection transmission by 80%. Schools, however, typically are designed for just three air changes per hour.

To mitigate risks attributable to poor air circulation, the Skagit Valley Chorale subsequently left doors open to let in fresh air, regardless of the season and got portable carbon dioxide monitors to track ventilation — and eventually moved to a church with a new HVAC system.

A moderate amount of extra CO₂ in a room will make the air feel stuffy while a lot of CO₂ makes it uncomfortable. Beyond that, however, a higher ratio of CO₂ to oxygen can indicate a concentration of contagions from whoever happens to be sick. "Out with the bad air; in with the

good" applies to rooms and buildings as well as people's lungs.

For ~\$170, I ordered an Aranet4 HOME Wireless Indoor Air Quality Monitor on Amazon. This unit has good reviews for accuracy, simplicity, and battery life. The free Aranet HOME app on my iPhone downloads data from the monitor via



Bluetooth and enables me to monitor live readings on temperature, humidity, and CO₂. Better vet, the app easily creates Aranet4 HOME one-day and

seven-day charts of those measurements as far back as several weeks.

Right out of the gate, I learned that keeping my bedroom's doors open allows my wife and me to breathe fresher air — more oxygen and less CO₂. In my car, I was surprised to see how quickly the climate control's air recirculation setting drove up the CO₂ count, which could be preferable to inhaling dust from nearby construction or excessive smog from other vehicles. If, however, you're riding with someone who's sick, recycling the air would be risky, so opening the windows, vents, and moon roof would make sense.

In the Mind-Body Studio at my Jewish Community Center (JCC), it is somewhat alarming how quickly the air quality declines once exercise classes begin with the doors closed — especially when they turn off the HVAC system to accommodate the colder-natured members who prefer having no air movement. In fact, below is a chart that shows the room's CO₂ count shooting right through the yellow zone to the red and then plummeting quickly once the class ends and the doors reopen.

Dear Reader, Does your own church building have crowded rooms that are stuffy, with minimal airflow? If so, then giving your pastor a copy of this article could lead to some reasonably simple solutions that would enable attendees to breathe easier and more healthily.

Last month's Note from Mark, "Not Falling for Jesus," mentioned The Dolphin Chronicles. The code name Project Dolphin refers to missions of a second-generation, fourth-rate Messianic spy for Israel (yours truly), driven by a Mossad computer chip surreptitiously implanted in his brain. My latest mission involves improving my JCC's air quality. What Does it Mean to be Born Again?

Part 1

In John chapter 3, Jesus used the term "born again" twice (vv. 3, 7) as He emphasized the necessity of spiritual rebirth for all humans.

Nicodemus — a Pharisee, prominent religious teacher of Israel, and notable member of the Jewish Sanhedrin — came at night to talk with Jesus (John 3:1–8). While Nicodemus opened with words of admiration for Jesus, our Lord moved directly to the heart of the matter by declaring, "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see [understand, know, and enter] the Kingdom of God" (John 3:3). A confused Nicodemus, thinking that Jesus was referring to physical rebirth, then asked, "Can [a man] enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?" (John 3:4).

The word translated "again" in John 3:3 is the Greek word *anothen*, meaning "from above." Thus, to be born again is a supernatural act of the Holy Spirit from Heaven "above." In clarifying this to Nicodemus, Jesus explained that being born again refers to a spiritual rebirth through the Holy Spirit. In John 3:6, Jesus contrasted physical birth ("that which is born of the flesh is flesh"), which humans produce, with spiritual rebirth ("that which is born of the Spirit is spirit"), which only the Holy Spirit can accomplish.

All humans are sinners who cannot be reborn or regenerated on their own. Every person needs God-given faith in

Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit's power to bring about spiritual rebirth. *The Bible Knowledge Commentary* explains this succinctly: "There are two distinct realms: one is of fallen man (the flesh) and the other is of God (the Spirit). A fallen person cannot regenerate himself; he needs a divine operation. Only God's Holy Spirit can regenerate a human spirit."

Being born again is essential for anyone who wants to be saved and go to Heaven. Jesus emphasized this universal necessity when He asserted to Nicodemus, "You must be born again" (John 3:7). And just as physical birth happens only once, so spiritual rebirth is a one-time experience whereby the Believer becomes a permanent, regenerated child of God.

In John 3:8, Jesus uses an analogy of the wind to illustrate the Holy Spirit's mysterious work in a person's salvation. God's Spirit, like the wind, cannot be controlled or completely understood by humans. Though the wind is invisible, the observing eye can see its effects. Likewise, the invisible, sovereign power of the Holy Spirit produces visible evidence of transformation and power in a repentant sinner who trusts in Jesus Christ. This spiritual rebirth does not come through religious rituals or formulas; it is solely a supernatural act by the Spirit of God.




Archaeological discoveries continue to validate the Biblical record. To film "dig sites" and interview experts, Zola journeyed to Israel and Jordan. Just as our Lord said about this remarkable Land, *The Stones Cry Out*.

The Tunnel Zola walks the tunnel under the western edge of the Temple Mount. We get a journalist's perspective of the Palestinian uproar that erupted when the tunnel was opened to the public in 1996.

A Tale of Two Temples An unearthed marketplace shows the Roman destruction of the Temple. Mount Gerizim to the north hosts the excavation of a Samaritan temple patterned after the Jerusalem Temple.

Rulers in Stone Caesarea, on Israel's Mediterranean coast, has yielded first-century finds such as the first extra-Biblical reference to Pontius Pilate, and a full-size Temple replica. At Tel Dan, the "House of David" has been confirmed archaeologically.

The Jerusalem That Was Bible Lands Museum houses a model of Jerusalem as it would have looked in 586 B.C. In the City of David, we examine a four-room house, typical architecture for ancient Israelites.



Archaeology and the Scriptures In Jerusalem, Zola explains the history of the Citadel, also called "David's Tower." We talk with the Israel Antiquities Authority.

Cities of the Past Zippori was a thriving cultural center in Galilee that probably influenced Jesus as a boy in Nazareth. Ekron was one of five prominent Old Testament cities of the Philistines.

Shadows from the Past A chamber of tombs, near the Garden Tomb but dated to the time of the First Temple, helps us understand burial customs of that day. We visit the Qumran cave where the first Dead Sea Scroll was found.

A Tale of Three Cities In Biblical times, a business relationship existed between three Jordan Valley cities: Beit Shean, Rehovot (west of the Jordan River), and Pella (east of the Jordan River). We visit excavations in each city.

The Rose Red City The ancient Nabataeans were famous for their skill in rock carving. Petra, their capital southeast of the Dead Sea, is the "rose-red city" known for its magnificent buildings carved into the native rock.

A Man Crucified On display at the Rockefeller Museum in Jerusalem, a man's heel bone that was pierced by a nail is the first archaeological proof of Roman crucifixions in Israel.

Truth from the Stones Zola discusses how the artifacts shown throughout this series illuminate Scripture, and how Believers can be encouraged when *The Stones Cry Out*.



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
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<u>Joseph:</u> <u>Dreamer / Redeemer</u>



Global Christian Persecution

From J.T.: I understand that you are sharing the story and plight of Jews and Israel, especially since Oct. 7, 2023. However, I am saddened that Christians have been persecuted, tortured, tormented, and martyred for years — since the beginning of our faith. Where's the outcry? Just recently, 70 Christians were beheaded in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. CBN News reports that this atrocity is hardly mentioned in churches or the media — even Christian media. Likewise, Christians are continually slaughtered in Nigeria — many died during the 2024 Christmas season.

Men have been imprisoned in Eritrea for 20 years for being Christian. They might be released if they would deny Jesus. Leah Sharibu is still in captivity for seven years in Nigeria. She has had children, and her family and friends are pleading with the president's wife, who is a Christian, to speak for Leah.

I have not heard Israeli news prior to October 7 speaking with passion for the murder of Christians. The Holocaust Museum states there were massacres and indiscriminate killings of Jews and non-Jews that were not recorded or identified during WWII. Not only Jews were killed on October 7.

When Jews talk about the Holocaust, they seem to imply that only Jews were killed, but there were Gypsies, mentally ill, Communists, and political opponents. Eleven million people were killed in the Holocaust. What grieves me are the non-Jews today who are imprisoned in horrible conditions that are not reported. Many languish right now in prison.

An Iranian pastor recently spoke at our church about visiting a town where they had to go through elaborate measures to avoid detection as they joined a Christian gathering. Then, they had to worship and pray silently. He related that the Holy Spirit fell on that meeting in great power. I grieve and pray now for those in prison, even for decades, that God continues to sustain them.

Shalom, J.T.,

For two decades before we began working for Zola Levitt Ministries, we traveled the globe, working in disaster relief with non-profit organizations to provide aid for hurting and destitute communities. We also furnished resources and provisions for persecuted Christian communities in violent countries like Burma and Zambia. In addition, we spread the Gospel of Yeshua to lost and dying people in over 40 countries, as did our family before us. With both Jew and gentile, we've devoted our entire lives to sharing God's love in ministry.

We now helm a Messianic Jewish ministry where the focus has been on the Jew first and also the gentile. God tasked our founder Zola Levitt to demonstrate the importance of Israel to the world, and to use his platform to support Israel when the world turns against her.

There is nothing wrong with this being the primary focus of our ministry, as God has called many ministries to concentrate on different areas of need. As you mentioned, there are Iranians — like our friend Dr. Hormoz Shariat — whom God has called to minister to the Persian people. Just as there are women's and men's ministries, other ministries focus on drug addiction, broken homes, or child abuse.

If you feel the need to focus on the persecution of Christians around the world, it's probably because the Holy Spirit is leading you to do something about it. Please answer the call of His conviction.

As we have in the past, we will continue teaching about how all God's people suffer for the sake of the Gospel; in fact, that will be an underlying theme in our future series <code>Paul vs. the gods</code>. Currently, however, we must obey the Holy Spirit's direction for us and do what most of the world won't do: support Israel and declare God's love for the <code>Jewish people</code>. There has never been a more pivotal time in history to proclaim this truth than right now. —Blessings, Joshua and Caleb

Jewish Dispersion

From M.D.K.: This may be a stupid question, but why are there Jewish tribes around the world? All the tribes from Egypt went to Israel. I wondered about this while reading the Book of Numbers. I am glad we have Jewish communities all over the world, but I am curious as to why we are not all in Israel. My great-grandparents came out of Belgium.

Shalom, M.D.K.,

That's not a stupid question! Thankfully the Bible has all the information you need. Because of Israel and Judah's disobedience in worshiping false gods, God allowed the Assyrians and later the Babylonians to remove the Jews from the Land of Israel in 722 and 586 B.C. Many of those Jews returned after 70 years of captivity in Babylon, but centuries later the Roman Empire scattered the Jews across the world in A.D. 70, after the destruction of Jerusalem and the Temple. This is called the Diaspora.

On May 14, 1948, Israel was re-established as a nation — the Jewish state. Although there was always a small portion of Jews living in the Promised Land throughout that nearly 2,000-year gap, more and more Jews are returning to their homeland in fulfillment of Ezekiel's prophecy in chapters 34 and 36. Amos 9:11–15 confirms that once God returns the Jews to the Land of Israel, He will never allow them to be scattered again. —Blessings, Joshua and Caleb

Could This Be Noah's Ark?

Scientists say that this large boat-shaped geological structure could be the remains of Noah's Ark.

Excitement is mounting in the archaeological community following revelations at the recent International Symposium on Mount Ararat and Noah's Ark, held in eastern Turkey.

Experts from Istanbul Technical University and Agri Ibrahim Cecen University in Turkey, and Andrews University in the U.S. have worked since 2021 under the banner of the Mount Ararat and Noah's Ark Research Team. The team has focused on the Durupinar formation, a 538-foot geological structure composed of limonite and located approximately 19 miles south of the summit of Mount Ararat, near the Turkey-Iran border.

The Durupinar formation was initially discovered by a Kurdish farmer in 1948. It has long captivated researchers and explorers due to its ship-like shape and dimensions that mirror the Biblical description and measurements of Noah's Ark. Despite numerous studies over the years, consensus on the site's significance has remained elusive.

Researchers collected nearly 30 samples of rock and soil from the site. After analysis, the samples revealed traces of clay-like materials, marine deposits, and seafood remnants, including mollusks. Experts de-

termined that the materials dated between 3,500 and 5,000 years old. This timeframe coincides with the Chalcolithic period (5,500–3,000 B.C.), which is associated with the era of the Biblical flood as described in the Book of Genesis

"Our studies show that this region harbored life in that period and that, at some point, it was covered by water, which reinforces the possibility that a catastrophic event of great magnitude occurred," the researchers stated

Mount Ararat, the highest peak in Turkey at 16,853 feet, is traditionally identified as the resting place of Noah's Ark. Genesis 8:4 states: "And the ark rested in the seventh month, on the seventeenth day of the month, upon the mountains of Ararat." The mountain is an inactive volcano with a summit covered in perpetual snow.


By employing technology and geological analysis techniques, the team aims to separate myth from reality. Their work focuses on examining the site's geological and archaeological significance without drawing premature conclusions.

Even so, the researchers recently noted: "The evidence suggests that the story [of Noah's Ark] might have a basis in reality." 🌣

There is a growing global demand for agricultural crops that consume less water without compromising yield, but it has been challenging to identify suitable plant varieties. Recently, however, researchers from Tel Aviv

University (TAU) have succeeded in cultivating and characterizing tomato varieties with higher water use efficiency.

Using CRISPR (pronounced "crisper") genetic editing technology, the researchers grew tomatoes that consumed less water while preserving yield, quality, and taste. CRISPR stands for Clustered Regularly Interspaced Short Palindromic Repeats — repetitive fragments of DNA that bacteria use to defend themselves against invading viruses. Viruses can infect bacteria, just like they can infect people.

The study was led by Prof. Shaul Yalovsky and Dr. Nir Sade, along with a team of researchers from the School of Plant Sciences and Food Security at TAU's Wise Faculty of Life Sciences. Scientists from Ben Gurion University and the University of Oregon also contributed to the research.

In a process called transpiration, plants evaporate water from their leaves. Concurrently, carbon dioxide enters into the leaves, and is assimilated into sugar by photosynthesis, which also takes place in the leaves. These two processes —

— occur simultaneously through special openings in the surface of leaves called stomata. The stomata can open and close, serving as a mechanism through which plants regulate their water status.

"We discovered that eliminating ROP9 [proteins that help control plant tissue formation] by the CRISPR technology cause a partial closure of the stomata. This effect is particularly pronounced during midday, when the rate of water loss from the plants in the transpiration process is at its highest," said Prof. Yalovsky. "Conversely, in the morning and afternoon, when the transpiration rate is lower, there was no significant difference in the rate of water loss between the control plants and ROP9-modified plants.

"Because the stomata remained open in the morning and afternoon, the plants were able to uptake enough carbon dioxide, preventing any decline in sugar production by photosynthesis even during the afternoon hours, when the stomata were more closed in the ROP9-modified plants."

Clearing Clogged Arteries Safer and Faster

Israel-based startup Pylon Medical has developed a first-of-its-kind method of treating carotid artery disease, one of the leading risk factors for stroke.

The carotid arteries are a pair of blood vessels on each side of the neck that deliver blood to the brain, face, and neck. As fatty deposits (plaques) build up on the walls of these vessels, they can clog, creating carotid artery disease that can result in a host of complications.

Current solutions for clearing the clogged blood vessels include surgically opening them and cleaning out the plaque or inserting a stent to widen the blood vessel. These methods can have long recovery times, sometimes resulting in additional complications.

Pylon's newly developed "specialty kit" — including a balloon catheter, an artery closure device, and an aspiration system — makes the treatment of clogged blood vessels much safer and less time-consuming, noted Or Zigelboim, Pylon's founder and CEO. He added that it has a 98%

"We make a small puncture of 2.5 millimeters and introduce a balloon catheter; then we can place a stent to revascularize the vessel or open the vessel up and improve the bloodstream." Afterward, the physician can automatically suture the hole in the carotid artery by bringing the two sides of the hole together with a knot.

success rate.

Pylon's solution can also be utilized during stent insertions or surgeries.

"Our aspiration system protects against particles from outer walls of the vessels that could dislodge during the pro-

cedure and drift into the brain, which sometimes can cause strokes," noted Zigelboim. "So, at the biomedical level, we're taking these procedures to the next level by performing them in the least invasive way possible."

Pylon has successfully completed clinical trials on animals and is currently in its second fundraising round to secure money for clinical trials on humans, which it hopes to conduct this year.

"Our regulatory path lies through the FDA, which means we will have to enroll about 200 patients into our clinical trials within two years," Zigelboim explained. He added that if everything goes as planned, Pylon's solution should be market-ready by 2027 or 2028.



"Human Rights" NGOs' Silence is Complicity with Hamas



Human rights are not universal — they don't apply to Jews or Israelis because they aren't useful to self-proclaimed human rights arbiters who have monopolized and abused these principles for their political agendas.

If this was not abundantly clear before, it was clarified painfully on February 20/21, 2025 — when the major international human rights organizations were quiet as four slain Israeli hostages, including two children, were repatriated in a macabre Hamas propaganda ceremony.


From the capture of the elderly Oded Lifshitz and Shiri, Ariel, and Kfir Bibas by Gazan hordes during the October 7 massacre until the exhibition of their alleged remains on the publicity stage, international human rights NGOs (non-governmental organizations) held a silent vigil of complicity.

Complicit NGOs

For 500 days, Amnesty International's reports accused Israel of every crime imaginable. But the organization that was founded to free political prisoners said nothing of the Bibas family members who were held in captivity. Amnesty likewise didn't comment as the hostages' remains were paraded before jeering and cheering Gazans.

Freed Israeli hostage Eli Sharabi, who was beaten, chained and starved while held for 491 days by Hamas, expressed his anger during an appearance at the U.N. Security Council in March for having to suffer for so long and worry every day about being killed. "Where was the United Nations? Where was the Red Cross? Where was the world?" Sharabi asked.

Human Rights Watch made no statement



Save the Children International — which claims to ensure that children are protected worldwide — never denounced the precedent of using children as hostages to ransom the release of murderers. Nor did it reference the Bibas children on its website or social media.

The United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) — supposedly "for every child" — mentioned the Bibas children once in passing during Deputy Executive Director Ted Chaiban's September briefing and in one October 7 anniversary X post.

The Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (UN OHCHR) had been silent on the Bibas family until condemning the display on February 20. Yet two days earlier, in a statement about Hamas's degrading public displays of captives, UN OHCHR equated the hostages to that of imprisoned and detained terrorists.

"International humanitarian law prohibits outrages upon personal dignity, in particular humiliating and degrading treatment.' Parading hostages as trophies of war, in a propaganda spectacle, clearly violates this rule. It is also distressing to their families," said UN OHCHR's supposed experts, including Francesca Albanese, special rapporteur on the situation of human rights in the Palestinian territories.

Ever ready to comment on any perceived allegation of abuse by Israeli forces, Albanese, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Türk, and

20 in the propaganda-emblazoned coffins. Relegated to a ride-sharing service ordered by Hamas commanders, the ICRC meekly protested degrading treatment in an earlier statement but still participated in the pageantry of death.

A ridiculous double standard

Even if these organizations later offer lip service out of shame, it's already too late. The comparison of any such response to their constant zealousness in attacking Israel with claims of genocide, apartheid, etc. demonstrates a ridiculous double standard.

Actually, it would indicate a double standard if it weren't so obvious that a standard never existed.

If universal principles are only invoked when suitable, then they are not a standard for the treatment of people; they are a weapon used to pursue one's political agenda.

Even on October 7, 2023, as Israel was repelling Hamas's attacks and trying to defend against its rocket and mortar fire, NGOs urged Israeli restraint by invoking human rights. At every leg of the war, human rights organizations pressured Israel for ceasefires, to not address the immediate threats of Gazan terrorist organizations, and to not seek justice against those who raped and murdered their way through southern Israel.

Invoking the sacred words "human rights" about dubious crises, these groups demanded humanitarian pauses and aid that gave succor to Gazan terrorists by allowing them to reorganize and resupply.

Every few years, these terrorists survive the wars they start to fight against Israel another day, thanks to the cruel mercy and overbearing nagging of human rights organizations—ultimately leading to October 7, 2023, when orange-haired children were ripped from their home.

Human rights activists likely remained silent on February 20 because they believed that bringing attention to people celebrating dead babies would "manufacture consent" among the international community to take a hard stance against Hamas and its ilk.

Intentional or not, the human rights regime has facilitated Hamas's agenda and hindered those who seek to stop them. In their complicity with that terrorist agenda, they have made human rights irrelevant.

As surely as the Gazan terrorist groups ultimately bear responsibility for the deaths of the four hostages, so too are human rights organizations responsible for putting human rights in a coffin next to them.

Released Israeli Hostage: "Two Million Terrorists" in Gaza

Liri Albag, a 19-year-old Israel Defense
Forces (IDF) lookout, was released in
January after being held for 477 days
by Hamas terrorists in the Gaza Strip.
Talking to her father after her release,
Albag asserted: "Dad, there are two
million terrorists there, make no mistake.
I sat with children aged 8 and 4 who
were cursing the Jews."

According to a 2024 estimate, 2,141,643 Palestinians live in the Gaza Strip.

Albag and the three other female IDF hostages who were released on January 25 experienced "insane things that are hard to tell everything about" during their 15 months in Hamas captivity. Yet her family noted that the women were afraid to speak out since many other hostages still remained in Gaza.

Former hostage Mia Shem, who was released in November 2023, stated in an interview the following month: "Everyone there [in Gaza] is a terrorist.

"Entire families are under Hamas. I realized I was staying with a family. I started to ask myself, why am I in a family home? Why are there children here? Why is there a wife here?" Shem commented. "I went through a Shoah [Hebrew for 'catastrophe' or 'calamity'; also refers to the Holocaust]."

Mayor Declares Paterson, NJ: "The Capital of Palestine in the U.S."

Andre Sayegh, the mayor of Paterson, New Jersey, declared the city to be the "capital of Palestine in the U.S." at a March ceremony marking the beginning of Ramadan. Sayegh also stated that the city was one of the four holiest in the world, after Jerusalem, Mecca, and Medina.

The mayor, who was born in New Jersey to a Syrian mother and a Lebanese father, referred to Paterson as "The Mecca of New Jersey." The city's Muslim presence is evident through its many Palestinian flags and signs in Arabic.

Nearly Half of World's Adults Hold Anti-Semitic Views

Almost half of adults around the world have "elevated levels of anti-Semitic attitudes," the Anti-Defamation League (ADL) reported recently. The Global 100 survey represents 94% of the world's population through responses from more than 58,000 adults across 103 countries and territories. The ADL asked respondents about their agreement to 11 anti-Semitic stereotypes. About 46% of respondents agreed with most of the statements, which included "Jews have too much control over global affairs" and "Jews don't care about what happens to anyone but their own kind."

Anti-Semitism appears to have sharply increased worldwide since 2014, when the ADL's first survey found that 26% of adults were "deeply infected with anti-Semitic attitudes." The total number estimated to have anti-Semitic beliefs doubled from 1.1 billion to 2.2 billion adults.

In 2014, about half of respondents said they hadn't heard of the Holocaust versus 20% in the recent survey. A third of those in 2014 said they had both heard of the Holocaust and believed that historical accounts were accurate. That number has increased to 48%, though it dips to 39% for the 18-34 demographic.

The survey revealed that half of respondents ages 18 to 35 held heightened levels of anti-Semitic sentiments, which is 13% higher than for those over 50.

Territories and countries with the greatest anti-Semitism included the "West Bank," Gaza, Kuwait, and Indonesia, where at least 96% harbor high levels of anti-Jewish sentiment. The index score for the Middle East and North Africa as a whole was 76%.

Iran Executes 975 in 2024 — "Horrifying Escalation" of Capital Punishment

A joint report by Norway-based Iran Human Rights (IHR) and French group Together Against the Death Penalty claims that Iran


executed at least 975 people in 2024 — a "horrifying escalation" in the country's use of capital punishment. The figure is the highest



Executions in Iran have surged in recent years.


recorded since IHR began tracking executions in 2008. It represents a 17% increase from the 834 executions documented in 2023.

"These executions are part of the Islamic republic's war against its own people to maintain its grip on power," stated IHR director Mahmood Amiry-Moghaddam. He added that during the final three months of 2024, an average of five people were executed daily — a period coinciding with rising regional tensions amid escalating threats between Iran and Israel. Among the 975 executions, four were carried out as public hangings and 31 were women — the highest numbers in the past 17 years. Human rights organizations have long criticized Iran, the world's second most prolific executioner after China, for using capital punishment to instill fear and suppress dissent.









Ancient Israelite Palace Remains Found in Jordan

Archaeologists have uncovered intriguing evidence of what may be an ancient Israelite palace dating back approximately 2,800 years at a site in Jordan that scholars believe to be the Biblical Mahanaim. The discovery consists of decorated stone blocks featuring carved scenes of lions and banquets, found scattered across a hilltop near modern-day Dayr Allah.

Prof. Israel Finkelstein of Haifa University and Prof. Tallay Ornan of The Hebrew University of Jerusalem identified these artifacts as likely remnants from the Kingdom of Israel's administration in

the region. The researchers reached this conclusion by comparing the iconography on the blocks to similar drawings found at another Israelite site in Sinai

Rich Biblical History

Mahanaim, mentioned 13 times in the Old Testament, holds profound significance in Biblical narratives. The name, meaning "two camps" in Hebrew, first appears in Genesis 32:2. It was here that Jacob encountered Laban and established a covenant. Later, it was the site of the pivotal event when Jacob wrestled with an angel, leading to his name being changed to Israel (Gen. 32:28; Hos. 12:3-4).

The site's importance continued throughout Biblical history. When the Transjordan territory was divided among the tribes of Israel, Mahanaim was positioned at the intersection of Gad and East Manasseh (Josh. 13:26, 30). It was also designated as one of the Levitical cities (Josh. 21:38; 1 Chron. 6:80).

During the turbulent period of Israel's early monarchy, Mahanaim served as a crucial political center. After Saul's death, his military commander Abner established Ishbosheth, Saul's son, as king over Israel from Mahanaim (2 Sam. 2:8, 12, 29). Later, when King David fled from his son Absalom's rebellion, he sought refuge in Mahanaim (2 Sam. 17:24, 27), where he received support from a Gileadite named Barzillai (2 Sam. 19:32). The site's strategic importance continued into Solomon's reign, when it became one of his administrative centers (1 Kings 4:14).

The researchers emphasized that while the archaeological evidence confirms a strong Israelite administrative presence in the region, it does not necessarily validate the historicity of the Biblical narratives themselves. Rather, the findings help explain why the Biblical authors chose to set important foundational stories in this location.

Archaeological Discoveries

The site consists of two adjacent mounds situated along a bend in the Zarka River, which scholars have long identified as the Biblical Jabbok River. The western mound, known today as Tall adh-Dhahab al-Gharbi, yielded the most significant finds, including massive, decorated sandstone blocks weighing up to 440 pounds. These blocks were discovered during excavations conducted by German researchers between 2005 and 2011.

Based on the decorative style, the researchers date the remains to the first half of the eighth century B.C., coinciding with the peak of the Kingdom of Israel's power under the reigns of Kings Joash and Jeroboam II. During this period, the

Northern Kingdom of Israel, with its capital in Samaria, controlled territory stretching from Sinai to modern-day Lebanon, ingles cluding parts of Transjordan.

Recent excavations at Dhahab West have also revealed what appears to be part of a monumental building from the Herodian period.

Scholars believe that this structure may be part of the Hellenistic and Roman site known as Amathus, as described by

The site's significance even echoes in the poetic passages of the Old Testament.

Song of Solomon 6:13 makes a notable reference to "the dance of Mahanaim" (or "dance of the two camps" in some translations), suggesting the site's cultural importance extended beyond its political and administrative functions.

This archaeological find adds another piece to the complex puzzle of understanding the relationship between Biblical narratives and historical reality in the ancient Near East. While the exact nature of the building these blocks once formed remains under investigation, their discovery demonstrates the significant Israelite presence in Transjordan during the Iron Age, a period roughly corresponding to the First Temple Period in Biblical chronology.

CAIR Official: Hamas Deserves

Nobel Peace Prize

A senior official of Wirestock Creators the Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR) recently shared a post on social media that read in part, "Hamas deserves a Nobel Peace Prize."

Zahra Billoo is the executive director of CAIR's San Francisco chapter. She reposted writer and podcast host CJ Werleman, who wrote, "Hamas deserves a Nobel Peace Prize for keeping Israeli prisoners safe from indiscriminate Israeli carpet bombing, which destroyed +90% of all buildings and slaughtered

Notably, the post referred to the Israelis kidnapped by Hamas on October 7, 2023, as "prisoners" rather than "hostages" — using the terrorist group's preferred language — and promoted unsubstantiated estimates that are even greater than those published by Hamas.

Werleman is an anti-Israel activist and conspiracy theorist whose pinned post on X refers to Israel as "the pedophile state."

After the killing of Hamas leader Ismail Haniyeh in Iran last year, Billoo mourned his death: "Never say that those martyred in the cause of Allah are dead — in fact, they are alive! But you do not perceive it. Tonight, we mourn Ismail himself but know his martyrdom is not in vain. From the river to the sea. Palestine will be free."

This isn't CAIR's first brush with controversy. CAIR co-founder and national Executive Director Nihad Awad claimed that he was "happy" to witness Hamas's atrocities on October 7, 2023 —

murdering 1,200 people and kidnapping 251 hostages. "The people of Gaza only decided to break the siege - the walls of the concentration camp — on October 7,"

he asserted in a speech at

the American Muslims for Palestine convention in Chicago on November 24, 2023. "And yes, I was happy to see people breaking the siege and throwing down the shackles of their own land, and walk free into their land, which they were not allowed to walk in."

Additionally, in the 2000s, CAIR was named as an unindicted co-conspirator in the Holy Land Foundation terrorism financing case. Politico noted in 2010 that "U.S. District Court Judge Jorge Solis found that the government presented 'ample evidence to establish the association" of CAIR with Hamas. 🌣

Such idiocy has a precedent in that Yasser Arafat received a Nobel Peace Prize in 1994 for his supposed "efforts to create peace in the Middle East." — Mark












